
>> Prison Admissions and Releases by Fiscal Year*

Recent trends on the number of admissions and releases for the adult prison system and the Youthful Offender System (Y.O.S.) are reported in this bulletin. Fiscal year 2003 figures are preliminary and reflect admission data, which differs slightly from sentencing data reported later in the annual statistical report.

⁽¹⁾ FY03 admission numbers are based on the date added to the backlog which may differ from sentencing numbers which reflect the date which numbers sentenced by the courts. FY02 admission numbers reflect sentencing data.

- Adult admissions remain stable at 7,806 increasing 0.1% in fiscal year 2003.
 - New court commitments increased 4.3%
 - Parole returns decreased 6.1%
- Adult releases increased 6.5% in 2003.
 - ➤ Parole releases increased 19.0%
 - Total discharges from incarceration decreased 22.3%
- ➤ Six fewer offenders were admitted to Y.O.S. in 2003 (9.2% decrease).
- Y.O.S. released eight fewer offenders in 2003 (9.9% decrease).

⁽²⁾ The number of technical parole returns is overstated and the number of returns with a new felony is understated for FY 2003 as the new felony conviction may be delayed. The admission type is changed to parole return-new felony when the conviction is received.

⁽³⁾ Other admissions include returns from a prior release to probation, court order discharge or appeal bond; interstate compact, and Y.O.S. terminations.

⁽⁴⁾ Offenders released to Community Supervision (H.B. 98-1160) would have discharged previously.

⁽⁵⁾ The Colorado Supreme Court decision on July 2001 resulted in the discharge of sex offenders who would have released to parole previously.

⁽⁶⁾ Other releases include releases to probation, court order discharge, appeal bond, and deceased.
