### **TIME WARNER Closes E-Books Division**

In another blow for the fledgling electronic book market, Time Warner Books announced Tuesday it was shutting down its e-publishing division, iPublish.com. Laurence J. Kirshbaum, chairman of Time Warner Trade Publishing, said in a statement: "The market for e-books has simply not developed as we hoped." The demise of iPublish.com comes just one month after Random House closed its own ebook imprint, AtRandom.com. iPublish was conceived as an accessible outlet for emerging writers, using the Internet not just for distribution but for democratizing the publishing process. ## University Report Urges that Librarians Be Included to Strengthen Searches

Library Hotline reports in its September 17 issue that Johns Hopkins University's research policies and procedures have been criticized by an external committee charged with reviewing them. The report follows the death of a volunteer who died following an asthma study during which he inhaled a substance and subsequently developed complications. The doctor in charge of the experiment had reportedly done his research using online resources, and the coverage of the electronic sources was not historically complete enough to reveal earlier articles that warned of lung damage associated with the substance. Among the actions suggested to strengthen research was "Requiring investigators to collaborate with a librarian and a pharmacist to strengthen literature searches."

### Scores and Books About Music Now Available on Web-Braille

Music scores and books about music have been added to Web-Braille, a program of the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped in the Library of Congress. More than 250 music items are now available with more material to be added as it is produced. The specialized digital holdings contain items not available from any other source, including many Braille music scores For information, visit the <u>NLS</u> site.
