Educator Effectiveness

Overview:

Classroom teaching and school leadership are the strongest school-based factors impacting student achievement. CDE supports the state's 178 school districts to attract, prepare and support great educators as a part of meeting the requirements of S.B.10-191, the Great Teachers and Leaders Act.

What's Happening Now:

Annual Assurances Due July 1 for Written Evaluation Systems

All districts must provide CDE with an assurance that each district/BOCES is implementing the Colorado State Model Evaluation System or another evaluation system aligned with S.B. 10-191 and state board rules by July 1, 2015.

What's on the Horizon:

Performance Management System Summer Downtime and Annual Updates

Trainings for districts currently using RANDA are being planned for late summer/fall. Additional information will be included in the next update. The educator effectiveness team will determine the geographic locations based on district/BOCES need and staff capacity.

To make the necessary updates to the Colorado State Model Performance Management System (COPMS or RANDA) for the new academic year, a **system downtime is planned from June 26 – July 19, 2015. If you have staff changes for the new year, all updates should wait until June 26**. This includes changing buildings, positions and adding or removing users to the system for 2015-16. If you make these changes prior to June 26, it may impact the reports as well as assign unintended rubrics/evaluations. Detailed instructions have been sent to districts and BOCES through the system. As districts/BOCES/charter schools prepare for the new year, please request Educator Identifications (EDIDs) for new employees as soon as possible to expedite the process of receiving EDIDs due to the heavy volume of requests during the fall. READ Collection and Verification Timeline Revised

To expedite the notification and distribution process for READ Act funds for the 2015 school year, CDE has revised the READ collection and verification timeline. Districts must submit READ files by June 16. CDE will work with districts between June 16 and July 1 to resolve any duplications, and final files must be resubmitted by July 1. CDE will inform districts of funding levels by the end of July, one month earlier than in past years. Total state allocation for READ Act funds will remain the same for the 2015-16 school year. The per-pupil funds are based on the number of students identified with a significant reading deficiency within the READ collection. State Board Approves Changes to READ Act Rules

At the May State Board of Education meeting, the board voted to accept proposed changes, as amended, to the READ Act rules related to students who receive their literacy instruction in Spanish and English. The rulemaking process was conducted in response to a recent opinion, http://www.cde.state.co.us/coloradoliteracy/attorneygeneralsopinion, by the Attorney General's Office to allow for the use of Spanish assessments in the determination of a significant reading deficiency for students who receive literacy instruction in Spanish and English. Assessments

Overview:

Assessments administered by the unit include summative content assessments, English language proficiency assessments, college/career ready assessments and alternate content assessments for students with significant cognitive disabilities.

The Colorado Measures of Academic Success are the new state tests in English language arts, math, science and social studies that were given to Colorado students in the 2014-15 academic year. The science and social studies tests were developed just for Colorado students, while the math and English language arts tests were developed in collaboration with other states through the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for Colleges and Careers (PARCC).

What's Happening Now:

Updates due in PearsonAccess^{next}

Final updates in PearsonAccess^{next} must be made by July 8. Rejected Student Test alerts appear in PearsonAccess^{next} if a student's information from the paper book does not match the student's information in PearsonAccess^{next}. Rejected Student Test alerts for the End of Year (EOY) records must be resolved in PearsonAccess^{next} because records that have not been resolved **will not be scored**.

PARCC Announces Next Year's Tests Will Be Shorter

The PARCC Governing Board, made up of the state education commissioners and superintendents, voted recently to reduce total test time for the English language arts and math tests by about 90 minutes for each grade beginning in the 2015-16 school year. The board also agreed to consolidate the two testing components – Performance-Based (PBA) and End-of-Year (EOY) – into one window near the end of the school year. The new state testing schedule is being developed, and details about next year's testing windows will be distributed to district assessment coordinators (DACs).

Educators Can Influence State Test Development: Learn How

CDE welcomes educator involvement in assessment development through participation in a variety of meetings held throughout the development cycle. CDE would like to have educators from across the state represented at several upcoming educator meetings. Participants are reimbursed for travel

This summer, districts will have opportunities to participate in Student Biographical Data (SBD) cleanup processes for many state assessments. Specific information about SBD windows will be distributed to district assessment coordinators and data respondents. SBD data collections are not mandatory. The following SBD collections are scheduled to be held during the summer months:

- Colorado ACT
- PARCC English language arts and mathematics
- The Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) English language arts and mathematics

Colorado Spanish Language Arts (CSLA) Educator Meetings

Accountability, Performance & Support

Overview:

CDE supports schools and districts in the continuous improvement process through its focus on implementing quality school and district support systems, accountability measures, improvement plans, federal programs and data analysis.

What's Happening Now:

Safe Schools Checklist for Accreditation is Coming Up

The annual safe schools checklist for accreditation is due by June 5. The assurance checklist has been distributed to district superintendents and BOCES directors, (if the BOCES operates a school), via their respective field services manager. Accountability Work Group Discusses Future Options

The Accountability Work Group held its sixth meeting on May 18 and spent time learning about CDE, recent legislation and Colorado's ESEA waiver. The group confirmed a purpose statement for school and district accountability in Colorado. Small work groups shared initial recommendations with the larger work group. And finally, small groups met to continue researching and discussing various recommendations in the areas of growth/improvement; equity/disaggregation; communication and purpose; design, post-secondary and workforce readiness; and accountability pilot.

