One-Third of Colorado's Three to Five Year Olds Not Enrolled in Early Childhood Education Programs

Odds Even Worse—Two Out of Five—for Hispanics

Highlights

- Almost 60,000 Colorado preschoolers (ages 3 to 5) were not enrolled in early childhood education programs in 1996.
- Among Colorado preschoolers ...
 - 2 out of 5 Hispanics,
 - 1 out of 3 Whites, and
 - 1 out of 4 African Americans were not enrolled in early childhood education programs in 1996.
- Other risk conditions for not starting school ready to learn include low parental educational attainment and poverty.



According to **The Condition of Education 1999**, alarmingly high percentages of three to five year olds do not participate in early childhood education programs such as Head Start, Even Start, nursery school, pre-kindergarten, or kindergarten before entering first grade. Children who are denied these experiences are not likely to start elementary school ready to learn.

rding to the U.S. Census au, there were over 167,000 Coloradans ages three to five in 1996. Figures are reported by year of age by race and ethnicity. Applying U.S. percentages for nonparticipation in early childhood education programs by racial/ethnic group to these Colorado population figures

yields an estimate of almost 58,000 children likely to start first grade not ready to learn.

While the Colorado preschooler population is not disaggregated for variables other than race and ethnicity, national data point to other conditions that discourage participation in early childhood education programs.

Parental Educational Attainment. In 1996, 73

percent of three year olds and 45 percent of four year olds in households where parents never completed high school themselves did not participate in early childhood education programs. That same year, only 38 percent of three year olds and 17 percent of four year olds in households where parents earned graduate degrees were nonparticipants.

■ Household Income. In 1996, 70 percent of three year olds and 41 percent of four year olds in households with annual incomes under \$10,000 did not participate in early childhood education programs. That same year, a relatively small 40 percent of three year olds and only 19 percent of four year olds in households with annual incomes over \$50,000 were non-participants.
