My dear Governor Johnson :

Pursuant to the laws of Colorado, I take pleasure in submitting to you for your consideration my official report for the biennial period ending June 30, 1936.

The last two years have witnessed the emerging of our state from the distress of a national economic depression. Some increases in salaries have been noted; additional teachers have been employed, and there seems to be a growing sense of financial security in the education field.

The payment of delinquent taxes in many districts has stimulated activities which have tended to offset the effects of the neglect during the worst days of the depression.

There is evidence on all sides that Colorado needs to reconstruct her plan of financing education. In the main, the great burden of supporting education rests upon property and it is hoped that in the near future property will be partially relieved.

In spite of our return to a degree of prosperity, many of our districts have continued to bear losses in property valuations; therefore, I am of the opinion that it is only a question of time when Colorado must seek additional sources of income if she is to maintain a credible educational system. It seems to me that too long Colorado has neglected the matter of state support for elementary and secondary education. Other states in the union appropriate from 17% to 87% of the cost of public schools while Colorado contributes less than 4%. This small amount that is contributed by the state to the various school districts is now produced by the public school income fund.

A source of encouragement, however, is the test bill recently passed by the State Legislature and later sustained by the Colorado Supreme Court. This justifies the state's obligation in providing education for the children of the state wherever they reside within Colorado's borders.

The minimum salary law, which is theoretically an equalization plan, has given invaluable service in sustaining schools in those districts whose valuations are so low that school operation would be impossible were it not for this combined plan of county and state aid.

It is interesting to note that the assessed valuation of districts covers a wide range, and the range of valuations per pupil vary correspondingly. For example, in one district the assessed valuation per pupil is \$382.00 supported by a levy of 34.3 mills, while another district has a per pupil valuation of \$236,828.00 with a levy of only 5.5 mills.

Our records and observations show that often superior schools are maintained at a comparatively low cost to the individual property owners, while in other districts even with a high tax levy many of the schools cannot afford the activities of a modern enriched school program. This injustice to the taxpayer should be

corrected by the people of the state, speaking through the Legislature, at the earliest possible date. The State Department of Education immediately preceding the present biennial period has cooperated with the Federal Government by sponsoring many activities of an educational nature. These activities have been invaluable to the cause of education.

The governmental agencies, the Works Progress Administration and the Public Works Administration, have made many improvements and have constructed buildings in urban centers and rural sections. There also have been granted large sums of money to colleges and universities for the improvement and erection of campus buildings.

The State Department has sponsored the Adult Education Program for Colorado. The scope of the program is wide and the range of activities includes citizenship and Americanization classes, vocational, general, cultural, and academic subjects. The arts have not been neglected. Hundreds of men and women have been rehabilitated and have been led into a state of mind where they have a new lease on life as the result of the study and recreational activities. The recreational division under the sponsorship of this Department is rendering a service which will help considerably in decreasing crime and juvenile delinquency in the state.

The State Department of Education of Colorado, with the assistance of the Federal Government by means of W. P. A. workers, has been able to revive the activities of the state library, but there is still much to be done in building up this great educational agency. Surveys show that 53% of the people of Colorado are at this time without library service. Neglected books have been reconditioned; congressional records, local and state publications have been cleaned and placed on the shelves for the use of the public. Informational material is now available for use, and books for general reading have been sent out to all sections of the state. This Department regrets that on account of lack of funds, our people have not been able to enjoy the benefit of the great storehouse of knowledge in the State Library to which we think they are entitled. I urge early action by the State Legislature to provide funds and help, so that the people in the far corners of Colorado may have library service.

From the standpoint of a service to the schools, the greatest single accomplishment of this Department was the issuance of a state course of study for elementary schools. This course of study has done more than any other factor during the last two years to standardize and increase the efficiency of the schools. The state course of study is arranged so that it can be adjusted to both the urban and rural school systems. Its contents are consistent with modern ideals and a philosophy which sees the need of the preparation of young citizens for a changing civilization.

