INTRODUCTION

ANNUAL DROPOUT RATES

This report provides information on the number of students who dropped out of Colorado's public schools during the 1989-90 school year. Schools with grades 7-12 are required to complete an end-of-year report which provides counts of students entering and withdrawing during the 12 month period July 1 through June 30.

The dropout rate is an annual rate reflecting the percentage of all students enrolled in grades 7-12 who leave school during the reporting period and are not known to transfer to other public or private schools or a General Education Development (GED) program.

Colorado's dropout rate for the 1989-90 school year was 4.1 percent. Of the total 273,440 membership base in grades 7-12, 11,075 students dropped out resulting in a rate of 4.1 percent.

During the 1988-89 school year, 11,473 students dropped out resulting in a rate of 4.2 percent. Of the 11,473 students reported as dropouts during the previous year, 2,767 were reported as retrievals during the 1989-90 school year. This represents approximately one-fourth (24 percent) of the 1988-89 dropouts returning to school the following year.

Overall there has been no significant change in the total number of students dropping out of grades 7-12 or in the number of retrievals during the last three school years. However, the number of dropouts and retrievals vary from district to district. It should also be noted that in districts with a small membership base, one dropout can produce a high dropout rate.

These small districts are also affected by students who enroll and remain in membership less than 15 days and drop out. A survey conducted as part of the CDE Form 2, End-of-Year report indicated a total of 868 students were in membership less than 15 days during the 1989-90 school year. Additional information on these students is provided on page 30.

THREE YEAR GRADUATION RATE

The Colorado graduation rate for the class of 1990 is 80.0 percent and the completion rate is 81.3 percent. Included in this report are districts' results of a three-year (i.e., grades 10-12) graduation rate and a completion rate. In addition, for those districts that have alternative schools, a district graduation rate and completion rate is calculated excluding the alternative school. This comparison enables the reader to evaluate the rates of the regular school program apart from the total district rates.

The Public School Finance Act of 1988 requires the State Board of Education to adopt goals and objectives for improving Colorado education statewide. One of these goals is "Colorado's statewide public school graduation rate will increase by two percent annually from the 1987 rate of 76 percent until it reaches at least 90 percent by July 1, 1995."

This goal is based on the 1987 statewide unadjusted four year graduation rate of 76.0 percent. The unadjusted graduation rate is defined as the number of graduates as a percent of the ninth grade enrollment four years earlier and does not account for mobility into and out of the state.

During the fall of 1988 a Task Force comprised of school district and Colorado Department of Education personnel recommended that graduation rate calculation be based on information reported on the dropout data collection system. The dropout data collection system, implemented in the 1987-88 school year, provides pupil membership and transfer data by grade, school, and district. Because 1987-88 was the first school year in which this detailed data was collected, it is the base year which permits a three-year graduation rate. During the 1987-88 school year, the Class of 1990 were 10th graders. Next year, the 1991 graduation rate will be a four-year rate based on students who were 9th graders in 1987-88.

Although the department is able to report graduation rates for the Class of 1990 and for future graduating classes, it is not currently possible to track students who drop out from their graduating class but complete their education several years later. A number of school districts provide adult education programs leading to either a high school diploma or a GED certificate. In 1989, 5,978 persons received a GED through the state's testing program. The average age of test takers was 24.5. Forty percent were 17-19 years of age and 60 percent were 20 years or older.

Nationally, the U.S. Department of Education reports that 68 percent of the population surveyed by the Census Bureau in 1989 had received their high school diploma by age 19. The same survey indicates that by age 24, 81.8 percent had received a high school diploma and 86 percent had received either a high school diploma or a GED.




- The Graduation Rate for Class of 1990 is 80.0 percent. This graduation rate is based on a 3-year rate encompassing grades 10-12. For Class of 1991 and ensuing years the graduation rates will be a 4-year rate. Therefore, the graduation rate for Class of 1991 most likely will show a decline as the membership base to calculate the 4-year graduation rate will begin with the 1987-88 9th grade.
- The graduation rate excluding the alternative schools is 82.3 percent. Reporting this separate rate provides the districts and the reader an opportunity to view the graduation rates of the regular school programs verses the combined data from the regular and alternative programs.
- · Female students reflect a higher graduation rate than male students.
- Asian students have the highest graduation rate with 84.9 percent, followed by White students, 83.1 percent; Black students, 73.5 percent; Hispanic students, 66.4 percent and American Indian students with 57.0 percent.





