
This publication is intended to provide an overview of statistical information and findings generated by the General Statistics, Reporting and Evaluation Unit.


Dissemination of this information to staff and other interested individuals will be facilitated through this periodical publication.

Recent trends on the number of admissions and releases for the adult prison system and the Youthful Offender System (Y.O.S.) are reported in this bulletin. Fiscal year 2001 figures are preliminary and reflect admission data, which differs slightly from sentencing data reported later in the annual statistical report.

⁽¹⁾ FY01 admission numbers are based on the date added to the backlog, which may differ from sentencing numbers, which reflect the date sentenced by the courts. FY00 admission numbers reflect sentencing data.

- **↑** Adult admissions increased slightly in fiscal year 2001 (1.7%).
 - ↑ New court commitments increased 6.6%.
 - \lor Parole returns decreased 7.0%.
- **↑** Adult releases from incarceration were 10.5% higher in 2001.
 - ↑ The number of discharging offenders increased 7.7%.
 - **↑** Offenders releasing on the mandatory release date to parole rose 16.6%
 - **↑** Discretionary releases to parole (prior to mandatory release date) increased 6.1%.
- **↓** Twenty-one fewer youthful offenders were admitted to Y.O.S. in 2001.
- \lor Y.O.S. released 6 fewer youthful offenders in 2001.

⁽²⁾ The number of technical parole returns is overstated and the number of returns with a new felony is understated for FY 2001 as the new felony conviction may be delayed. The admission type is changed to parole return-new felony when the conviction is received.

⁽³⁾ Other admissions include returns from a prior release to probation, court order discharge or appeal bond, interstate compact, and Y.O.S. terminations.

⁽⁴⁾ Other releases include releases to probation, court order discharge, appeal bond, and deceased.