Also of very great importance is the issuance of a Safety Course of Study for the high schools of the State. The need of high school instruction in traffic safety is evident in view of the growing hazards on the streets and highways. It is interesting to note that the greatest increase in deaths from traffic accidents during the period 1922 to 1933 was among persons of high school age, 15 to 19 years, and among those of college age, 20 to 24.

The percent of increase in the former group was 130 and in the latter 157. The average increase for all ages was 81%. If the present trend of automobile accidents continues, during the lives of 100 youths 16 years old, 12 will be killed or seriously injured and 65 will sustain minor injuries.*

I take pleasure at this time in paying tribute to the splendid men and women who are serving in the schools of the state and who are rendering invaluable service to our commonwealth. The maintenance of a public educational program must of necessity be a cooperative endeavor. Its success is dependent upon the taxpayer, the legislator, the lay citizen, the teacher, and the educational statesman. Its progress demands study, research and an understanding of the state's economic and social needs.

The new day with its new leisure, its new opportunities for the development of a higher cultural life for our people is at hand. We must take advantage of these opportunities and combat the subtle forces that endanger our democratic form of government. Free and universal education is the means by which we can control dangerous influences and preserve our American system of government.

Colorado must not neglect her schools!

APPEALS—STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION**1934**

Certificate of W. E. Baker revoked on July 16, 1934, for a felony involving gross immorality.

The Biennium 1934-1936 has seen activity along five major lines.

1. Survey and studies:
 - a. Completion and publication of the State Wide Survey of Crippled Children.
 - b. The beginning of a study of educational needs of handicapped children.
2. Continuation of individual case service particularly for the handicapped child.
3. Publication of compiled laws affecting the welfare of children.
4. Distribution of literature affecting the welfare of children.
5. School and community activities through coordination with the development of the program of the Colorado Congress of Parents and Teachers.

The period covered in this biennium shows a continuation of the phase of readjustment of services affecting children as they are covered by state agencies.

In December, 1933, the crippled children's study was undertaken. This was continued through 1934 and part of 1935, with supplementary funds supplied through emergency relief appropriations. The report of the survey was printed in 1935, just prior to the passage of the Social Security Act, and was used as a basis in building the program under the new law. Efforts were made to widen this survey to include all groups of handicapped children, but means were not available. Although a thorough study of all groups could not be included, beginnings were made in several fields which gave the nucleus of the subsequent study of the educational needs of these children.

The winter of 1935-1936 saw a thorough scrutiny of all state public welfare and public health activities culminating in a gen-

eral welfare law which established a State Department of Public Welfare with a Child Welfare Department, also a division of Crippled Children in the State Division of Public Health. The transfer of these functions left the bureau free to consider further efforts in the field of special education as well as some strengthening of community and school activities. At the same time the bureau appropriated, to the State Department of Education, funds to make possible the publication of a "Course of Study in Traffic Safety."

The title of the bureau was changed by legislative enactment of the Extraordinary Session of the General Assembly in March, 1936, to "Bureau of Home and School Service." The text of the law remained the same. The Bureau thus retained the broad powers which had enabled it to pioneer in several major fields of child welfare.

REPORT OF THE FIELD SECRETARY IN SPECIAL EDUCATION

The survey to determine the numbers and the educational needs of exceptional children in the State began on February 1, 1936, in a group of four representative counties. On the 18th of May, the Field Secretary was called into the office in Denver to act in the capacity of Executive Secretary until such time as a regular Secretary could be appointed. Much of the time since has been spent in the actual instruction of private cases in and about Denver and in giving psychometric tests and speech instruction at Children's Hospital.

The total number of handicapped children examined numbered 346.

REPORT OF THE FIELD SECRETARY TO THE COLORADO BUREAU OF HOME AND SCHOOL SERVICE

July 1, 1934—June 30, 1936

Throughout the period covered by this report the work of the Field Secretary has been the organization of Congress units, instruction in carrying on this work, promoting and assisting in County and District conferences.

