

*Whereas*, Article II of chapter 130 of the 1935 Colorado Statutes annotated was enacted in 1903 and the maximum prices for printing and stationery set forth in section 24 of said chapter 130 were likewise fixed in 1903; and

*Whereas*, Section 38 of chapter 3 of the 1935 Colorado Statutes annotated attempted to abolish the office of the Commissioner of Public Printing; and

*Whereas*, The courts have held section 28 of said chapter inconsistent with section 38 of said chapter, and most of the printing laws of this state and the maximum prices fixed by the statute are obsolete and inure to the detriment of the state and cause contracts for stationery and printing to be let on unreasonable and unbusinesslike terms at a much greater cost to the state than would be the case if said printing laws were properly drawn and contracts for printing were properly and economically let; and

*Whereas*, An investigation would properly disclose the deplorable conditions which exist with respect to the receiving of bids and the letting of contracts for stationery and printing by the state; now therefore,

*Be It Resolved, by the Senate of the Thirty-first General Assembly:*

1. That a committee of five be appointed by the President of the Senate charged with the duty of making a thorough and detailed investigation of the printing laws of this state and of the office of the commissioner of Public Printing and the manner in which the printing laws are enforced by said Commissioner and the methods by which contracts are let for printing by said Commissioner and other state officers and report its findings to the Senate.

2. That said committee in connection with its said investigation shall have power and authority to hold hearings, to summon witnesses, to take testimony under oath to be administered by the chairman or any member of said committee, to assemble such records and documents as may in said committee's judgment be deemed necessary, by subpoenas duces tecum or otherwise, with the same power and authority as courts of record in hearing causes.

3. That said committee shall have further power to employ a reporter to take and transcribe the testimony given at such hearings, to employ the Sergeant-at-Arms of the Senate to enforce all orders of said committee, and to punish for contempt for violation of its said orders.

4. That the copies of this resolution be delivered by the Sergeant-at-Arms to each member of the Executive Committee of the state of Colorado.

5. That the actual necessary expenses of conducting the investigation herein authorized shall be paid out of the miscellaneous expense fund of the General Assembly, but such expense shall not exceed one thousands dollars.

SECTION 1. That there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state of Colorado, at the next general election for members of the General Assembly, for their approval or rejection, the following amendment to the Constitution of the state of Colorado, which when ratified by a majority of those voting thereon, shall be valid as a part of the Constitution of the state of Colorado, to-wit:

Section 49 of article V, of the Constitution of the state of Colorado, is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 49. Representatives shall be divided among the counties of the state in the following manner: Each county in the state one representative, and two representatives to be elected from the state at large.”

SECTION 2. Each elector voting at said election and desirous of voting for or against said amendment, shall deposit in the ballot box a ballot whereon shall be printed the words "For the amendment of section 49, of article V, of the Constitution of the state of Colorado, concerning state Representatives" and the words "Against the amendment of section 49, of article V, of the Constitution of the state of Colorado, concerning state Representatives," and shall indicate his choice by placing a cross (X) opposite one or the other said group of words.

SECTION 3. The votes cast for the adoption or the rejection of said amendment shall be canvassed, and the result determined, in the manner provided by the laws of the state of Colorado for the canvassing of votes for Representatives in Congress.

## House Joint Resolutions

*Whereas*, The Congress of the United States of America has imposed a tax upon all sales of gasoline; and,

*Whereas*, Such added tax levied by the United States of America constitutes a disproportionate part of the burden of taxation upon the consumers of gasoline and the users of motor vehicles, now, therefore,

*Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first General Assembly of the state of Colorado, the Senate concurring therein*, That we do hereby protest against the levy of a tax upon the sale of gasoline by the United States of America and it is hereby respectfully requested that the Congress of the United States of America enact with all convenient speed such legislation as may be necessary to abolish such tax and to surrender to the several states the exclusive right and privilege, the power to levy and collect such taxes; and,

*Be It Further Resolved*, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States of America, the Clerk of the House of Representatives, the Secretary of the United States Senate and to each member of Congress elected from the state of Colorado, and that the latter be urged to use their best efforts to procure the enactment of such legislation as will accomplish the purpose of this resolution.

*Whereas*, the parking facilities on the State Capitol grounds for members of the Thirty-first General Assembly have not been adequate to meet the requirements and needs of said members, and
