### **Copyright Issues: Settlement in Writers Case**

After more than three years, a final settlement has been reached that will award between \$10 and \$18 million to thousands of freelance writers whose articles were used in electronic databases without their permission. The settlement covers any English-language article that has appeared in an electronic database after August

1997. The final amount, a minimum of \$10 million and a maximum of \$18 million, will be determined by how many writers make claims. It is estimated that there may be as many as 10,000 writers eligible for compensation.
