Assurances Update: 2015

Beginning in July 2013, and by July 1 of each year thereafter, CDE is required to collect an assurance from each school district indicating that the district is either implementing the state model evaluation system, its own distinctive evaluation system, or a combination/hybrid of the two. Additionally, for 2015, CDE collected the Measures of Student Learning percentage related to House Bill 14-165. What's Happening Now:

New Instructional Units Available

Three new Colorado teacher-authored integrated elementary instructional units based on the Colorado Academic Standards are available at

http://www.cde.state.co.us/standardsandinstruction/instructionalunits-integrated. The units integrate the arts with another content area, providing instructional units that maintain the integrity of each discipline. The units were developed by a collaborative group of elementary classroom and arts educators and community arts partners in response to requests from the field.

In the coming months, educators and arts specialists will create additional arts integrated units at each grade, beginning with kindergarten through grade five and then expanding into the middle school grade levels. READ Act Approved Assessments

In December 2013, the state board approved a list of interim reading assessments for the purpose of identifying significant reading deficiencies pursuant to the READ Act. The READ Act allows for districts to transition to an approved assessment by **July 1, 2016**. Districts currently using DIBELS 6th edition or DRA2 will need to transition to an approved assessment. Assessments

Overview:

Assessments administered by the unit include summative content assessments, English language proficiency assessments, college/career ready assessments and alternate content assessments for students with significant cognitive disabilities.

The Colorado Measures of Academic Success are the new state tests in English language arts, math, science and social studies that were given to Colorado students in the 2014-15 academic year. The science and social studies tests were developed just for Colorado students, while the math and English language arts tests were developed in collaboration with other states through the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for Colleges and Careers (PARCC).

What's Happening Now:

High School Assessment Update

Legislation that included changes to the state's assessment system was passed last spring. Among these changes is a reduction to the frequency of social studies assessment administration within schools, a shift in the grade level of high school science and social studies assessments and the addition of a preparatory exam that is aligned to the Colorado Academic Standards and to the 11th-grade college entrance exam.

Social Studies Sampling

Senate Bill 15-056 reduced the number of schools that will administer the state social studies assessments each year. CDE and Pearson are finalizing a plan that will provide a representative state sample and that will allow each public school to administer the social studies assessments at least once every three years. Over the next three years, about 1/3 of schools will be selected to administer the elementary and middle school assessments each year. Schools that have been selected to administer the elementary and middle school social studies assessments in spring 2016 will be shared with districts by November. High school social studies assessments will not be administered this spring. The three year sampling plan for high school social studies includes zero percent of schools selected to participate in 2015-2016, about 50 percent of schools selected to participate in 2016-2017 and about 50 percent of schools selected to participate in 2017-2018. High School Science and Social Studies

Legislation passed last spring requires students enrolled in public high schools to take state science (House Bill 15-1323) and social studies (Senate Bill 15-056) assessments before 12th-grade. After consideration of possibilities and discussions with district science and social studies leaders, the decision has been made to administer the high school assessments to 11th-grade students. The high school science and social studies assessments were originally intended to be administered in 11th-grade to provide local flexibility in determining scope and sequence. When Colorado joined the PARCC consortium, English language arts and math assessments were added to the 11th-grade testing load. High school science and social studies assessments were moved to twelfth 12th-grade to reduce the testing burden on 11th-grade students. The removal of PARCC English language arts and math testing in 10th and 11th-grade allows high school science and social studies to return to 11th-grade. Grade 11 students will take the science assessments in spring 2016; however, the high school social studies assessments will not be administered until spring 2017.

