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Colorado is implementing significant education improvements aimed at ensuring all students graduate college- and career-ready. While much research and discussion has gone into the policy development, we're now putting those policies into action. Educator Effectiveness

Overview:

Classroom teaching and school leadership are the strongest school-based factors impacting student achievement. CDE supports the state's 178 school districts to attract, prepare and support great educators as a part of meeting the requirements of S.B.10-191, the Great Teachers and Leaders Act.

What's Happening Now:

Action May Be Required Before Calculating Final Educator Effectiveness Scores

S.B. 14-165's Impact on Educator Evaluation Requirements for the 2014-15 School Year

As we look toward completing educator evaluation final ratings, remember additional flexibility was passed by the legislature for this school year regarding the 50 percent multiple measures of student learning (for teachers and principals) or student outcomes (for specialized service professionals). District flexibility comes in the final step of the evaluation process when determining how much weight the measures of student learning/outcomes standard count in the educator's final evaluation rating. Specialized Service Professionals Pilot Reports

The new evaluations for specialized service professionals (SSPs) took effect in the 2014-15 school year, one year after the teacher and principal evaluations were implemented. By providing a new statewide model of evaluation for all licensed educators, SSPs are able to receive consistent, timely and actionable feedback to improve their professional practice. As a reminder, this first year for SSPs is a hold harmless year meaning that a final rating of partially effective or ineffective will not count toward the loss of non-probationary status.

Recently, reports on the SSP pilot were released and provide insight on the implementation of the Colorado State Model Evaluation System and initial evaluation scores reported by SSPs (http://www.cde.state.co.us/educatoreffectiveness/smes-pilot).

Sign-up to Use the Colorado State Model Performance Management System

In the past year, CDE, in partnership with RANDA Solutions, Inc., has moved very quickly with the development of the Colorado State Model Performance Management System. If your district/BOCES isn't using the system, but is interested in using it for the 2015-16 school year, fill out the short survey at https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/COPMS_Intentions. If your district would like to begin using the system for an August/September rollout, the deadline to complete the survey is **April 24**. For a September/October rollout, the deadline is **May 25**. If your district/BOCES/charter school is already using the system, you do not need to fill out the survey. Please remember that the Excel system for managing the evaluation process will not be supported by CDE in the 2015-16 school year.

Standards

Overview:

The 2014-15 school year provides an opportunity for educators across the state to refocus on the opportunity high quality standards provides for Colorado's children. Student learning is at the heart of Colorado's education reform initiatives. The Teaching and Learning Unit offers schools and districts resources and supports to enhance student learning and achievement.

What's Happening Now:

Coming Soon: Instruction Units Based on Physical Education Standards

Thirteen full instructional units based on the Colorado Academic Standards in Physical Education will be posted on April 30 to the Standards and Instructional Support website. These units, authored by teams of educators representing 13 Colorado school districts, include learning experiences, teacher and student resources, assessment ideas, and differentiation options. One full instructional unit, based on a select unit overview sample, has been created for each grade by the teacher-author teams. The READ Act Rules Set to be Revised

English Learners and the READ Act: At the February State Board of Education meeting the department noticed the rulemaking process to revise the READ Act rules. The rulemaking process is in response to a recent opinion by the Attorney General's Office to allow for the use of Spanish assessments in the determination of a significant reading deficiency for students who receive literacy instruction in Spanish and English. The rulemaking hearing is scheduled for April 8 at 2 p.m. in the State Board of Education Room. Written comments may be submitted up to the hearing date, although early submittal is encouraged. What's Happening Now:

CMAS and CoAlt: Science and Social Studies Window Opens April 13

The Colorado-developed CMAS and CoAlt: Science and Social Studies assessment window is open from **April 13 to May 1**. Social studies assessments will be taken by students in 4th and 7th grades; science assessments will be taken by 5th and 8th grade students. CMAS: English Language Arts and Mathematics End of Year Window Opens April 27