Forty-eight thousand, eight hundred and eight parents and teachers are enrolled in membership in this State Congress. Twenty-six counties are organized into Councils meeting once a month. County Councils consist of representatives from each organized association in schools of the county.

An average monthly attendance of 239,400 parents and teachers met throughout the state to participate in programs built upon these objectives. Subtopics reported: Eighty locals studied subjects pertaining to the home; 63 locals studied the school; 61 locals studied subjects pertaining to health; 82 provided library services; 129 studied safety; 141 studied and provided recreation and supervised playgrounds; 104 groups studied legislation per-

taining to child welfare; 58 promoted better films appreciation and 78 sponsored adult recreation and community entertainment; 118 locals reported classes in sewing, cooking, nutrition and serving well balanced hot lunches to undernourished children.

In addition to local units there are 383 organized groups definitely promoting Parent Education. Some of the topics studied: Community Interests Pertaining to Youth; Facing Our Mutual Responsibilities; Understanding the Adolescent; Home and Family Relationships; What the Modern Family Can Contribute to the Community; the Family's Part in Community Recreation; The Family and Community Health.

Tabulation of report blanks showing number of children entering school (Kindergarten or First Grade) in the fall of 1934 in districts where Summer Round-Up campaigns were carried on was 2,483, in 1935 there were 3,055. Number of children receiving Round-Up examinations in 1934 was 1493, number of defects corrected 3,252, number vaccinated 570, immunized 612. In 1935 Round-Up examinations were 1,724, defects corrected 2,187, number vaccinated 691, immunized 672.

Number of other children examined as a result of the Summer Round-Up Campaign for 1934 was 275 and for 1935, 422.

This campaign is a phase of Parent Education and the fact that 2,574 parents or guardians were present at these clinics, proves that parents are realizing the importance of health education.

The work of the Field Secretary during the years 1934-36 has been carried on in 26 organized and 18 unorganized counties. In organized counties she has assisted with schools of instruction, program policies, individual and group conferences. In unorganized counties she visited county and city superintendents and made contacts with schools explaining objectives of the organization.

A trip in July, 1934, through 17 counties enabled the secretary to make numerous contacts. In October of the same year she attended the Colorado Education Association meeting in Durango, accompanying the National Parent Education specialist, Miss Alice Sowers, both appearing on the program. Contacts were made enroute, sometimes groups numbering from 150 to 300 seeking first hand information of Child Welfare and Parent Education as carried on by the Parent-Teacher organization. Similar trips were taken through the central and southern parts of the state during the following months.

Again in November, 1935, the Field Secretary was placed on the program of the three sectional meetings of the Colorado Education Association, also holding conferences with groups interested in organizing. During this time arrangements were promoted for the third Biennial Convention of the State Congress on the Western Slope, which was held in the spring of 1936, with the largest attendance of any state convention of the Congress.

This program of the Congress of Parents and Teachers is recognized by all progressive educators and leaders as the most significant educational movement in the world today.

STUDY OF CRIPPLED CHILDREN IN COLORADO

Actual cases reported in the Crippled Children's Survey totaled 2,661. Since a few counties could not be worked as thoroughly as desired because of lack of travel funds, it was estimated that this number should be increased to at least 3,000. Medical reports were obtainable on only 1,651 of the 2,661 cases.

Of the total number 591 or 40% were recommended for further treatment or hospitalization.

On the basis of final reports, Colorado was found to have 2.57 crippled children per thousand. About 55% were boys and 45% girls.

School records were secured on 800 children. Of these 23.8% were in the normal grade, 32.8% were retarded one year, and 43.4% of the children were retarded more than a year. This means that more than 76% of crippled children are retarded as against a normal rate of about 30%. Details of these and other facts are given in the report, "A Study of the Number and Needs of Crippled Children in the State of Colorado."

