No. 1, by Senator Eaton—A bill for an Act to repeal an Act entitled, "An Act to create the office of Colorado Director of Markets; to define the powers and duties of said office; to fix the term and salary of said office; to create the Director of Market's fund; and a revolving fund; to empower said Director of Markets to co-operate with the United States Department of Agriculture in establishing standard grades for agricultural products; to abolish the office of State Grain Inspector and transfer the powers and duties of that office upon said Director of Markets; to repeal the Act approved April 7th, 1921, being Chapter 173 of the Session Laws of Colorado for 1921; and to repeal any and all other Acts or parts of Acts which are in conflict with this Act."

No. 2, by Senator Eaton—A bill for an Act to repeal an Act entitled, "An Act authorizing the formation of non-profit, co-operative associations, with or without capital stock, for the purpose of encouraging the orderly marketing of agricultural products through co-operation; defining the various terms used therein, enumerating the activities and powers of such an association; prescribing the rights and privileges of membership; providing for articles of incorporation, declaring what they shall contain, manner of executing and filing, method of amending same; providing for by-laws and what they may contain; providing for method of election of directors, filling of vacancies; powers and duties of directors; division into election districts; appointment of executive committees and allotment of functions and powers; providing for officers, qualifications, election and functions; regulating issuance of membership certificates or stock and payment therefor; limiting personal liability of members for debts of association; regulating voting power of members and stockholders; authorizing issuance of preferred stock, with or without right to vote; and the retirement thereof; providing for removal of officers and directors; providing for referendum to members; providing for a marketing contract; and prescribing remedies for breach of contract, including liquidated damages, fees and all costs; authorizing injunction and general equitable remedies in the event of breach of agreement; stating presumption of control of products by landlords who have signed marketing agreements; providing for annual reports; providing that no provision of law in conflict with this Act shall be construed as applying to such associations; providing that legal exemption of agricultural products in the possession of producers shall apply to such products in possession of, or under the control of, such associations; limiting the use of the word 'co-operative' in

names for producers' co-operative marketing activities; and prescribing a penalty for violating such inhibition; permitting associations to organize other corporations or to own stock in other corporations; providing for agreements with other co-operative associations in this or other states and stating the purposes or reasons therefore; providing that associations heretofore organized may reorganize hereunder; providing for similar rights and remedies for co-operative associations organized under generally similar laws in other states; making it a misdemeanor to induce a member to breach his marketing contract with the association, or spread false reports about it and prescribing a fine for each offense; making such offender liable to the association for a prescribed penalty therefor in a civil suit; providing liability to the association in a penal sum in certain cases for any person who knowingly solicits, persuades or permits any member of the association to breach his marketing contract; authorizing an injunction against such warehouseman; and providing for payment of all fees and costs; and setting out the reasons for such provisions; providing that no such association shall be deemed a conspiracy or an illegal combination or monopoly; and providing that marketing contracts shall not be considered illegal; providing that if any section of this Act shall be declared unconstitutional, the remainder of the Act shall not be thereby affected; providing that the general corporation laws of this state shall apply to such association, except where inconsistent with express provisions hereof; providing for annual license fees; providing fees for filing articles of incorporation and amendments thereto; providing that this Act may be hereafter indexed, and cited as 'The Co-operative Marketing Act'; and declaring an emergency to exist."

W. King take the place of Senator Coss as a member of the Committee on Constitutional Amendments. Unanimous consent was given and the change so ordered.

S. R. No. 2—By Senators Callen, Adams and Toll.

Be It Resolved, That a special committee of three shall be appointed by the President of the Senate to devise ways and means for increased economy and efficiency in the preparation and publication of legislative journals and other legislative publications.

Senator Toll moved the adoption of S. R. No. 2. Motion seconded by Senator Adams and carried by viva voce vote, and the resolution declared duly adopted.

S. R. No. 3, by Senators Callen, Young and Murchison.

Whereas, An emergency has arisen and now exists, and additional employes are needed for the Revision, Enrollment and Engrossment Committee in order that the work of the body be properly prepared; therefore, be it

Resolved, That two extra employes be, and the same are hereby appointed to assist said committee, and said appointment shall be as of January 7, 1925.

