Colorado is implementing significant education improvements aimed at ensuring all students graduate college- and career-ready. While much research and discussion has gone into the policy development, we're now putting those policies into action. Here's a brief snapshot of implementation milestones, deadlines, supports available and a look of what to expect ahead.

Educator Effectiveness

Overview:

Classroom teaching and school leadership are the strongest school-based factors impacting student achievement. CDE supports the state's 178 school districts to attract, prepare and support great educators as a part of meeting the requirements of S.B.10-191, the Great Teachers and Leaders Act.

What's Happening Now:

2014-15 State Assessments and Educator Evaluations

Results from 2014-15 state tests cannot be used for educator evaluations for the 2014-15 school year. The "time out" created by House Bill 15-1323 allows more time for educators, schools and districts to gain more experience with the standards and get used to the new assessments before they are incorporated into accountability systems. Standards

Overview:

Now is a good time for educators to refocus on the opportunity high quality standards provide for Colorado's children. Student learning is at the heart of Colorado's education improvement initiatives. The Teaching and Learning Unit offers schools and districts resources and supports to enhance student learning and achievement.

What's Happening Now:

Early Learning and School Readiness

School Readiness Training Opportunities

CDE continues to host training events for the school readiness assessments. Three, no-cost trainings

are being offered **Aug. 3, 4 and 6** for teachers and principals on how to use Teaching Strategies GOLD. TS GOLD is the most widely adopted assessment tool, as a primary formative assessment across multiple child domains as identified in legislation. Trainings for REAL and DRDP, the other two school readiness assessment tools, are being arranged with districts that have adopted these tools. Assessment subscription reimbursements through the Race to the Top Early Learning Challenge Fund grant are still available for districts that have not yet applied for 2015-16. Changes to Required Kindergarten Assessments in H.B. 15-1323

The READ Act

READ Collection and Fund Distribution

In July, districts received information about the READ Act per pupil fund distribution for the 2015-16 school year. CDE anticipates distributing funds the week of **Aug. 10**. Districts should code the distribution with source code 3000 and grant code 3206. The allowable uses for the per-pupil intervention money for students with significant reading deficiencies include: (1) providing full-day kindergarten; (2) purchasing tutoring services in reading; (3) providing other targeted, scientifically or evidence-based intervention services; or (4) operating a summer school literacy program. House Bill 14-1204, the Rural Flexibility Bill, created an additional allowable use of READ funds for small rural districts to purchase the services of a literacy specialist from a BOCES to provide professional development in literacy or other supports for implementation of the READ Act.

Assessments

Overview:

Assessments administered by the unit include summative content assessments, English language proficiency assessments, college/career ready assessments and alternate content assessments for students with significant cognitive disabilities.

The Colorado Measures of Academic Success are the new state tests in English language arts, math, science and social studies that were given to Colorado students in the 2014-15 academic year. The science and social studies tests were developed just for Colorado students, while the math and English language arts tests were developed in collaboration with other states through the Partnership

for Assessment of Readiness for Colleges and Careers (PARCC).

What's Happening Now:

Test Results Reminder

Scores for elementary and middle school students' science and social studies tests were released in July, and high school science scores will be released later this month. High school social studies scores will not be released because the state board has not approved the cut scores for those tests.

The math and English language arts scores are expected to be released later in the fall. As districts, schools, parents and students receive the scores, it will be important to remember that CMAS tests are new cannot be compared to the old TCAP or CSAP scores. CMAS tests, including the PARCC-developed math and English language arts tests, are designed to measure the complex thinking and problem-solving skills necessary to succeed in the careers of the 21st century. The new tests will set a new benchmark from which we will measure the future success of Colorado students.

CMAS: PARCC English Language Arts and Mathematics Data Clean-Up

In July, districts reviewed their CMAS: PARCC English language arts and math records and updated information during the student biographical data review through CDE's Data Pipeline.

