## Highlighting—Magazines on Cartridge

Early in 2013, NLS will convert audio magazines from cassette tapes to digital cartridges. The new distribution system will involve sending multiple magazines on a single cartridge, if you are subscribed to more than one magazine. These cartridges must be returned, just like books, by flipping the mailcard on the container. Non-return of cartridges will result in suspension of magazine service. All audio magazines are also available for download from the BARD website.

If you have not been receiving magazines while waiting for the transition, you can get set up for magazines on cartridge by calling the library.

Please contact a Reader Advisor at the Colorado Talking Book Library to let us know about any changes you'd like to make to the magazines you receive. If you plan to download your magazines from BARD, please contact us so we can cancel your subscription for the cassette copy of the magazine.

Please note these changes will affect only audio magazines. Braille and large print distribution will remain the same.

Each large print book is mailed out in its own mail pouch. We would like patrons to return books in individual pouches and not double up books. Unfortunately patrons have been putting multiple books in pouches and then keeping the extras. We have now run out of mail pouches both large and small.

If you receive large print books, please look around your living space and find any unused pouches and send them back to the library. We desperately need them. At one point we had 8,000 pouches. Now we are down to no reserves and use whatever comes back in the mail. This will compromise service, as books will have to wait for pouches to be returned.

## Mailroom News—Including Notes in Mail Container

Many times patrons include notes in mailing containers and machine boxes when returning mail. Although the mailroom staff are supposed to open every box and container, some are missed. We suggest that if you have a note to send that you put it in an envelope and mail it to the library. That way your note will not be missed and will go straight to the reader advisors.

## Subject Lines on Emails

At the Department of Education there is a spam filter that filters email coming into the department and library. Emails with empty subject lines can end up caught in the filter which could mean a delay of up to a day for us to receive your email. We may even miss it in the filter report. Please consider filling in the subject line before sending your email.

## Volunteer News—Partnerships

All great Volunteer programs are built on many lasting partnerships. Sometimes it is the formal working relationships of the Pioneers with the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped that has repaired talking book machines for more than sixty years. Other times the narrator-monitor-director partnership renewed with each new book they agree to record.

At Colorado Talking Book Library, we are very fortunate to have strong partnerships with three chapters of the Pioneers: a Volunteer Network. The members of these three clubs are often the first to sign up for many special events beyond repairing talking book machines. They have also served at the Open House, the 9Health Fair, and the annual Volunteer Appreciation Brunch. I am sure many of their long-term members can share stories back to when the recorded discs were replaced by recorded cassettes.

We have also had partnerships with several job training agencies including SER—National that helps adults who are over 55 to train for re-employment. Since 2007 they have provided nearly 37,000 hours of volunteer service repairing broken cassette books, copying

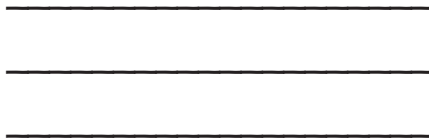
