What is CSEAC?

The Colorado Special Education Advisory Committee (CSEAC) is a state level committee mandated by federal and state law. Members are interested in the education of children/youth with disabilities. We include parents of, and individuals with disabilities, educational service providers, administrators and representatives from a variety of related agencies. Participation is statewide and representative of diverse disabilities.

Purpose of CSEAC

- Provide input and assistance to the State Board of Education
- Advise the State Director of Special Education
- Advocate and promote communication, collaboration and partnership among educational service providers, children/youth, parents and administrators
- Serve as a liaison between parents of children with special needs, local educational agencies and the Colorado Department of Education (CDE)

All learners are respected and challenged with high expectations, their needs are met, and student aspirations for success are fulfilled.

Mission Statement of CSEAC

Our mission is to actively represent children/youth with disabilities and impact decisions made on their behalf to enhance the quality of educational services.

Reflections from Co-Chairs Greg Sullivan and Zoe Ann Holmes

The theme for the 2012-2013 CSEAC year was "Students First! Advocating for Improved Outcomes." It was chosen by members attending the CSEAC Annual Retreat with the focus on the CSEAC Mission and Vision, advocating on the behalf of students in need of special education supports and services, keeping hiah expectations, and placing the emphasis on students remaining first in all we do. The committee sought student input to identify barriers in their educational environment. CSEAC subcommittees worked diligently to keep abreast and give our voice on legislation topics; strengthen relationships between CSEAC, communities and other stakeholders; promote "People First" philosophy statewide; review our bylaws and procedures to keep them updated with Exceptional Children's Educational Act (ECEA); and continue to build membership.

- Distributed a notice of vacancies for the 2013-2014 CSEAC year, with the focus on recruiting representatives from Congressional Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 7 in order to improve statewide representation
- Interviewed 12 well qualified applications and made recommendations for appointment to the State Board of Education
- Recommended the appointment of 6 new representatives: 2 representing parents from Congressional Districts 2 and 6, 1 representing special education administrators from Congressional District 4, 2 representing administrators of programs for students with disabilities from Congressional Districts 4 and 6, and 1 representing child welfare services in the Department of Human Services from Congressional District 1
- Created membership directory that will be available at retreat
- Obtained committee members commitment for service and followed up on absentee members
