

ORDINANCE NO. 388

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE
UPPER SAN JUAN LIBRARY DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the residents of the Town of Pagosa have inadequate library facilities and wish to improve them, and

WHEREAS, Colorado law provides for the establishment of a library district by the legislative bodies of two or more governmental units, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Pagosa Springs, Colorado desires to join with Archuleta County in the formation of a library district.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF PAGOSA SPRINGS, COLORADO;

SECTION I

That pursuant to C.R.S. 24-90-110 the Town Board of Pagosa Springs, Colorado does hereby authorize establishment of the UPPER SAN JUAN LIBRARY DISTRICT

SECTION II

Two members of the Town Board will be appointed to a committee as provided by C.R.S. 24-90-110, which committee shall appoint the Board of Trustees of the UPPER SAN JUAN LIBRARY DISTRICT.

SECTION III

Said district shall have the following boundaries:

All of Archuleta County except:

T35N, R6W, Sections, 1, 12, 13, 24, 25 and 36
and
T35N, R5W, Sections, 6, 7, 18, 19, 30 and 31

(Which is that portion of School District 10 Joint lying and being within Archuleta County).

SECTION IV

That the residents of said district shall not be taxed more than the legal mill levy limit set by statute of 1 1/2 mills.

SECTION V

That the Board of Trustees of the Upper San Juan Library

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District shall submit a budget to the Town of Pagosa, Colorado and to the Board of County Commissioners of Archuleta County each year for approval.

SECTION VI

That all shelving, books, material, equipment now presently existing in the Archuleta County Library shall be donated to the Upper San Juan Library District.

SECTION VII

An emergency situation existing with respect to the establishment of the above library district, it is hereby declared that this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption by the town board of trustees of the town of Pagosa Springs, Colorado.

RESOLUTION NO. 85-117

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE UPPER SAN JUAN LIBRARY DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the residents of Archuleta County, Colorado have inadequate library facilities and wish to improve them; and

WHEREAS, Colorado Law provides for the establishment of a library district by the legislative bodies of two or more governmental units; and

WHEREAS, Archuleta County desires to join with the Town of Pagosa Springs in forming the Upper San Juan Library District,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That, pursuant to 24-90-110, Colorado Revised Statutes, 1979, the Archuleta County Board of Commissioners authorizes establishment of the Upper San Juan Library District.

2. That two members of the Archuleta County Board of Commissioners be appointed to a committee as provided by 24-90-110, Colorado Revised Statutes, 1979, which committee shall appoint the Board of Trustees of the Upper San Juan Library District

3. Which District shall have these described boundaries:

All of Archuleta County except: T35N, R6W, Sections 1, 12, 13, 24, 25 and 36 and T35N., R5W, Sections 6, 7, 18, 19, 30 and 31 (which is that portion of School District 10 lying and being within Archuleta County).

4. That the residents of said District shall not be taxed more than the legal mill levy set by statutes of one and one half mills.

5. That the Board of Trustees of the Upper San Juan Library District shall submit a budget to the Archuleta County Commissioners and the Pagosa Springs Town Council each year for approval.

6. That all shelving, books, material and equipment, now presently existing in the Archuleta county Library, shall be donated to the Upper San Juan Library District.

The October 15, 1985 Archuleta County Board of County Commissioners meeting began at 7:30 with Budget Officer W. H. Diestelkamp presenting preliminary budget discussion with Commissioner V. A. Poma and Chris L. Chavez.

David Smith, Attorney for the Aspen Springs Metropolitan District along with nine Aspen Springs residents requested that the County re-consider signing the Intergovernmental Agreement which would allow the Aspen Springs Special Improvements District to begin financing. Al Rozman, financial consultant for the Special Improvements District respondents explained to the Board that the last 25% guarantee by Archuleta County has been removed from the agreement by securing an additional 20% from the Aspen Springs lot owners. This 20% is to be placed in escrow as security of completion of the road improvements program. Rozman stated that the County would not be obligated for any guarantee. Smith outlined which has been done this far by the Special Improvement District respondents and what remains to be done. The Commissioners agreed to accept a newly drafted proposal on October 18 for consideration at a special meeting October 28.

David Ebeling reviewed a letter from the Mined Land Reclamation Board regarding the Gilbert gravel crushing permit application and also a draft letter to the U. S. Forest Service regarding Environmental Impact Study for Wolf Creek Valley. Two items of concern listed by Ebeling on the EIS were: San Juan River water quality and solid waste disposal.

It was announced that the "Truth-In-Taxation" public hearing will be held Tuesday, October 29 at 7:30 p.m. at the Fair Building.