LITERATURE DISTRIBUTED

During the biennium there were distributed 16,552 pieces of literature, which included various phases of child care and management for different ages, and the summary of the study on Crippled Children in Colorado.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSING DEMONSTRATIONS**June 1, 1934 to July 1, 1936**

The Colorado Tuberculosis Association, through Christmas Seal Sale funds, has attempted to serve the children in rural areas who have no other opportunity for nurses' inspections. The counties selected are those in which the county superintendent of schools and local groups have requested the service. The amount of time given to the inspection has varied in accordance with the program outlined by the nurse and the county superintendent of schools. The service has attempted to point out to parents and teachers, the obvious physical defects of children, the need of healthful environment in schools, the presentation of health education materials to the teachers, and a limited amount of health instruction to the children.

The county superintendents of schools accepted the responsibility for arranging the nurse's schedule, the transportation, and the notification to teachers (who in turn notified the parents) of the dates when the nurse would work in the various schools. An average of eight hundred parents took advantage of the opportunity to discuss health problems of their children with the nurses. The report of the inspection was sent to the parents of each child inspected. An appraisal of the sanitary condition of the school building was prepared for the school boards. Many of the school boards carried out the recommendations by providing hand washing facilities, by rearranging windows for better lighting, and by providing improved toilets.

Two dental education programs were developed in Walsenburg and Delta city schools. The county dental societies cooperated by examining the children's teeth. Teaching material on nutrition was supplied to the class room teachers, conferences were held by the nurse with teachers and parent groups, moving pictures were shown, and talks were given in the class rooms.

Tuberculosis is still the greatest cause of death between the ages of fourteen to twenty-four. The method of detecting a tuberculosis infection is through the use of tuberculin; the method of finding whether or not the person has the disease of tuberculosis, is through the X-ray.

Recommendations:

1. That school nursing services be further developed in rural areas in Colorado, either under auspices of the State Board of Health or by school boards and county commissioners.

2. Awaken the community consciousness for better health facilities for children, through the presentation of their needs to Parent-Teacher Associations, women's clubs, and other groups.

3. Improve the environment of the school so that there may be constant opportunity to teach health through an ideal environment.

4. Encourage the teachers to use the health inspection records of the children so that recognition may be given to physical handicaps, and their correction urged.

5. Promote protective health measures such as immunization against diphtheria and small-pox.

6. Encourage the tuberculin testing of school children in order to find the early cases.

7. Promote the sale of Tuberculosis Christmas Seals which provide the funds for many health services in the state.

BIENNIAL REPORT OF THE STATE LIBRARY

Submitted by Anne Marie Strasser, Executive Secretary

The prevailing purpose in library work today is that of providing as good library service to the citizens in the rural districts as that given to the citizens in the urban areas. The Colorado Statutes charge the State Library with duties that could bring about a more equal distribution of library service, and no doubt when the appropriating bodies realize the significance of such a service, all the duties prescribed by law will be put in force. In order to report the activities during the biennial period, July 1, 1934, to June 30, 1936, I shall state briefly the duties prescribed by law, then describe those activities carried on during the present biennial, and then outline the recommendation for developing statewide library service.

The major duties charged to the State Library on the Colorado Statutes are:

1. To keep in operation free traveling libraries for the State of Colorado.
2. To give assistance, advice, and counsel to all free libraries in the State.
3. To send its employees to aid in organizing new libraries or in improving those already established.
4. To give State publications to public libraries.
5. To exchange statutes and documents with other legislative bodies and libraries.

From July 1, 1934, to June 30, 1936, the Extension Division of the State Library has had greater demands made upon it than in previous years. It has been able to give more adequate and varied service than heretofore because of a small increase in appropriations which has been supplemented by Federal funds.

The annual appropriation for this biennial period was \$5,000 and was distributed in this way: Salaries—\$3,200; office expense—\$300; transportation—\$300; and books and periodicals—\$1,200.