S. R. No. 4, by Senators Freudenthal and Young (By request).

Be It Resolved, By the State Senate of the Twenty-fifth session of the Colorado State Legislature, that a committee of three, consisting of three members of the senate, be appointed by the presiding officer of said State Senate to investigate as to the practicability and advisability of the adoption of an old age pension law for Colorado along the line of similar laws passed by the states of Pennsylvania, Montana and Nevada, and to submit their report to the Twenty-fifth General Assembly of Colorado.

Senate Joint Resolutions

S. J. R. No. 1, by Senator Knauss.

Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives, that a Joint Committee, consisting of three members of the House and two members of the Senate, be appointed to notify His Excellency, the Governor, that the Twenty-fifth General Assembly is organized and ready for the transaction of business, and to inquire if he has any communications to present to the Legislature in joint session.

Moved by Senator Knauss that the rules be suspended and that the resolution be taken up for immediate consideration. Motion seconded by Senator Fairfield and carried by viva voce vote and the resolution was unanimously duly adopted. President Rockwell appointed Senators Adams and Abbey as the Senate members of the committee to notify the Governor.

Senator Eaton moved that the Senate rules for the Twenty-fourth General Assembly be made the temporary rules of the Twenty-fifth General Assembly. Motion seconded by Senator Elliot and carried by viva voce vote.

S. J. R. No. 2, by Senator Elliot.

Resolved, that the Senate and House meet in Joint Session at 11 a. m. on Friday, January 9, for the purpose of canvassing the vote for state officials.

Senator Elliot asked unanimous consent for the immediate consideration of Senate Joint Resolution No. 2. Unanimous consent being given, the resolution was taken up for immediate consideration and unanimously adopted by viva voce vote.

S. J. R. No. 3, by Senator McFadzean.

Whereas, The Compiled Laws of Colorado, 1921, in Sections 122, 123 and 124, require the Secretary of State to appoint three members of the Legislature to attend at the seat of government six days before the commencement of the session for the purpose of examining and verifying the accounts of the Auditor and Treasurer; and

Whereas, This statute passed in the year 1877, is now obsolete, useless and expensive and cost the taxpayers during the Twenty-fourth General Assembly the sum of \$3,498.00; and

Whereas, The Secretary of State in his letter of notification to this committee, dated December 8, 1924, did append the following paragraph, to-wit:

"I deem it proper, however, to advise you that I am informed that immediately upon the convening of the General Assembly a bill will be introduced to repeal said section 122 and

its related sections, together with a Joint Resolution asking that no expenses be incurred in connection with such audit pending action of the General Assembly upon said bill to repeal these sections, and I suggest the propriety of your refraining from incurring any such expense pending action on the bill." And,

Whereas, Such repeal bill has already been introduced; therefore, be it

Resolved, By this Twenty-fifth General Assembly, that the committee appointed December 8, last, under and by virtue of the aforementioned statute, be instructed to employ no clerks and to incur no expense pending the action of this General Assembly upon said repeal bill.

S. J. R. No. 4—By Senator Fairfield.

Resolved, By the Senate and House of Representatives that the Twenty-fifth General Assembly extend to the Hon. Benjamin F. Stapleton, Mayor of the City and County of Denver, its thanks and appreciation for the use of the City Auditorium which was so generously contributed by Mayor Stapleton for the inauguration, and for the many other courtesies and help given by him with respect to the inauguration ceremonies; and

That a copy of this resolution be sent to Mayor Stapleton by the Secretaries of the Senate and of the House of Representatives.

Senator Fairfield asked unanimous consent for the immediate consideration of S. J. R. No. 4. There being no objection Senator Fairfield moved the adoption of the resolution. Motion seconded by Senator Renshaw and carried by viva voce vote, and the resolution was declared duly adopted.

S. J. R. No. 5, by Senator Elliot.

Resolved, That the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House be authorized to begin the preparation of an index of all Senate and House bills, together with the names of the introducers and the reference to committees, the same to be printed in pamphlet form to the end that this index be completed and laid upon the desks of Senators and Representatives as soon after January 21st as possible, and

Be It Further Resolved, That the Printing Committee be authorized to have three hundred and fifty copies of this index printed for the use of the Senators and Representatives.

Senator Elliot asked unanimous consent for the immediate consideration of S. J. R. No. 5. Consent given. Senator Elliot moved the adoption of the resolution. Motion seconded by Senator Adams.

A majority having voted in the affirmative, the resolution was declared adopted.

Senate Concurrent Resolutions

S. C. R. No. 1, by Senator Elliot—Concurrent resolution ratifying the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States providing that Congress shall have power to limit, regulate, and prohibit the labor of persons under eighteen years of age.

