## From the Director

CTBL's biennial patron satisfaction survey results are in and our overall satisfaction with CTBL services is 98% for excellent/good responses.

Two issues still remain — books that we select for you and the newsletter.

Please, please, if you are unhappy with the books that are being sent to you, call a reader advisor. Work with them to change your subject codes so you can receive books to your liking. If we don't know about the problem, we can't fix it. There are 22,000 subject codes to select from.

Additionally, satisfaction with the newsletter continues to fall. The newsletter has not substantially changed from when satisfaction was high so we are unclear what needs to change. If you have thoughts on this, please let a reader advisor know your ideas.

We asked about book clubs and more patrons are interested now. We have added the author/book talk in the CTBL Reads program. At the present this is via the phone but we are considering an online option. So stay tuned about that.

## CTBL Reads — Being Mortal

The next CTBL Reads begins September 14th and runs through October. As part of the "Leaving on my own Terms" program, we will be reading "Being Mortal: Medicine and what Matters in the End" by Atul Gawande. A book talk will be scheduled in October.

Surgeon and author of *Complications* (DB 56061) and *The Checklist Manifesto* (DB 70422) Gawande examines the state of end-of-life care in the twenty-first century. Discusses medical advances which have extended life expectancy, limited training of physicians to discuss mortality with patients and family members, and ways to be honest. ## Tech Talk — Be My Eyes App

Be My Eyes makes life easier for the blind, by connecting them with sighted helpers through a smartphone app. This allows the blind to handle big and small tasks, while sighted get the joy of helping someone else in an easy and informal way.

It only takes a minute to choose the right tin can from the shelf, look at the expiration date on the milk or find the right thing to eat in the fridge — if you have full vision that is. For visual impaired individuals smaller tasks in their home can often become bigger challenges. Be My Eyes hopes to change that!

Through a direct video call the app gives blind people the opportunity to ask a sighted volunteer for help, for tasks that require normal vision. The blind person “borrows” the helper’s eyes all through his or her smartphone. The sighted helper is able to see and describe what the blind person is showing the sighted helper by filming with the video camera in the smartphone. That way, by working together they are able to solve the problem that the blind person is facing.

Hans Jørgen Wiberg, who is visually impaired himself, came up with the idea for the application. Through his work at the “Danish Blind Society” he recognized, that blind people often need help to cope with smaller everyday tasks, where a “pair of eyes” could make a significant difference. In April of 2012 he presented the idea for an application at a startup event in Denmark. At this event he met the rest of the Be My Eyes (BME) team, and together they won the prize for “the most innovative idea.” Since 2012 the BME team has worked hard to make the app a reality. The app was launched the 15th of January 2015.

## BARD Mobile App for Android Now Available

The Braille and Audio Reading Download (BARD) Mobile app for Android is available through the Google Play Store:

<https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=gov.loc.nls.dtb>

This free app allows readers to download audio and braille books from their NLS BARD accounts on most Android devices. Access to BARD is provided through the Colorado Talking Book Library. BARD contains about 65,000 books, magazines and music scores in audio and braille formats, with new selections added daily.

BARD Mobile users can listen to audio books and magazines on their Android devices. This app does not have Braille functionality for accessing braille books and magazines. This will functionality will be in version 2.

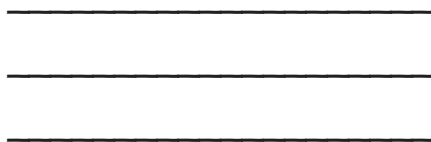