A merged summative record file is scheduled to be available for district review in Data Pipeline through a Cognos report from **Aug. 13 to 19**. This is an opportunity to verify that the performance based assessment component (PBA) and end of year (EOY) records are merged correctly. This is not an opportunity to do another demographic data review. Specific information about how districts may access and use this file will be sent to district assessment coordinators and data respondents. This step in the process will only occur this year. Accountability, Performance & Support

Overview:

CDE supports schools and districts in the continuous improvement process through its focus on implementing quality school and district support systems, accountability measures, improvement plans, federal programs and data analysis.

What's Happening Now:

School and District Accountability in 2015-16

House Bill 15-1323 included adjustments for Colorado's school and district accountability system for the 2015-16 school year. Specifically 2015 district accreditation ratings and school plan types (based on data from the 2014-15 school year), will not be calculated or assigned. Districts will not receive School or District Performance Frameworks this fall, like usual.

Because new ratings will not be assigned, a request to reconsider process will not occur this fall. To support submission of a request to reconsider in fall 2016, CDE staff from the Accountability and Data Analysis Unit will be available for technical assistance this fall for districts and schools that collected local assessment data during the 2014-15 school year. Schools and districts will continue to implement their official 2014 rating in the 2015-16 school year. Additionally, the accountability clock will not move forward on July 1, 2016. When district accreditation ratings and school plan types are again assigned in 2016, the accountability clock will continue, as a consecutive year.

Schools and districts will continue with the Unified Improvement Planning process and timelines during the 2015-16 school year. However, some modifications (e.g., updating trend statements) may need to be made in the planning process because of the state assessment transition. Accountability for Alternative Education Campuses

The Colorado State Board of Education will review and approve applications for school designation as an alternative education campus (AEC) at its August meeting. The approved list will be published on the CDE website. As with traditional School Performance Frameworks, AEC School Performance Frameworks will not be created for 2015 (based on 2014-15 data), per H.B. 15-1323. Accountability Work Groups

The Accountability Work Group will meet **Monday, Aug. 31**. The group shared initial recommendations and asked for feedback at the summer CASE Convention. The Accountability Work Group will share recommendations and ask for feedback around the state at regional superintendent and other stakeholder meetings this fall. CDE has created a work group to focus on the Alternative Education Campus School Performance Frameworks. The group will address the statutory requirements listed in H.B. 15-1323. The group met for the first time on July 27. More information about this work will be posted on the website in the next few weeks.

District Accountability, UIP Tracker and Family Partnership Contacts

Superintendents were emailed a survey link in July to confirm and/or update their district's accountability contact, UIP tracker and family partnership contact information. Please confirm or update (especially if your district email server has changed) by the end of September. As a reminder, CDE's primary means of communication around accountability work is through the accountability contacts. The department wants to ensure that all districts are receiving the necessary information.

- Tracker contacts receive improvement planning-related communications and are responsible for submitting improvement plans to CDE.
- Family partnership contacts receive and share information about resources and support from CDE about family-school-community partnerships for student learning. (Note: H.B. 15-1321 provides small, rural districts (1,000 or less students) additional flexibility, including not identifying a family partnership contact.)

As in previous years, improvement plans may be submitted to CDE via the C-FIRS Tracker system in addition to the new online system. CDE understands that in some cases, the district's accountability contact and tracker contact may be the same individual.

Unified Improvement Planning (UIP) Templates Posted

The 2015-16 district and school level Unified Improvement Planning MS Word templates and addenda forms are finalized and available at http://www.cde.state.co.us/uip/UIP Templates.asp. A summary of the changes is available at http://www.cde.state.co.us/uip/revisiontouipresources2015. The online UIP will transition to the 2015 template by the end of July. Small, rural districts and schools that maintain a Performance Plan type or higher may submit their UIP biennially (every other year) to CDE for public posting.

