Key to Book Numbers


Each book number is proceeded by two or three letters. These letters indicate the book's format. Here's a quick guide to help you get the book you want in the format that works best for you.

BR = braille book

DB = digital audio book

DBC = locally recorded digital audio book

PR = large print book

INTRO TO BRAILLE KIT

Are you in the process of learning braille or interested in practicing your braille skills? You can now request CTBL's new Intro to Braille kit. While this kit is not a replacement for braille classes, it is a great starting point for people who are interested in learning braille or looking for supplementary materials to support their learning. What is OCLC?

Have you heard the letters OCLC at the end of a book description on one of your cartridges and wondered what it meant?

In 1967 when OCLC was founded the letters O C L C stood for Ohio College Library Center. As the organization grew the O C L C stood for Online Computer Library Center. Today the organization is just known by the letters OCLC and it provides its member libraries with a variety of programs, services, and resources that help libraries function. This can include cataloging information like book summaries, which is why it sometimes appears in our book descriptions.



Aira Expanded to Include State Parks

This summer, Colorado Parks and Wildlife expanded the availability of Aira for visitors to state parks. Since February 2023, the State of Colorado has offered Aira, an app that provides real-time, on-demand visual interpreting through online human assistance. Coloradans can access up to 30 minutes of free service per session while navigating state locations and websites—now including state parks.



Colorado Parks and Wildlife

recommends, "Since not all parks have cellular service in all areas, visitors should call the park or visit the CPW [Colorado Parks and Wildlife] website to understand connectivity before visiting. Because Aira relies on streaming video, users should plan to ensure their devices are fully charged and consider bringing a backup power source to prepare for extended connectivity."