As Colorado moves forward with some of its other high school assessment changes, conversations with stakeholders will occur regarding how to increase the perceived relevance of the high school science and social studies assessments, as well as ways to perhaps leverage the College Entrance Exam. Grade 10 Preparatory Exam, Grade 11 College Entrance Exam and their Alternate Assessments

Last spring, House Bill 15-1323 added the requirement for a new 10th-grade preparatory exam that is aligned to both the Colorado Academic Standards and the eleventh grade college entrance exam and set the requirement that the Department of Education request competitive bids and contract for these assessments every five years. Colorado is in the process of issuing a single RFP (request for proposal) for both the 10th-grade preparatory exam and the 11th-grade college entrance exam. Details regarding both of these exams for 2015-16 will not be available until the completion of the competitive RFP process, selection of a test vendor and signing of a contract. Students with the most significant cognitive disabilities are required to take an alternate form of the preparatory and college entrance exams. In spring 2016, students with the most significant cognitive disabilities will take the Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) English language arts and math assessments in tenth 10th- and 11th-grade. The 11th-Grade Alternate Assessment that has historically served as an alternate to the Colorado ACT will be available as a resource for district use; however, the DLM assessment will replace the eleventh 11th-grade Alternate Assessment for the eleventh11th-grade College Entrance exam. What's on the Horizon:

Unified Improvement Planning Submissions Dates

Districts and schools must submit a revised/updated UIP by **April 15** (small, rural districts and schools with a Performance plan type may submit plans biennially). Schools and districts with a Priority Improvement or Turnaround plan type (2014) must submit by **Jan. 15**. CDE also offers two optional submission windows for public posting on SchoolView on both **Oct. 15** and **Jan. 15**. <u>View more information</u> (http://www.cde.state.co.us/uip/uip_trainingandsupport_tracker).

Optional review of the revised UIP for 2015-16 is available for districts Accredited with Priority Improvement and Turnaround Plans. This support is also being offered to schools that have been awarded a Tiered Intervention Grant. Plans for the optional fall review are due **Oct. 15** via the online UIP system or through Tracker. The fall submission does not take the place of the required winter submission due **Jan. 15** for Priority Improvement/Turnaround plans.

- Early September Release of pre-populated 2015 Unified Improvement Plans (section I) to districts. The online UIP system will be used to share the MS Word pre-populated reports, and is accessible through the Identity Management System http://www.cde.state.co.us/uip/uip-online-system. Use of the online UIP system for completing the plan is still optional this year; the un-populated MS Word template is available at http://www.cde.state.co.us/uip/UIP Templates.asp.
- Oct. 15 (Optional) Deadline for districts Accredited with Priority Improvement and Turnaround plans and Tiered Intervention Grant (TIG) schools to submit UIPs through the Tracker system for a fall UIP (Data Narrative) review from CDE.
- **Oct. 15** (Optional) Deadline for districts and schools to submit 2014-15 revised UIPs through Tracker for the fall public posting on SchoolView.org.

Overview:

End of Year and Math Science Partnership are due this month. The 2015-16 Student October snapshot opens this month. Please continue to request new student and staff identifiers as needed.

What's Happening Now:

End-of-Year Snapshots

All districts must submit their 2014-2015 Student End-of-Year snapshots and approve initial data summary reports by **Sept. 10**. The cross LEA validation Phase A, reclaiming dropouts from prior collection years begins **Sept. 28**. Do not send superintendent signatures until December collection finalization.

Math Science Partnership

This collection, due **Sept. 30**, is conducted through the Automated Data Exchange one last time for the 2014-15 school year.

Special Education End-of-Year

The snapshot remains open until **Oct. 13**. All changes, specifically exit information changes, are identified and fixed and the administrative unit creates a complete error-free Special Education EOY snapshot by the interim date of **Sept. 18**.

Directory

Collection liaisons should continue to enter 2015-16 key personnel into this year-round application.

RITS/EDIS

Submit requests for student and staff identifiers as soon as possible for the 2015-16 school year. This ensures that needed SASIDS and EDIDS are available for applicable collections.

2014-15 Finance

Continue to submit files by **Dec. 31**.

Student October

The 2015-16 snapshot opens Sept. 1.

The Student End-of-Year post cross LEA validation Phase B, verifying transfers and dropouts within Colorado, begins in late October. The 2015-16 Teacher Student Data Link snapshot opens in October.