WHEREAS, The Sixty-eighth Congress of the United States of America, at its first session, in both houses, by a constitutional majority of two-thirds thereof, has made the following proposition to amend the Constitution of the United States of America in the following words, to-wit:

“JOINT RESOLUTION

“Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

“Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which, when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states, shall be valid to all intents and purposes as a part of the Constitution:

“ARTICLE

“Section 1. The Congress shall have power to limit, regulate, and prohibit the labor of persons under eighteen years of age.

“Sec. 2. The power of the several states is unimpaired by this article except that the operation of state laws shall be suspended to the extent necessary to give effect to legislation enacted by the Congress’.”

Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado, That the said proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America be and the same is hereby ratified by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado.

Resolved, That certified copies of the foregoing preamble and resolution be forwarded by the Governor of the State of Colorado to the President of the United States, the Secretary of State of the United States, the President of the Senate of the United States and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States.

Approved:

S. C. R. No. 2, by Senators Coss and Norvell.

Submitting to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado an amendment to Article Twelve (12) of the Constitution of the

State of Colorado by striking therefrom and repealing Section Thirteen (13) of said Article Twelve (12).

Be it Resolved, By the Senate of the Twenty-fifth General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House concurring:

Section 1. That there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado, for their approval or rejection, at the next general election of members of the General Assembly, the question of whether or not Article Twelve (12) of the Constitution of the State of Colorado shall be amended by striking therefrom and repealing Section Thirteen (13) thereof.

Section 2. There shall be printed on all ballots used at said general election, in the usual place for constitutional amendments, the words, "For the amendment of Article Twelve (12) of the Constitution by striking therefrom and repealing Section Thirteen (13) thereof relating to the classified civil service." and the words, "Against the amendment of Article Twelve (12) of the Constitution by striking therefrom and repealing Section Thirteen (13) thereof relating to the classified civil service," and any elector voting at said election who desires to vote for or against said amendment shall indicate his choice by placing a cross (X) opposite one or the other of said groups of words on his ballot before depositing the same in the ballot box.

Section 3. The votes cast for the adoption and the votes cast for the rejection of said amendment shall be canvassed and the result determined in the manner prescribed by the laws of the state for the canvass of votes for Representatives in Congress.

S. C. R. No. 3, by Senator Toll.

An amendment to Sections 3 and 5 of Article V of the Constitution of the State of Colorado, entitled, "Terms of Senators and Representatives."

Whereas, There is only one regular session of the General Assembly of the State of Colorado every two years, and

Whereas, Under the existing provision of the Constitution the term of a Representative is only two years, with the result that each Representative who is elected at any given election is only entitled by such election to participate in one regular session of the General Assembly, and

Whereas, the legislative procedure is so complex, and the matters requiring legislative consideration are so numerous, so involved and of such magnitude that it is difficult for any Representative to perform the duties of his office with efficiency and proper perspective during the first session after his election, and

Whereas, The elective system in force in the State of Colorado necessitates three successive steps in the election of a Rep-

representative, namely, designation by Assembly District Convention, nomination on the primary ballot, and ultimate election on the final ballot, with the consequence that a great expenditure of time on the part of each candidate for the House of Representatives is necessitated, and a substantial expenditure of money is, in most instances, both proper and necessary, and

Whereas, Many individuals who are well qualified for legislative service refrain from becoming candidates by reason of the fact that the expenditure of time and money which is required of candidates is too great to justify contesting for an election, which qualifies the successful candidate to serve in only one regular session of the General Assembly, which session may occupy a period of less than sixty days, and

Whereas, An extension of the terms of Representatives to four years would result both in greater efficiency, and in the candidacy of more persons of a desirable type, and

Whereas, The same considerations are applicable to some extent to the Senatorial term of four years, and

Whereas, It is the established policy of this State to provide for a longer term of office for Senators than for Representatives, which policy is dictated by proper considerations of stability, efficiency and precedent;

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth General Assembly, the House of Representatives concurring:

Section 1. That there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado, at the next general election for members of the General Assembly, for their approval or rejection, the following amendment to the Constitution of the State of Colorado, which, when ratified by a majority of those voting thereon, shall be valid as a part of the said Constitution, to-wit:

Section 3 of Article V of the Constitution of the State of Colorado shall be amended to read as follows:

“Section 3. Terms of Senators and Representatives.—Hereafter Representatives shall be elected for the term of four years, except as hereinafter provided, and Senators for the term of six years.”