- Districts whose total membership is less than 300 students have the higher average graduation rate of any of the size groupings. However, because their classes are small, one dropout can have a large impact on a small district's graduation rate.
- The graduation rate of 75.5 percent for the thirty-four districts in the grouping of 301
 - 600 student membership was adversely affected by a district with a unique situation.
 The district is responsible for providing educational services to an alternative program
 for job corp students. The district's regular high school graduating class contained 22
 students and 20 graduates, but the alternative school contains 272 students with only 75
 graduates. In recalculating the graduation rate for this size grouping by excluding the
 student counts for this particular alternative school, the graduation rate is 90.8
 percent.
- The five districts with total membership exceeding 25,000 students account for 37.5 percent of the state's graduates.
- The nineteen districts whose total membership exceeds 6,000 students account for 73.7 percent of the state's graduates.

• The 1989-90 dropout rate for both male and female students declined by 0.1 percent from the 1988-89 rates.

- Eleventh grade males continued to have the highest dropout rate although the rate did decline from 6.9 percent in 1988-89 to 6.2 percent in 1989-90.
- The highest dropout rate for females during 1989-90 occurred in the tenth grade whereas for 1987-88 and 1988-89 the highest rates were in the eleventh grade.

DROPOUT RATES BY GRADE 1987-88, 1988-89 and 1989-90



• Overall there has been no significant change in the total number of students dropping out of grades 7-12.


• Grade 11, which historically has had the highest dropout rate, reflected the highest percent decrease in dropout rate from 1988-89.

• The "Ungraded" category shows a decrease in the number of pupils reported in the membership base because districts were encouraged to report pupils within a grade level whenever possible.

• Alternative schools reflect a declining dropout <u>rate</u> but a 63 percent increase in the number of pupils, and a 46 percent increase in the number of dropouts over the 1987-88 school year.

American Indian students comprise 0.9 percent of the student count and 2.0 percent of the dropouts.

Asian students comprise 2.4 percent of the student count and 1.9 percent of the dropouts.

Black students comprise 5.6 percent of the student count and 8.0 of the dropouts.

Hispanic students comprise 16.0 percent of the student count and 28.8 percent of the dropouts.

White students comprise 75.1 percent of the student count and 59.3 percent of the dropouts.

• Historically, grade 11 has had the highest overall dropout rate. This trend continued during the 1989-90 school year, however, the 11th grade also reflected the highest percent decrease in the dropout rate. Hispanic students reflected a significant decline in the 11th grade dropout rate, but an increase in the 10th grade rate.


• Black students reflected the biggest change in the dropout rate of all ethnic/racial groups. The dropout rate for Black students declined from 6.8 percent in 1988-89 to 5.8 percent in 1989-90. American Indian student dropout rate continues to increase and the rates for Asian, Hispanic and White students remained constant.



Summary of Students Who Were "Short-Timers": Dropouts Who Were In Membership 15 Days or Less

During the 1989 Spring Workshops on Dropout Reporting and Measuring Graduation Rates, district participants raised the issue of pupils who attend a school for a very short time and then drop out. Participants were concerned that these "short-timers" may adversely affect their dropout and graduation rates, even though districts do not have an adequate amount of time to actively engage these students in school programs. Additionally, it was speculated that "short-timers" may move from district to district maintaining membership for only a brief period of time in any one district.

In order to determine the scope of the problem, schools were asked during their End of Year Membership, Dropout, and Graduate reporting in May, to provide a list of pupils who transferred into their school during the 1989-90 school year, maintained 1-15 days of membership and dropped out of school.

One hundred forty-five of 176 districts reported, yielding a return rate of 82.4 percent. The mean number of days in membership for "short-timers" was 7.5, with 1 day being the most common length of membership. Ninety percent were born between 1970 and 1974 (15-20 years old). Over 22 percent were born in 1972 (17-18 years old), and 6.3 percent were born prior to that year. Forty-seven percent of "short-timers" were female and 53 percent were male. The racial/ethnic distribution of "short-timers" was similar to that of dropouts overall, however Blacks and Hispanics had a relatively greater representation among the "short-timers". Small Attendance and Rural school settings contributed only 5 percent of dropouts overall, but represented 10.6 percent of "short-timers". In contrast, Urban-Suburban settings represented 21.6 percent of "short-timers" and 25.8 percent of overall dropouts. A list of 868 "short-timers" was compiled, resulting in only three duplicate names. One "short-timer" was listed by two schools within the same district, and two appeared on the lists of more than one district. Based on the data received, it appears that the problem of students moving from district to district is minor, however short-term student dropouts have a relatively greater impact on small and rural districts.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT COLORADO DROPOUT RATES

