

First Day.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 2, 1889.

The House of Representatives of the Seventh General Assembly was called to order by Hon. Stanley Stokes, at 12:00 o'clock m., on Wednesday, January 2, 1889.

The following communication was received from the Secretary of State:

SECRETARY'S OFFICE,
DENVER, COLO., December 26, 1888. }

I, JAMES RICE, Secretary of the State of Colorado, do hereby certify that the Board of Canvassers of the State of Colorado, composed of the following members, to wit: Hon. Alva Adams, Governor; James Rice, Secretary of State; Peter W. Breene, Treasurer; Alvin Marsh, Attorney General, duly convened at my office on the thirtieth day of November, 1888, did proceed to examine and make determination of the whole number of votes given at an election held on the sixth day of November, A. D. 1888, for all of the officers mentioned in section 53, of an act of the General Assembly of said State, entitled "Elections," and approved March 8, 1877, that were voted for at said election, which statements are thereafter certified to be correct, and subscribed by the members of the State Board of Canvassers, with a certificate of their determination as to what persons were duly elected to such offices. 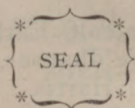