Section 5 of Article V of the said Constitution shall be amended to read as follows:

“Section 5. Election Schedule.—Representatives and Senators shall be elected in accordance with the following schedule:

“(a) Representatives.—In 1928, and every four years thereafter, in each Representative District which has more than one Representative, one-half of that district's total number of Representatives shall be elected for the term of

four years, pursuant to nomination for such term, except that in the El Paso County District two Representatives shall be thus elected. In 1928, and every four years thereafter, the Representative from each of the following Representative Districts also shall be elected for the term of four years:

"Adams, Alamosa, Arapahoe and Elbert, Chaffee, Clear Creek, Conejos, Delta, Douglas, Eagle, Fremont, Garfield and Rio Blanco, Gilpin, Gunnison, Hinsdale and Archuleta and Mineral, Huerfano and Costilla, Jefferson, Kiowa and Bent, and Lake.

"All other Representatives elected in 1928 shall be elected for the term of two years, pursuant to nomination for such term, but in 1930, and every four years thereafter, their respective successors shall be elected for the term of four years.

"(b) Senators.—In 1928, in the First Senatorial District, one Senator shall be elected for the term of four years, pursuant to nomination for such term and two Senators shall be elected for the term of six years, pursuant to nomination for such term. In 1928, the Senator to be elected respectively in the Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Senatorial Districts shall be elected for the term of four years, and the Senator to be elected respectively in the Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, Eleventh, Thirteenth, Twenty-first, Twenty-second, Twenty-third, Twenty-fourth and Twenty-sixth Districts shall be elected for the term of six years.

"In 1930 in the First Senatorial District, one Senator shall be elected for the term of two years, pursuant to nomination for such term, and three Senators shall be elected for the term of six years, pursuant to such nomination. In 1928 the Senator to be elected respectively in the Eighteenth, Twentieth, Twenty-fifth and Twenty-seventh Districts shall be elected for the term of two years, and the Senators to be elected respectively in the Second, Third, Sixth, Tenth, Twelfth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, Sixteenth and Seventeenth Districts shall be elected for the term of six years.

"Upon the expiration of each of the above stated terms and every six years thereafter, the successors of each Senator shall be elected for six year terms.

"Nothing herein contained shall at any time prevent any reapportionment of Representative or Senatorial Districts."

Section 2. Each elector voting at said election, and desirous of voting for or against said amendment, shall deposit in the ballot box his ticket, whereon shall be printed the words, "For the Increased Legislative Terms Amendment, amending Sections Three (3) and Five (5) of Article Five (V) of the Constitution," and "Against the Increased Legislative Terms Amendment, amending Sections Three (3) and Five (5) of Article Five (V)

of the Constitution," and shall indicate his choice by placing a cross (X) opposite one or the other of said groups of words.

Moved by Senator Saunders and seconded by Senator Adams that the Senate adjourn. Motion carried by viva voce vote.

S. C. R. No. 4, by Senator Saunders.

Constitutional Convention, submitting to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado the question of holding a convention to revise, alter and amend the Constitution of the State of Colorado.

Be It Resolved, By the Senate of the Twenty-fifth General Assembly, the House of Representatives concurring:

Section 1. That there be submitted to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado at the next general election for members of the next General Assembly, for their approval or rejection, the question of holding a convention to revise, alter and amend the present Constitution of the State of Colorado, which, when ratified and approved by a majority of those voting thereon, shall authorize the General Assembly at its next session to provide for the calling of a constitutional convention, as provided in Section 1 of Article 19 of the Constitution.

Section 2. The submission of said question shall be duly advertised and certified and placed on the official ballots at the next annual election for the election of members to the General Assembly in like manner as amendments to the Constitution.

Section 3. Each elector voting at said election and desiring to vote for holding a convention to revise, alter and amend the Constitution of Colorado, shall place in the ballot box his or her ticket, whereon shall be printed the words, "For holding a convention to revise, alter and amend the Constitution of Colorado," and "Against holding a convention to revise, alter and amend the Constitution of Colorado," and shall indicate his or her choice by placing a cross opposite one or the other of said group of words.

Section 4. The votes cast for the adoption or rejection of said question shall be canvassed and the result determined by the laws of the State for the canvass of votes for Representatives in Congress.

