## Changes Begin at Colorado Digitization Program

Liz Bishoff, who has served as Executive Director of the Colorado Digitization Program (CDP) since its inception in 1998, has resigned to assume responsibility as Vice President of Digital Collections and Preservation Services at OCLC. Her new role will enable her to continue national leadership in the digital library community. Bishoff was with OCLC for eleven years prior to joining the CDP, including service in the position of Vice President for Member Services.

Nancy Allen, Dean and Director of the University of Denver Penrose Library, and Chair of the Board of the Colorado Digitization Program, will serve as Interim Executive Director until the Board launches a search after the New Year. Nancy Allen has been serving as Principal Investigator on the major Institute for Museum and Library Services grants supporting Colorado Digitization Program projects, including the Western Trails project and the Teaching with Colorado's Heritage project.
