A new nature resource site is available called <a href="Months:energy">eNature.com</a>. It offers online searchable field guides to over 4,800 plant and animal species. The database is keyword searchable. The entries include a large thumbnail image, description, and other information. The user can search by size, color, habitat, region, and other options within each group. There are also an "ask-an-expert" message board, habitat guides, tips for teachers, and much more.
