#### HIGH COST OUT-OF-DISTRICT AND IN-DISTRICT GRANTS

Section 22-20-114.5(5), C.R.S., as amended, requires the Special Education Fiscal Advisory Committee to submit an annual report to the House and Senate Education Committees that includes, at a minimum, a list of the administrative units that applied for and received a high cost grant during the preceding budget year. This report covers costs from 2007-08, paid in 2008-09.

Two million dollars was appropriated under the Exceptional Children's Educational Act to reimburse administrative units for students in high cost out-of-district placements or programs. This represents the first year that an additional two million dollars was appropriated to reimburse administrative units for high cost students being served within the administrative unit. For the 2008-09 fiscal year, the Fiscal Advisory Committee set the threshold for reimbursement at \$40,000 per student for high cost out-of-district placements and at \$25,000 per student for in-district high cost placements.

Using the same, uniform process as in the previous two years, the Committee reviewed applications from administrative units and determined which grant applications to approve and the amounts to be awarded after applicable revenues were deducted from the costs submitted for reimbursement. In making these decisions, the Committee determined the impact of each student claimed on the district's audited expenditures. What follows is a summary of the applications received:

#### 2007-2008

#### Grant Applications Submitted:

- 94 for out-of-district high cost students
- 415 for in-district high cost students

#### Number of Applications Funded:

- The \$2 million appropriated for out-of-district high cost students funded 33 (35%) of the 94 students
- The \$2 million appropriated for in-district high cost students funded 63 (15%) of the 415 students

#### Number of Administrative Units Receiving Funding:

- 23 administrative units submitted applications for out-of-district high cost students;
   14 administrative units received funding for all or some of the applications submitted.
- 26 administrative units submitted applications for in-district high cost students;
   15 administrative units received funding for all or some of the applications submitted.

#### Funding Need:

- The appropriation to fully fund the high cost out-of-district students, costing over \$40,000, would have been \$5,608,007.
- The appropriation to fully fund the high cost in-district students, costing over \$25,000, would have been \$11,206,350.

### 3-YEAR SUMMARY OF HIGH COST OUT-OF-DISTRICT ALLOCOCATIONS

Within the three years of funding high cost students, the number of applicants submitted doubled from year one to year three. With \$2 million appropriated each year and the number of applicants significantly increasing each year, the percentage of funded students declined, while the unfunded students increased.

The largest category of both funded and unfunded students by disability is Multiple Disability, followed by Autism. The applicants submitted have remained consistent by type of disability reported for high cost students.

#### IN-DISTRICT HIGH COST ALLOCATIONS

The largest number of applications submitted have been with students being served within the administrative unit. This is the first year that allocations have been available for this category. administrative units submitted 415 applications, with 63 high cost students being funded the first year.




