


### >> Prison Admissions and Releases by Fiscal Year\*

Recent trends on the number of admissions and releases for the adult prison system and the Youthful Offender System (Y.O.S.) are reported in this bulletin. Fiscal year 2004 figures are preliminary and reflect admission data, which differs slightly from sentencing data reported later in the annual statistical report.

- Adult admissions in fiscal year 2004 increased 5.0%.
  - New court commitments remained stable (1.1%).
  - ➤ Parole returns were 13.1% higher
- Adult releases increased 7.6% in 2004.
  - Parole releases increased 5.3%
  - ➤ Total discharges from incarceration were 21.7% higher
- Y.O.S. admissions increased by eight offenders (13.6%).
- Y.O.S. releases remained unchanged in 2004.

<sup>(2)</sup> The number of technical parole returns is overstated and the number of returns with a new felony is understated for FY 2004 as the new felony conviction may be delayed. The admission type is changed to parole return-new felony when the conviction is received.

<sup>(3)</sup> Other admissions include returns from a prior release to probation, court order discharge or appeal bond; interstate compact; and Y.O.S. terminations.

<sup>(4)</sup> Offenders revoked by the Parole Board reparole on a set date established by the Board, previously reported in discretionary parole.

<sup>(5)</sup> Offenders released to Community Supervision (H.B. 98-1160). Community Supervision was eliminated 07/01/2003.

<sup>(6)</sup> The Colorado Supreme Court decision on July 2001 resulted in the discharge of sex offenders who would have released to parole previously.

<sup>(7)</sup> Other releases include releases to probation, court order discharge, appeal bond, and deceased.