S. C. R. No. 5, by Senator McCaslin—Submitting to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado an amendment to amend Section 19 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of Colorado entitled Legislative Department.

Be it Resolved by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth General Assembly, the House of Representatives concurring,

That there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado at the next general election for members of the General Assembly, for their approval or rejection, the following proposed amendments to Section 19 of Article V of the constitution of the State of Colorado, which, when ratified by a majority of those voting thereon, shall be valid as a part of the constitution, to-wit:

"Section 19. No act of the General Assembly shall take effect until ninety days after its passage unless in case of emergency (which shall be expressed in the act) the General Assembly shall, by vote of two-thirds of all members elected to each house, otherwise direct. No bills except the general appropriation bill for the expenses of the government only and bills introduced by unanimous consent by both houses of the General Assembly, introduced in either house of the General Assembly after the first thirty days of the session shall become a law; provided, however, a bill may be introduced and become a law after the first 30 days of the session, upon request of the Governor, by special message, calling the attention of the General Assembly to the necessity of passing a law upon a specific subject matter, but the introduction of bills shall be limited to the subject matter of the special message."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each elector voting at said election and desirous of voting for or against said amendment shall deposit in the ballot box a ticket whereon shall be printed or written the words "For the Amendment to Section 19 of Article V of the Constitution, fixing the period for introducing bills in the General Assembly," and the words "Against the Amendment to Section 19 of Article V of the Constitution, fixing the period for introducing bills in the General Assembly," and shall indicate his approval or disapproval by placing a cross (X) opposite one or the other of said groups of words on his ballot; and that the votes cast for the adoption or rejection of said amendment shall be canvassed and the result determined in the manner prescribed by the laws of the state for the canvass of votes for representatives in Congress.

S. C. R. No. 6, by Senators Toll, Knauss and Fairfield.

Be It Resolved, By the Senate of the Twenty-fifth General Assembly, the House of Representatives concurring:

Section 1. That there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado, for their approval or rejection, at the next general election for members of the general assembly, the following amendment to the Constitution of the State of Colorado, which, when ratified by a majority of those voting thereon, shall be valid as a part of said Constitution, to-wit:

Section 30 of Article V of the Constitution of the State of Colorado shall be amended so as to read as follows:

"Section 30. The salaries and emoluments of all elective and appointive officers of the State shall be fixed by legislative enactment; provided, that the salaries of the officers heretofore fixed by the Constitution shall continue in force until otherwise provided for by legislative enactment.

"No law shall extend the term of any public officer, or increase or diminish his salary or emoluments, as fixed by legislative enactment, after his election or appointment."

Section 2. Each elector voting at said election, and desirous of voting for or against said amendment, shall deposit in the ballot box a ticket whereon shall be printed the words: "For the amendment to Section 30 of Article V Concerning Public Officers," and "Against the amendment to Section 30 of Article V Concerning Public Officers," and shall indicate his choice by placing a cross (X) opposite one or the other of said groups of words.

Section 3. The votes cast for the adoption and the votes cast for the rejection of said amendment shall be canvassed and the results determined in the manner provided by the laws of the State of Colorado for the canvass of votes for representatives in Congress.

S. C. R. No. 7, by Senators Toll and Knauss—Submitting to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado an amendment to Section Two (2) of Article Twenty (XX) of the Constitution of the State of Colorado.

Be It Resolved, By the Senate of the Twenty-fifth General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring therein:

Section 1. That there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado, for their approval or rejection, at the next general election of members of the General Assembly, the following Amendment to the Constitution of the State of Colorado, which, when ratified by a majority of those voting thereon, shall become a part of said Constitution, to-wit:

Section two (2) of Article Twenty (XX) of the Constitution of the State of Colorado shall be amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. The officers of the City and County of Denver shall be such as by appointment or election may be provided for by the charter; and the jurisdiction, term of office, duties and qualifications of all such officers shall be such as in the charter may be provided; but every charter shall designate the officers who shall, respectively, perform the acts and duties required of county officers to be done by the constitution or by the general law, as far as applicable."

Section 2. Each elector voting at said election who desires to vote for or against said amendment shall deposit in the ballot box his ticket, whereon shall be printed the words:

"For the amendment of Section Two (2) of Article Twenty (XX) of the Constitution relating to officers of the City and County of Denver,"

and the words:

"Against the amendment of Section Two (2) of Article Twenty (XX) of the Constitution relating to officers of the City and County of Denver";

and shall indicate his approval or disapproval of said amendment by placing a cross (X) opposite one or the other of said groups of words on his ballot.

