

Capitol Event for AskColorado

State legislators, aides, and visitors learned more about statewide library services on January 26, when AskColorado set up a demonstration site in the State Capitol. From 7:30 to 9 a.m., library staff working on the collaboration provided PowerPoint shows and distributed information. The emphasis was on the multitude of educational benefits of AskColorado and Live Homework Help. An estimated 60 people received background. Later each legislator got a packet of information in order to let constituents know about the service.



Youth Services Workshops Held in Grand Junction

The Colorado State Library, with the essential support and hosting of Mesa County Public Library, presented workshops in early February on the Summer Reading Program, early literacy's Every Child Ready to Read @your library, along with a brainstorming session about reading programs for teens and adults. Response was enthusiastic and energetic. More than 60 people attended one or more of the sessions and made plans for their libraries' services. A new round of workshops statewide is planned for fall on similar topics.