Who Is Considered a Colorado Dropout? By Colorado law, a dropout is a "person who leaves school for any reason, except death, before completion of a high school diploma or its equivalent and who does not transfer to another public or private school or enroll in an approved home study program." A student is <u>not</u> a dropout if he/she transfers to an educational program recognized by the district, completes a G.E.D. or registers in a program leading to a G.E.D., is committed to an institution that maintains educational programs, or is so ill that he/she is unable to participate in a homebound or special therapy program.

Who Is a Transfer? A student is considered a transfer to another district or educational program if the receiving school or program sends for the student's records, or if the sending district can document that the parent or legal guardian has provided information regarding the school or education program into which the student is transferring. This definition of a transfer is in accordance with the Public School Finance Act of 1988, 22-53-207(3).

What If a Student Just Disappears? A student who disappears from school is considered a dropout unless the student transferred to another educational program.

What Is the Dropout Rate? The Colorado dropout rate is an <u>annual</u> rate, reflecting the percentage of all students enrolled in grades 7-12 who leave school during a single school year. It is calculated by dividing the number of dropouts by a membership base which includes all students who were in membership any time during the year.

Can the Dropout Rate Be Multiplied by Four to Find Out How Many Students Drop Out Over the Four Years of High School? No. The dropout rate is an annual rate only. It is not statistically valid to simply multiply the annual rate by four to find out how many students dropped out during high school. The graduation rate, however, provides a measure of how many students completed graduation requirements.

Can a Student Drop Out More Than Once? How Does That Affect the Annual Dropout Rate? Some students have a pattern of dropping out and returning to school several times before they either graduate or drop out and do not return. In the state reporting system, a student is counted as a dropout <u>only once</u> within a given reporting period (i.e., from July 1 through June 30). However, if a student drops out during one school year, then returns to school the following year and drops out again, he/she will be counted in the dropout rate two years in a row.

How Valid Are Colorado's Dropout Rates? The Colorado Department of Education provides definitions, guidelines, and training regarding the proper procedures for identifying and reporting dropout statistics. The data are edited and screened upon receipt and a turnaround document with the calculated rates is returned to the district for verification. In submitting the data to the state, each superintendent signs an assurance that the district has followed the required procedures.

How Are Dropout Data Reported? Dropout data are reported annually to the Department by Colorado school districts. Dropout data are collected for grades 7-12, by school building and by district. Data are reported separately by sex, ethnicity/race, and grade level of students.

How Does Colorado's Dropout Rate Compare to the National Average? Currently, there is no national dropout data collection. The National Center for Education Statistics is in the process of developing and pilot-testing a proposed national system expected to be implemented in the 1991-92 school year.

OUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT COLORADO GRADUATION RATES

Who Is a Graduate? In Colorado, local school boards are responsible for establishing the requirements for high school graduation.

Do All Colorado School Districts Have the Same Requirements For Graduation? No. Each local school board defines graduation requirements for their district. These vary from district to district. The State considers a graduate to be any student who has met the graduation requirements of the local school district.

Are There Students Who Complete 12 Years of School and Do Not Graduate? Yes. Some districts award certificates or other designations of high school completion or attendance to students who do not complete the standard high school graduation requirements. Also, some students who do not complete the regular high school graduation requirements do successfully achieve a general equivalency certificate (GED).

Who Will Be Included in the Calculation of Graduation Rate? Two types of rates are calculated by the Department for school districts and for the state: Graduation Rates and Completion Rates.

Graduation Rates. Graduation rates are calculated based on high school graduates only. A graduate is a student who completed locally-defined requirements for graduation. If a student is not considered a graduate by the local board of education, then he/she is not be included in the graduation rate calculation.

Completion Rates. Completion rates are calculated based on all students who are graduates, <u>plus</u> those who are not considered graduates but receive another certificate or designation of high school completion or attendance, <u>plus</u> students who receive a G.E.D. from the district after completing a program of studies.

