# Feds' Closer Look at School Libraries Shows Innovation, Results

The recent online newsletter from the Institute for Museum and Library Services featured school libraries and their relationship to student achievement. These were supported by IMLS grants The article quotes research published by the Colorado State Library showing that state reading scores for students in schools that focused on improving their library programs were, on average, eight to 21 percent higher than similar schools without such development.