During this biennial period 39,233 books were sent in 1,062 selections to 56 counties. These books were sent to elementary and high schools, small public libraries, clubs, study groups, and individuals. These selections partially filled the requests for supplementary reading in rural districts. Every request was filled as completely as the supply of books on hand permitted, but even with the larger number of books purchased we usually had twenty-five requests on our waiting list because there is not a sufficient quantity of the types of books requested.

There has been a noticeable increase in the number of requests from one and two-room schools for small selections. The demand from larger and consolidated schools has increased proportionately.

The library is looked upon as a friend by many children and adults in Colorado as the following extracts from letters testify:

“We look forward to each new selection, and wish we could change oftener!” (Community librarian)

“I appreciate the material you sent me to assist me in my speech. . . . It was kind of you to assemble this

material and the books and to search out the interesting statements. . . . ” (Colorado senator)

“We value this extension service and find that it is a source of literary inspiration to our pupils.” (Superintendent of schools)

“When I tell the neighbor children that you will try and get the book they want to read, they feel you are a sort of year-round Santa Claus.” (Minister’s wife)

Annotated buying lists for elementary and high schools have been compiled and distributed widely. The titles included on these lists are recommended in standard book-buying aids for schools and public libraries. These lists are kept up-to-date by supplements issued at intervals. A similar list is being compiled for adult readers.

Bibliographies on special subjects were prepared upon request. Numerous appeals for material for holiday programs were met with books and suggestive materials.

The Executive Secretary and Assistant Librarian were invited to give talks and reports on the various activities of the library. These invitations came from parent-teacher groups, schools, clubs, and other organizations such as the Legislative Council of the Colorado Federation of Women’s Clubs and the Colorado Education Association. At these numerous group meetings new books, mounted pictures, representative book selections, and other valuable classroom aids which could be obtained from the State Library were exhibited. The largest of these exhibits was displayed at the Eighth Annual State Fine Arts Festival.

There are many organizations and individuals interested in this library. Some of the women’s clubs gave library trunks in honor of their retiring presidents and of other members. Book gifts during this biennium were:

The State Library has taken an active part in both State and National library organizations. The Executive Secretary was appointed by the Governor as a Colorado delegate to the American Library Association annual conference at Richmond, Virginia, May 9-16, 1936.

The Executive Secretary has served as secretary to the Colorado Library Planning Committee for the past two years. This Committee composed of men and women interested in civic and social endeavors was appointed by the State Librarian and the President of the Colorado Library Association for the purpose of studying the needs and formulating plans for equalizing library service in the State. In the light of unequaled conditions existing in library service in Colorado, the Committee endorsed the ideal of the American Library Association that free library service should be provided for every adult and for every child of school age. Since the Committee activities center around the Colorado State Library, its recommendations are stated as follows:

1. Adequate financial support to the State Library for the purpose of increasing its book collection and staff.
2. Establishment and improvement of county and regional libraries.
3. Adequate library service in state penal, corrective, medical, and charitable institutions.
4. Library training agencies and certification of librarians.

With the assistance of FERA and WPA projects, the Federal, interstate, and State documents have been put into order. These documents are now ready to be made available to the public.

In preparing the nineteen departments of the Federal government for use, all documents have been sorted, classified and shelved according to Library of Congress methods, and checked against the U. S. Depository invoices. Approximately 21,300 skeleton cards were typed and the library holdings filled in.

The documents of other states have been sorted and arranged on the shelves in alphabetical order by states. Cataloging of these documents has been started.

The Colorado State documents have been sorted and arranged on the shelves in alphabetical order by departments. More than 1,600 documents which were missing have been added to this collection. A checklist of all Colorado documents from 1910 to 1936 is being compiled. This checklist is approximately seventy-five

percent complete. There will be approximately 7,200 listings in this checklist when it is completed. The last checklist of these documents was compiled and published in 1910.

