Library of Congress Opens "Portals to the World" on **Many Countries**

The Library of Congress has launched a new web site that provides unique data for 49 countries. Dubbed "Portals to the World," the project plans to a have a web page for each country in the world by 2003. The service does not intend to rival the CIA World Fact Book, which is also on the Internet; however, it does have links to the CIA site. Users can access such information as current interest rates in Peru and how to register for language courses at Estonia's Tartu University. The Portals to the World web site also provides various links to the countries' own sites.