Section 3. The votes cast for the adoption and the votes cast for the rejection of said amendment shall be canvassed and the result determined in the manner prescribed by the laws of the State for the canvass of votes for Representatives in Congress.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried the Senate adjourned until 10 o'clock Friday morning, January 23, 1925.

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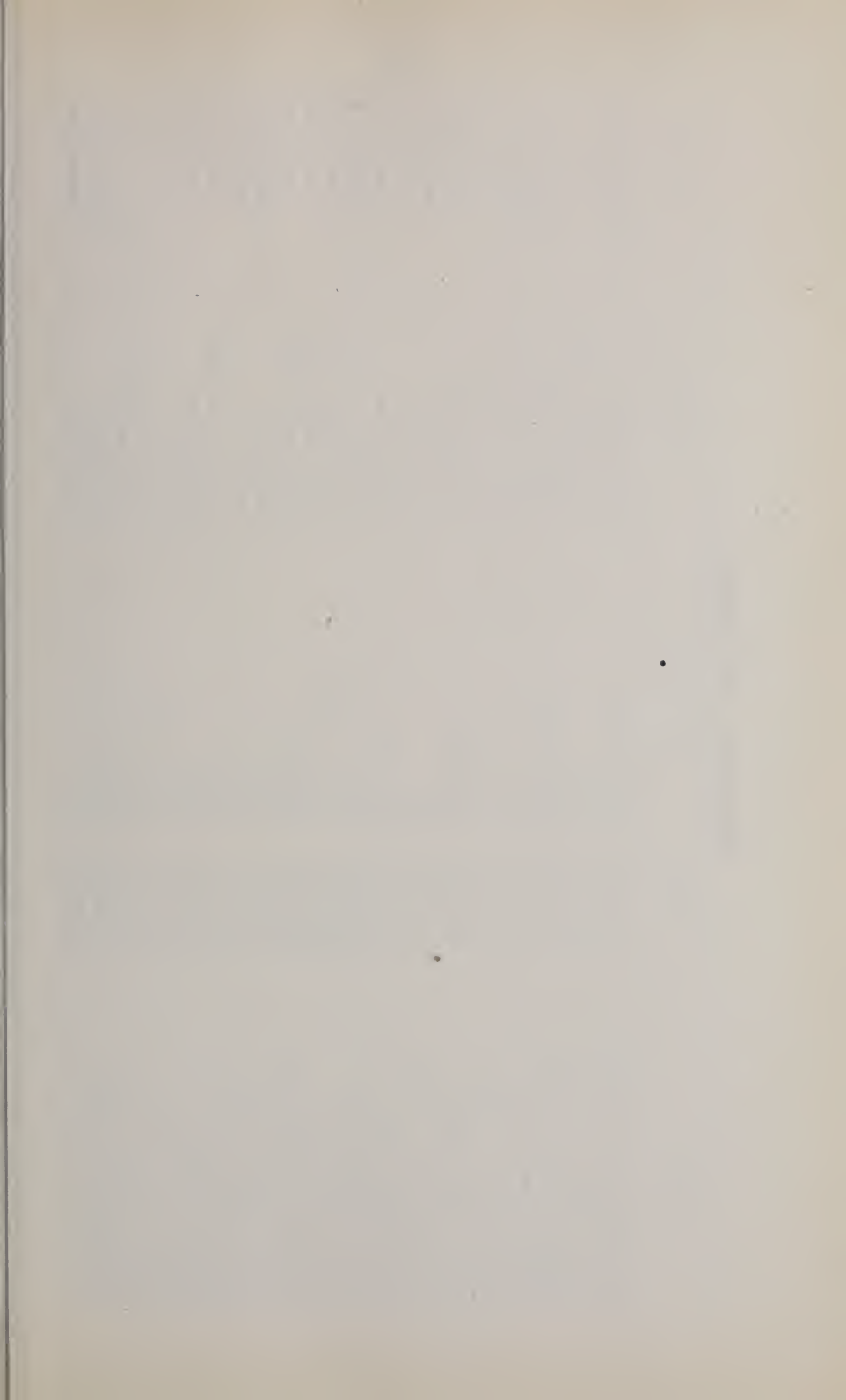