Accountability Impacts of New Legislation

HB15-1323 included adjustments for Colorado's school and district accountability system for the 2015-16 school year. Specifically, the bill states that 2015 district accreditation ratings and school plan types (based on data from the 2014-15 school year), would not be calculated or assigned. Schools and districts will continue to implement their official 2014 rating in the 2015-16 school year. Additionally, the accountability clock will not move forward on July 1, 2016. When district accreditation ratings and school plan types are again assigned in fall 2016, the accountability clock will continue to advance on July 1, 2017, as a consecutive year.

Schools and districts will continue with the Unified Improvement Planning (UIP) process during the 2015-16 school year. However, some modifications will need to be made in the planning process because of the state assessment transition. More guidance and training will be made available this summer. Schools and districts with a 2014 priority improvement or turnaround plan type must still meet the Jan. 15, 2016 deadline for CDE review. The April 15, 2016 deadline will still stand for all schools and districts for public posting. Note that the biennial submission for schools and districts in rural areas that have a performance plan type or higher will still be available during the transition.

Overview:

CDE supports the various ways students can enter postsecondary education by working with districts and schools in thinking through the personalization of a pathway through high school and on to college and career for every student.

What's on the Horizon:

Revised Menu of State Graduation Guidelines Rejected

In May 2013, the state board adopted graduation guidelines and directed the department to gather further feedback from educators and community members. Based on the feedback, the department proposed revised guidelines. During its May 2015 meeting, the board voted against the proposed revisions to the guidelines. This means that the 2013 adopted graduation guidelines remain in effect for local school districts as they set their graduation policies.

Online School and Program Pupil Enrollment Count

Online programs are required to adopt policies beginning in the 2015-16 school year for tracking student enrollment, attendance and participation. To support student learning, programs may also document students' attendance and participation in educational activities. Acceptable forms of documentation can include things like assessment, orientation and induction activities, in-person educational instruction; and synchronous and asynchronous internet-based educational activities. A copy of the new board-approved policies, along with an assurance form signed and dated by the chief financial officer and superintendent, must be submitted by authorizers to

New Program Offers Students the Opportunity to Experience College Life

Just passed in the 2015 legislative session, the Colorado Student Leaders Institute, an affiliate of the National Conference of Governor's Schools, provides 9th and 10th grade students an opportunity to live on a college campus July 6 -31. Students will earn three hours of college credit, explore one of two majors (International Studies or STEAM), complete a Colorado Capstone Project through National History Day, and work in cross discipline teams to solve real time problems in Colorado. On the weekends they camp, rock climb, attend cultural events, and volunteer.

Students do not have to pay tuition. The program strives for a socioeconomically diverse population and works to make sure 50 percent of the population is eligible for free and reduced lunch or the first generation in their family to attend college. There are spots for 75 kids this year, and the application deadline has been extended to June 10. Organizational Effectiveness

This month's Organizational Effectiveness update focuses on Data Pipeline.

Overview:

The CO ACT SBD, Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) SBD will open this month. CO ACT SBD, School Discipline and Attendance collections and Directory School code change requests have due dates in June. READ and Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) SBD are due in early July. Look for an announcement soon regarding CMAS: PARCC English Arts and Math SBD open and close dates.

What's Happening Now:

CO ACT SBD – The Colorado ACT Student Biographical Data collection will be open between, June 17 and June 26.

School Discipline and Attendance – This new Data Pipeline collection will close June 26. The data is much the same as in the previous ADE, however, it is provided in a different format.

Directory – School district calendars reporting will be open from June 1 to July 15. Also, 2015-16 school code change requests will be accepted until Tuesday, June 30.

READ – The Reading to Ensure Academic Development collection will be open until July 1.

Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) SBD – This Student Biographical Data collection will be open between June 26 and July 6.

Special Education Discipline – Districts should continue to collaborate with administrative units on providing the needed discipline data. This snapshot will be open until Aug. 26. Aug. 18 is the date by which AUs must have generated their complete Special Education Discipline Snapshot dataset by passing all interchange and snapshot validations in preparation for report review.

Teacher Student Data Link – Both the interchange and snapshot will remain open until Aug. 28.

Student End of Year – Districts must create a 2014-2015 snapshot by June 5. The 2014-2015 student interchange and Title I interchange files have zero errors by June 25. All districts submit their 2014-

2015 Student End-of-Year snapshots to CDE by Sept. 10.

Special Education End of Year – The snapshot will remain open until October 13. Friday, September 18 is the interim date by which all changes, specifically exit information changes, are identified and fixed and the administrative unit creates complete error-free Special Education EOY snapshot.

What's on the Horizon:

The CMAS: PARCC English Arts and Math SBD is scheduled for late June/early July. Dates will be announced as soon as they are finalized. The Math Science Partnership will be conducted through the Automated Data Exchange one last time for the 2014-15 school year.