What's on the Horizon:

State Data Resource Report

In the absence of the performance frameworks, CDE will release the State Data Resource Report, which includes post-secondary and workforce readiness indicators (graduation rates, dropout rates and ACT), ACCESS English language proficiency growth results and elementary and middle school CMAS science and social studies achievement results. The report

(http://schoolview.org/dish/dashboard.asp) will be available through the School and District Dashboards at the end of **August** or beginning of **September**.

Unified Improvement Planning Pre-Populated Report

Rather than receiving a unique URL through an email, districts will be able to access their reports in the online system by the end of August. However, updating the UIP in the online system is still optional in the 2015-16 school year. Users log in through the Identity Management System. Graduation Guidelines Menu of Options Adopted in May 2013 in Effect; New Resources Available

The state board of education did not take action at the May 2015 meeting to update the menu of career and college demonstrations from May 2013. During the 2015-16 school year, districts should engage employers, community leaders, students and families in conversations about local graduation requirements and how they reflect the values and priorities of each school community. Then, local school boards should adopt local graduation requirements that meet or exceed the state graduation

guidelines in order to meet the goal that these graduation expectations are in place for the class of 2021.

An addendum to the engagement toolkit is available now and includes four new fact sheets based on the work of hundreds of business and educational leaders who helped further define each item on the menu, including capstone projects and industry certificates. What's on the Horizon:

2015-16 Charter Schools Program Grant; Expected RFP Release and Training

CDE's Schools of Choice Office anticipates announcing a request for proposal for the 2015-16 Charter Schools Program (CCSP) Grant in August, with grant boot camp planned for **Aug. 19**, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. There will be one application round this fall for the 2015-16 CCSP Grant.

This grant program provides up to \$645,000 over a two- to three-year period for planning, design and implementation of a new charter school or a significant expansion of an existing high-performing charter school. CDE has approximately \$3.9 million for five to six new 2015-16 awards from remaining funds from the federal 2010-2015 Charter Schools Program SEA grant. CDE has also recently applied for additional funds for a new 2015-2018 federal award, which if approved may fund an additional 16 to 20 awards. Full eligibility rules will be outlined in the RFP, but in summary, grant funding is available for:

- New charter schools planning for a 2015-16 or 2016-17 start that submit a charter application by **Oct. 28** (though approval can still be pending)
- Existing, high-performing charter schools (Performance on three-year SPF) that are expanding two or more grade levels, or increasing their student population by 50 percent or more
- Applications require a district/authorizer/LEA to serve as fiscal agent

The IDM system separates certain district data access functions into separate roles to strengthen the protection around the data: a user manager, a local Access manager (LAM) and a user role. This month's Organizational Effectiveness update focuses on **Data Pipeline**.

Overview:

The 2014-15 Finance collection opens this month. Districts have an opportunity to review their PARCC summative file. Special Education Discipline and Teacher Student Data Link have due dates in August. Most 2015-16 interchanges will be open in August. Collection leads will communicate when districts can begin submissions. Local education agencies should request new student and staff identifiers and the directory should be updated prior to schools opening.

What's Happening Now:

PARCC Summative File Review

Districts have an opportunity to review this file in Data Pipeline from Aug. 13 to 19.

Special Education Discipline

Districts should continue to collaborate with administrative units to provide discipline data. This snapshot is open until **Wednesday**, **Aug. 26**. AUs must generate a complete Special Education Discipline Snapshot dataset by passing all interchange and snapshot validations in preparation for report review by **Tuesday**, **Aug. 18**.

Teacher Student Data Link

Both the interchange and snapshot are open until Friday, Aug. 28.

End of Year

All districts must submit 2014-2015 Student End-of-Year snapshots to CDE by Thursday, Sept. 10.

Math Science Partnership

This collection will be conducted through the Automated Data Exchange one last time for the 2014-15 school year. The collection is due **Wednesday**, **Sept. 30**.

Special Education End of Year

The snapshot is open until **Tuesday, Oct. 13**. All changes, specifically exit information changes, are identified and fixed and the administrative unit creates complete error-free Special Education EOY snapshot by the interim date of **Friday, Sept. 18**.
