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Introduction

Office institutional research (IR) will produce two reports (census and end of term) every semester (including Summer). The data for the report will be extracted Banner/Operation Data Warehouse (ODS) at different times.

- Census report: - the data freeze will be done 2 days after the census date (15 week census date for Spring and Fall and 8 week census date for Summer). The report will be generated 3 business days after the data freeze.
- End of term report: - the data freeze will be done 2 days after the end of the term. The report will be generated 3 business days after the data freeze.

Read the notes for each table to understand the context of the report and know the data extraction time.

Data items were selected based on the frequency of report requests from different constituents and some best practices. If you have additional data requests or questions please contact the IR office directly.

Full Time Equivalent (FTE)

Full-time Equivalent is a way to measure a student's academic enrollment activity. FTE is calculated as all countable credit hours divided by 30 credits. FTE of 1.0 means that the student is equivalent to full-time enrollment (30 credits completed in academic year). The FTE for high school students is the sum of up all countable credit hours of all high school students (concurrent enrollment, ASCENT and self-pay high school students) divided by 30 credits.
