



- Total FY 2010 Releases exceeded Admissions for the first time in over ten years.
 - Female releases exceeded female admissions for the third consecutive year.
 - ➤ Male admissions decreased 1.8% in FY 2010. Male releases exceeded admissions for the first time.
- ➤ This is the third year that new court commitments decreased. In FY 2010 both male and female new court commitments decreased.
- ➤ Both male and female parole releases increased.

^b Due to the decrease in community transportation services, the Department implemented a procedural change in December 2005 with regards to releasing inmates on weekends. As a result of this change, discretionary releases have increased and mandatory releases have decreased. December 2008 implementation of electronic coding enabled these releases to be correctly classified as discretionary or mandatory releases.

^c Offenders revoked by the Parole Board reparole on a set date established by the Board, previously reported in discretionary parole.

^d Released to parole, subject to earn time provisions of HB 09-1351.

^e Released to parole prior to mandatory release by parole board based on program eligibility criteria.

^f The Colorado Supreme Court decision on July 2001 resulted in the discharge of sex offenders who would have released to parole previously.

^g Other releases include releases to probation, court order discharge, appeal bond, dual ICC and deceased.

- Adult admissions in FY 2010 decreased 2.6% from 2009.
 - New court commitments decreased 9.7%.
 - Total parole returns increased 6.0%.
- Adult releases increased 2.1% in FY 2010.
 - ➤ Total parole releases increased by 3.3%.
 - ➤ Total discharges from incarceration were 2.5% lower.
- ➤ YOS admissions increased by 23 offenders (37.7% higher) due to HB 09-1122 which expanded the eligibility age.
- ➤ YOS releases decreased by 15 offenders (23.8% lower).
- Female compounded growth FY 2006 through FY 2010 Admissions decreased 2.0% while Releases increased 4.7%.
- ➤ Male compounded growth FY 2006 through FY 2010 Admissions increased 1.8% while Releases increased 5.5%.
