♦♦Accelerated Transition Pilot Program**♦**♦

The program is an innovative two year pilot based on evidence and research and follows recommendations from the nonpartisan Colorado Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice. Research indicates that re-entry services and support should be concentrated in the first weeks and months of parole; that discretionary parole can increase the rate of successful offender transition; and that extending supervision unnecessarily can be counterproductive. The program has two components: (1) the prison to parole transition; and (2) the early parole discharge.

Parolees placed in the prison to parole transition program receive increased treatment services, surveillance and monitoring, housing, transportation, employment services, and assistance with psychotropic medication. The program concentrates these services early in the parole term. The supervision strategies designed to ensure public safety include global positioning system (GPS) devices, paging and electronic monitoring, and increased drug and alcohol testing.

Offenders eligible for the transition from prison to parole are those who have passed their parole eligibility date and are within 180 days, or 6 months, of their mandatory parole or release date. Offenders who qualify will be reviewed by the parole board for discretionary parole. Offenders will be assessed for transition according to their overall criminal records, as well as their specific treatment needs. Those currently sentenced on a class 1 or 2 felony, a sex offense, or is a habitually violent offender are not eligible.

Parolees eligible for early discharge are those who have been under supervision for at least six months and must have completed a minimum of 50% of his or her current parole. The parolee must be compliant with all parole conditions to include: treatment issues, restitution payments, and must be substance abuse free. The parolee must be rule compliant for a minimum of six months.