The PARCC-developed English language arts and math assessments consist of two components: the Performance Based Assessment Component (PBA) and the End of Year component (EOY). Districts have completed the PBA component, and the official EOY window is open from **April 27 to May 22**. As a reminder, districts should use the same **Test Administration and Test Coordinator Manuals for the PBA and EOY** components. Steps to Protect CMAS Test Security

Protecting the security of test items is important to creating a fair and reliable testing experience for all students. When a student posts a photo of a test item, it is a test security breach and has the potential to cause an invalidation. As described in the Test Coordinator Manual, all cell phones are prohibited from the testing environment (including camera phones and smartphones), including after students have completed testing and during breaks. Test Administrators should ensure that students are not in the possession of cell phones and any other prohibited materials during testing. If a student is found to be in possession of a cell phone or any other prohibited material, the student should be dismissed from the testing environment and the test may be invalidated.

CoAlt Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM): English Language Arts and Math

Some districts have already begun administering the DLM-developed English language arts and mathematics assessments to students with the most significant cognitive disabilities. The CoAlt DLM assessments are administered to students in grades 3 through 11. The recommended window opens on **April 13** and closes on **May 15**. Colorado ACT

Students in grade 11 will take the Colorado ACT on **April 28**. Students who miss the official test day may take the make-up test on **May 12**.

What's on the Horizon:

CMAS: Science and Social Studies High School Reports Delayed

The State Board of Education did not approve the high school science and social studies cut scores recommended by educators during the March board meeting. Therefore, the release of results to districts and students will be delayed until the board takes additional action.

CMAS Data Clean-Up

This summer, districts will have opportunities to participate in Student Biographical Data (SBD) cleanup processes for assessments in English language arts, math, science and social studies. Specific information about SBD windows will be distributed to District Assessment Coordinators and data respondents.

Accountability, Performance & Support

Overview:

CDE supports schools and districts in the continuous improvement process through its focus on implementing quality school and district support systems, accountability measures, improvement plans, federal programs and data analysis.

What's Happening Now:

Accountability Work Group Agrees on Goals for 2016 Performance Frameworks

The Accountability Work Group – consisting of regional superintendent representatives, school and district leadership and CASE, CASB, and CEA leadership – reached agreement on the goals of the 2.0 system during its third meeting on March 16. The group is tasked with making recommendations to CDE on how to enhance School and District Performance Frameworks for 2016. At the meeting, the group:

- Reached general agreement on the goals of the 2.0 system; language is being finalized.
- Met in small work groups around the following topics: growth/improvement, equity/disaggregation, communication and purpose, design, post-secondary and workforce readiness, and accountability pilot. These smaller work groups will dig into their specific topics over the next few months in preparation for making recommendations.
- Acknowledged the current assessment context in Colorado and discussed how that may impact accountability.
- Reviewed the timeline for recommendations for the SPF/DPF 2.0 this summer.

What's on the Horizon:

CDE and CEI host Demo Day on Student Learning Platforms

CDE and the Colorado Education Initiative will host a Student Learning Platform Demo Day on April 23 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at History Colorado in Denver. The event will provide an opportunity for local district leaders and vendors to demonstrate software options for tracking student progress and providing online access to content and assessments that are available to Colorado schools and districts. In the afternoon participants will discuss the utility, strengths and weaknesses of current student learning platform solutions, and how they might implement software to help personalize learning for students.

Districts will share their experiences using these tools, and discuss using them in different situations and for different student needs. The 11th Grade Alternate Assessment for Colorado ACT testing window is this month. The READ collection opens in April. Both Access for ELLs SBD and Report Card March collections have finalization dates in early April.

What's Happening Now:

11th Grade Alternate Assessment for Colorado ACT

The testing window for the 11th Grade Alternate Assessment for Colorado ACT is **April 1 to 24.** Between **April 28 and May 8**, District Assessment Coordinators enter and verify the student scores for accuracy. Finally, the LEAAPPROVER is responsible to submit the snapshot collection to CDE by **5 p.m. on May 8**. All districts, including those which did not test any students this year, will make a submission to CDE. A webinar for LEAAPPROVERS is offered at **8 a.m. on April 21**.
