Note: In October, 2017, the Southern Transportation Unit (STU) which accounted for 30 male beds at La Vista closed and became female bed capacity. In March, 2014, Male and Female vacancy percentages were added, with percentages backfilled until 7/2016. Starting in April, 2018, three columns that subtract RTP program beds from operational capacity have been added and figured into actual vacancy percentages.