What Happens to Students Who Graduate in the Summer? Summer graduates are included in the graduation rate calculation of the current graduating class or included in the following year's graduation rate calculation based on district's reporting practice.

What Happens if a Student Was Reported as a Dropout at Some Point During His or Her High School Years and the School Subsequently Receives Information that the Student Transferred into Another Educational Program? Does That Student Affect the Graduation Rate For the Class of Which He/She Was Originally a Member? No. If the high school has documentation of the student's transfer into another educational program or completion of an educational program, then an adjustment may be made to the membership base used to calculate the graduation rate. These students are not reported as completers from the district, they are taken out of the membership base of the school and treated as if they transferred from the school. However, the dropout rate for the year in which they were reported as a dropout remains unchanged.

What Is the Graduation Rate? The graduation rate is a cumulative or longitudinal rate which calculates the number of students who actually graduate as a percent of those who were in membership and could have graduated over a four-year period (i.e., from Grades 9-12).

A graduation rate will be reported for each particular graduating class (i.e., the Class of 1991). The rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates by the membership base. The membership base is derived from the end-of-year count of eighth graders four years earlier (i.e., in the spring of 1987), and adjusting that figure for the number of students who have transferred into or out of the district during the years covering grades 9 through 12. (The graduation rate for the Class of 1990 is based on a three-year rate, grades 10-12 beginning with the baseline year of data in 1987.)

What Is the Completion Rate? The Completion Rate is also a cumulative or longitudinal rate which calculates the number of students who <u>graduate</u>, receive certificates or other designations of high school completion or attendance, or receive a G.E.D. from programs <u>administered by the district</u>. It is also calculated as a percent of those who were in membership and could have graduated or completed over a four-year period (i.e., from Grades 9-12).

Information needed to calculate graduation and completion rates is available from the dropout data collection system initiated in the 1987-88 school year.

What Is Meant By the "Class of 1991"? Graduation rates and completion rates will be reported for a particular class. The Class of 1991 will include students who graduated in the spring of 1991 and during the summer of 1991. It may include students who completed high school in three years, four years or longer.

When Will Reporting of Graduation Rates and Completion Rates Begin? Data needed to calculate the graduation and completion rates are available from the existing dropout data collection system beginning with the 1987-88 school year. Because the calculations require four years of historical data, four-year rates cannot be calculated accurately until the summer of 1991.

For the Class of 1990, the Department will report three-year graduation and completion rates covering Grades 10-12. Beginning in 1991, and every year thereafter, four-year rates will be calculated and included in the Department's annual dropout report.

How Will Districts Be Trained to Calculate Graduation Rates? The calculation of graduation and completion rates requires no new data collection. However, additional calculations of existing data are required. Instructions for performing these calculations are included in the revised <u>Colorado Model Student Accounting System for Reporting Dropouts and Measuring Graduation Rates</u>, which was disseminated in Spring of 1989 and Spring of 1990.

How Do Colorado Graduation Rates Compare to National Rates? The U.S. Department of Education defines graduation rate as the number of graduates as a percent of the number of ninth graders four years earlier. This rate is calculated for all states. To adjust for mobility, the U.S. Department uses unpublished Census data concerning population mobility from 1980 to 1983. We cannot make a similar adjustment because similar data are not available by school district or school. In addition, because Colorado mobility has changed dramatically during the 1980's, their adjustment is really no longer appropriate for Colorado, and artificially lowers our rate in comparison to other states. The procedures the Colorado Department of Education will use to calculate graduation rates will provide a much more accurate picture of high school graduation than is currently provided by the U.S. Department of Education. They will not be comparable, however, to rates calculated at the national level.

In 1988, the most recent date for which published figures are available, Colorado was reported by the U.S. Department of Education as having a 74.7 percent graduation rate, compared to a national rate of 71.2 percent. Colorado ranked 24th among the 50 states in this report.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION

Data published in this report were obtained from all Colorado public schools having any grades 7-12 on CDE Form 2, <u>End of Year Pupil</u> Membership, Dropouts and Graduates Report. Data collected on these forms were then summarized for reporting in the various formats.

Data for alternative schools in some tables are reported separately. This provides additional information for those districts' schools that are established to give students who are dropouts or potential dropouts an alternative to the regular program. The alternative schools data also includes those Second Chance Programs operated by districts and Boards of Cooperative Services. However, it does not include any educational programs for dropouts that are incorporated as part of the regular high school program.