The 6,000 books of the State Library were re-cataloged and made into a reference collection. These books have been mended, marked, shelved, and are now available to the public.

Over 15,000 books have been handled by the book-mending department. These books have been either cleaned, mended, re-marked, recased, varnished, or sanded, and in many cases the books have been completely rebound.

In addition to this work outlined in the Federal project, other valuable work has been accomplished. Four thousand pictures salvaged from magazines and worn-out books have been mounted on regulation library mounts. These pictures have been classified according to Sears **Subject Headings**. This picture collection is a library service that directly supplements the new **Colorado Course of Study for Elementary Schools, 1936**.

Illustrated poems have been made and sorted into sets for each of the elementary school grades. These mimeographed sets afford a library service to teachers and are correlated with the outline for literature in the Colorado Course of Study.

The work accomplished in one of the vaults in the sub-basement of the State Capitol was a real achievement. Colorado documents were sorted by departments; single copies of every publication transferred to the Colorado State document collection; all duplicates were tied together and stored in the vault. A large collection of Colorado educational documents were sorted and arranged according to classification order. Documents of other states were separated from Colorado and Federal documents and stored preparatory to sorting and classifying. Federal documents were sorted by departments and arranged on shelves by departments. Federal duplicates were segregated, and lists of these duplicates were typed and submitted to the State institutions of higher learning as a checklist for filling in their collections. An extensive Federal patent collection was sorted and arranged by classification number on shelves. Approximately 252 feet of shelves were built from new lumber, 93 feet of shelves from salvaged materials, and all sections reinforced.

With this splendid Federal assistance, we are confident that the Library Extension Division has been effectively assisted in fulfilling the purpose for which it was founded in providing assistance to rural schools and communities.

For the first time a chapter on "Simple Organization for an Elementary School Library" was included in the new **State Course of Study for Elementary Grades**.

There is already increasing demand for library service in rural districts coming from the following:

1. Public schools.
2. Small public libraries.
3. Organizations: Women's clubs, P. T. A., American Legion, CCC and transient camps.
4. Individuals.
5. State institutions.

Because of this increased demand traveling expenses for a field worker are urgently needed. We must have a worker in the field to help the local libraries already established, to help organizations and individuals establish libraries, and to help schools with their book selections. When the work being done by the WPA project is completed, the holdings of the documents and reference sections will be available to the State officials as well as to the citizens. There must be someone on the library staff to make the documents available to the

1. Legislature.
2. State officials.
3. Citizens.

We must have a full-time cataloger to take care of the books and documents so that each volume can be found classified by author, title, or subject. Books and periodicals must be kept in good repair; therefore, we must have adequate help to keep the collection in order. The increased correspondence necessitates the services of a stenographer so that the library can take care of its correspondence promptly.

The library has been able to give much worthwhile service considering the limited library facilities; but we must have more books, more persons to adequately meet the growing demands upon the library.

FEDERAL EMERGENCY AIDS

Financial Aid Given to the Public Schools and State Colleges and Universities of Colorado by Federal Agencies 1933-1936

During the last four years the federal government has given aid to the public schools of Colorado through work relief projects and grants.

The summary below shows the amount of aid given for the improvement of the capital assets of schools from the inception of the various agencies to the discontinuation of the agencies or to June 30, 1936, if the agencies were still in operation:

In the above table, projects 765, 766 and 767, make provision for training prospective teachers on the program. For this reason persons listed as being employed or trained on these projects are for the most part represented a second time in the totals for projects 735, 736 and 737. That is, after having been trained, they are assigned to the regular additional education projects and counted in the number employed there.

Since the beginning of these Federal Agencies to provide aid for the unemployed, these agencies have spent \$5,624,688.85 to improve the capital assets of the school districts and \$753,347.18 to aid in educational advantages to the citizens of the state. In all, these agencies have spent \$6,378,036.03 in the state of Colorado for educational purposes.
