

Whereas, The payment of Old Age Pensions and the amount thereof have been dependent in many instances solely upon the discretion of the administrative officers of the Old Age Pension fund, with the result that large surpluses are being held in the Old Age Pension funds by many counties; and,

Whereas, No official audit is available to determine the exact amounts paid into Old Age Pension funds from all sources, including counties and municipal sources;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, By the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth General Assembly, the Senate concurring herein;

SECTION 1. That a committee of five, to be composed of three members of the House of Representatives and two members of the Senate, be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate, respectively, charged with the duty of making a thorough, complete and detailed investigation of the administration of Old Age Pension funds by the various counties of the state to determine what amendments to the present Old Age Pension Act are necessary, both from the standpoint of administration and moneys required, to effectively carry out an Old Age Pension system.

SECTION 2. That said committee, in connection with its said investigation, shall have power and authority to hold hearings, to summon witnesses, to take testimony under oath to be administered by the chairman or any member of said committee, to assemble such records and documents as may in said committee's judgment be deemed necessary, by subpoena duces tecum or otherwise, with the same power and authority as courts of record in the hearing of causes.

SECTION 3. That said committee shall have further power to employ a reporter to take and transcribe testimony given at such hearings, to employ the Sergeant-at-Arms of the House of Representatives to enforce all orders of said committee, and to punish for contempt for violation of its said orders.

SECTION 4. That the actual and necessary expenses of conducting the investigation herein authorized shall be paid out of the miscellaneous expense fund of this General Assembly.






