## Friends of the Colorado Talking Book Library Celebrate 50th Anniversary!

This year we'd like to call out a very special organization that supports the library—the Friends of the Colorado Talking Book Library.

Organized in 1972, the Friends are celebrating their 50th anniversary this year. For the past five decades, this 501(c)(3) non-profit organization comprised of dedicated volunteers has supported many of the programs and services the library provides to patrons. For example, the Friends support CTBL's recording studio program. Guided by the studio director, Tyler Kottmann, narrators record books and magazines in three on-site recording booths. These recordings add to the library's collection of local interest books, including books by Colorado authors and nonfiction books about the state and the West. The studio program also produces special publications like the annual election guide (aka the Blue Book), and a guide to Colorado's 41 state parks (DBC13184).

## Tech Talk — Biped

### AI Technology for Blind and Visually Impaired People

Biped unveiled their AI (artificial intelligence) copilot at the 2022 Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas. The device straps onto shoulders like a backpack and films the surroundings with 3D cameras. Biped analyzes the environment to detect and predict obstacles several seconds in advance. It then filters the relevant information and warns the wearer via immersive 3D sounds transmitted through bone conduction earphones.

Biped is currently conducting beta testing and is hoping to launch the device in the US in early 2023. For more information visit:

## Personal Adjustment Training

The Colorado Department of Labor & Employment, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) has produced five videos previewing and explaining their Personal Adjustment Training (PAT) for the blind and low vision community.

In the overview video the training is explained this way: "Specifically, the PAT unit provides specialized training to individuals who are blind or have low vision to become independent in their home, community, and at employment. Individualized training is tailored to meet each individual's unique vision loss, needs, experiences, and employment goals. Training can occur in a variety of settings including the home, community, and various DVR offices."

## NLS Updates

### Patron Corner Programming

The National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled (NLS), as part of the Patron Engagement Section's (PES) mission to offer services, resources, and programs to enrich the library experience for patrons, will host a quarterly Patron Corner virtual event where patrons can learn more about various services directly from NLS staff. Three upcoming dates for sessions are: September 12, 2022; December 12, 2022; and March 13, 2023.

Coming up in September is a session titled "Narration: The Art of Telling the Story." The guest speakers will include Celeste Lawson, narrator and head of the NLS Media Lab.

### Braille on Demand

As part of its braille modernization initiative, NLS launched the Braille-on-Demand pilot. This project allows active NLS patrons to request and receive one hard-copy braille title per month, which they can retain for their personal use. If an individual who is not registered as a patron submits an order, NLS will refer the individual to their local network library to begin the process of becoming a patron.

Braille titles will be limited to books that are currently available on BARD, the NLS Braille and Audio Reading Download service. Requests are limited to one book per patron per month. Only complete titles will be distributed. Requests for partial titles (for example, volume one of a three-volume book) will result in receiving the entire book.

## iBill Currency Readers

The U.S. Department of the Treasury, Bureau of Engraving and Printing provides currency readers, free of charge, to all eligible blind and visually impaired U.S. citizens and national residents.



The device is small, compact, and runs on a triple-A battery, which is included. To use the currency reader, simply insert a U.S. bill into the reader and press the button. The device will tell the note's denomination.

CTBL has recently become a distributor of the currency readers. Call the library and a Reader Advisor can complete the application over the phone with you.

Or download an application, fill out the top section, and return it to CTBL through the mail, as an email attachment, or via fax for staff to complete as the certifying authority. Once we complete your application, we will send you a currency reader through the mail. Limit one per patron.

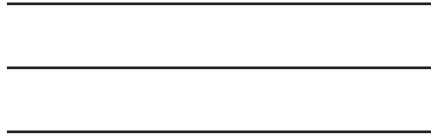
