

THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS RECEIVES ADDITIONAL SUPPLEMENT OF \$344,684 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006

The Colorado Department of Corrections recently received notification that the department will be awarded an additional \$344,684 for the fiscal year 2006 SCAAP payment. The State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP) is a payment program designed to provide federal assistance to states and localities for the costs of incarcerating certain criminal aliens who are being held as a result of state and/or local charges or convictions. The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) distributes payments to many jurisdictions including city and county jails and state prisons. The additional amount being sent to the Colorado Department of Corrections will bring the total SCAAP payment for fiscal year 2006 to \$3,331,966.

*STATE SUPPLEMENTAL PAYMENT COMPARISONS *

BJA submitted a total of approximately \$39 million dollars in supplemental payments to all jurisdictions that were accepted by SCAAP for fiscal year 2006. The supplemental was based on the payment each jurisdiction received for that time period. The following table shows the original payment, the supplemental payment, and the total payment received for the top twelve states that received SCAAP payments for the fiscal year. Each jurisdiction received an 11.5% increase from the original SCAAP Payment.
