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K-1 Teachers Say At Least 2 Out of 5 Children Not Ready for School

According to Colorado's "first-ever" statewide survey of teachers regarding the readiness to learn of kindergartners and first graders,

- one-third of children are unprepared emotionally and socially for school and
- two out of five are unprepared to succeed in school academically.

Market Perceptions, Inc., a Denver-based market research firm, compiled and analyzed survey data for Educare Colorado and the Colorado Children's Campaign.







According to a February 21, 2002, article in the **Rocky Mountain News**, "numerous factors contribute to the lack of school readiness, including the fact that 25% of Colorado mothers lack a high school diploma."

A February 2001 report from the U.S. Census Bureau sheds some light as to how a lack of parental educational attainment affects the readiness to learn of children. Compared to children of college graduates, children whose parents never earned a high school or GED diploma were:

- ◆ ten times more likely <u>not</u> to be read to at least once a week (22.5% vs. 2.4%) and
- ◆ half as likely to be read to on at least a daily basis (30% v. 63.4%).
