These figures change as offenders are removed from the backlog due to a court action such as an expungement order, stay order, set aside order, detainer, U.S. Marshal hold, future court date, awaiting sentencing on an additional case, completing misdemeanor sentence to a county jail, invalid mittimus, or an incorrect release from county jail. Conversely inmates are admitted retroactively via nunc pro tunc provisions. Therefore net admissions minus releases do not equal total inmate population change.

Fiscal year numbers do not finalize until September 30th of the following year.

Percentages represent the change from the previous FY. For the current FY, the percentage represents the projected change.
