SIR: I have the honor to submit herewith the biennial report of this department for the fiscal years ending November 30, 1884.

I have made the report generally in tabulated form, for the purpose of presenting a clear and concise statement of the funds of the State, of its resources and of the public expenditures during the past two years; also an estimate of the probable receipts and expenditures for the two fiscal years ending November 30, 1886, together with such recommendations as are deemed for the best interests of the public service.

CONDITION OF THE TREASURY.

The balance in the treasury at the close of the last fiscal term, November 30, 1882, was \$188,616.65. There was received from all sources during the two years ending November 30, 1884, the sum of \$1,483,468.00, which, added to the balance at close of last biennial term, makes a total of \$1,672,084.65 to be accounted for. The total disbursements from the treasury for this period were \$1,158,949.04, leaving a balance at the close of business November 30, 1884, of \$513,135.61. Of this amount now in the treasury, a detailed statement may be found in Exhibit No. 3.

Exhibits Nos. 1 and 2 show a general statement of receipts and disbursements for the two fiscal years just closed.

STATE DEBT.

The State debt consists of outstanding warrants drawn against the different funds, bearing six per cent. interest; certificates of indebtedness issued in pursuance of Sec. 1382 of Revised Statutes, bearing eight per cent. interest; and loco weed certificates issued in pursuance of Sec. 2190 of Revised Statutes.

In addition to the foregoing there are claims on file in this office against the State for expenses incurred for the support of lunatic paupers to the amount of \$4,851.39. For a detailed statement of the public debt I refer you to Exhibit No. 4.

REVENUE TO MEET DEBT.

The amount of revenue due for general purposes to meet the present indebtedness, including the tax levied for 1884, is \$547,904.21, of this amount not more than eighty-five per cent. will be collected, which leaves

With proper legislation, the balances to the credit of the following funds could be transferred to the General

Fund, and thus assist in reducing the State debt; they are the Colorado Land and Mineral Association, Conscience, Medical Examination, Sales of Laws and Code, and Secretary of State Fees, making a total of \$23,448.82.

BOUNTIES.

One cause of our large debt is due to excessive amounts paid for bounties on hawks, wolves, skunks, mountain lions and loco weed, and I respectfully call your attention to Exhibit No. 11, showing in detail the amounts thus paid. The laws now in force regarding the payment of State revenue for bounties, should occupy the careful consideration of our Legislature.

During the past two years the sum of \$71,934.96 was expended for bounties, and for the last named, loco weed, \$30,728.21. According to reports now on file with the State Treasurer, there will be no revenue derived for several years for State purposes from the counties of Costilla, Custer, Huerfano and Saguache, and very little if any from El Paso and Las Animas, on account of the enormous outlay for the destruction of this weed; notwithstanding this great expenditure for its extermination, there seems to be no perceptible decrease in its growth. The expenditure during the past two years far exceeds the value of all stock which has been killed by this weed since Colorado became a State. If the present laws continue in force, it will necessitate legislative action to enable counties to pay the increasing bounties, for the counties themselves will be unable to meet the heavy demands made on the General Fund of the State.

It is somewhat doubtful whether the scalps and heads of wolves and hawks upon which bounties have been paid by the State were all obtained within the limits of Colorado. The following letter received at this office from a prominent fur dealer of St. Paul, Minn., casts at least a shade of suspicion upon the honesty of some of those who claim bounties upon scalps:

LA JUNTA, COLORADO, Oct. 10, 1884.

To Fur Dealers, St. Paul, Minn.:

If when you buy fur, or the following named animals' hides, you would remove their *ears* (with hide enough to hold them together) I will pay you for each pair respectively, 25 cts., 50 cts. and \$1.00 for same; kiotes, wolves and mountain lions. Send me here by express; it's all legitimate; I sell to others.

The signature to the above is fictitious, but the signer is well known.

I think this is a subject of great importance and worthy of serious consideration, and that the present financial condition of the State demands the repeal of all bounty laws.

ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURES.

Owing to a constitutional provision, the State authorities are unable to levy sufficient tax to meet the current expense of the government. Within the past six years our population and expenses have more than doubled. The capacity of our State institutions was insufficient to meet the demands, and their enlargement became a necessity. This caused in the past, generous appropriations, by our General Assemblies, largely in excess of the revenue derived, and as a result assisted in placing upon us a large debt.

LUNATIC PAUPERS.

I would respectfully recommend the repeal of that section of the act whereby the State becomes responsible for expenses incurred in the maintenance and transportation of lunatic paupers previous to their admission to the asylum. The bills usually rendered by counties for the transportation and keeping of this unfortunate class are exorbitant, and in disbursing the appropriation heretofore made for their payment, I have used great care, allowing only actual expenses. I am of the opinion that the expense incurred previous to their admission to the asylum properly belongs to the county, the same as for criminal classes.

STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.

This Board has met regularly as required by law, but no equitable adjustment of the assessment could be made. The cause of this is that the Board was in possession of less than one-half of the abstracts of assessment, up to the time the law required its adjournment. The revenue law provides a time when assessors shall make their returns to County Clerks; this part, however, is seldom complied with, and the County Clerks have unlimited time to make returns to the Auditor. In a number of instances abstracts have been received as late as November, and by reason of such delay this department is much embarrassed in making up returns, and reporting taxes charged by the State to the respective counties. Hence, it will necessitate the amending of the revenue law, by extending the time of the Board to equalize, or require a more vigorous prosecution of the work by county officials, before a just and equitable equalization of the assessment can be made.

AUDITING ACCOUNTS.

It was contemplated by the Constitutional Convention when fixing the duties of officers, that the Auditor of State should be the official on whom devolves the duties of auditing all bills that should be contracted or incurred by each and every department of the State Government. The fact is, that the General Assembly has overlooked this entirely in the passage of bills necessitating the expenditure of money. This function of the office is now exercised in every department of the government, and at times by outside individuals. I would recommend that all contracts executed on behalf of the State, and all bills incurred for expenses of every description be audited by this department before being paid.

SURPLUS CASH IN TREASURY AND UNEXPENDED BALANCES.

I would recommend the passage of a law directing the Auditor and Treasurer to credit to the General Fund all cash received, other than that set aside by law for a special purpose, and to charge back to the General Fund all unexpended balances at the close of the fiscal term.

DELINQUENT EX-COUNTY TREASURERS.

There is due from the Ex-County Treasurers of the following counties, on account of State Revenue collected and not remitted, as follows :

I have repeatedly called the attention of the Commissioners of these counties to the delinquencies* shown, but am unable to report what action has been taken.

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT.

By an act of the Fourth General Assembly an Insurance Department was established and charged with the execution of all laws relating to insurance, the same being placed under the supervision of the Auditor of State. In assuming the duties of this office, I have endeavored to do justice to all concerned. I began the official business by calling on all companies transacting business in the State, requesting a compliance with the law. A quick and willing response was given in nearly every instance, and I have found invariably a willingness on the part of companies to conform to the requirements of our insurance laws. Bogus and wild-cat insurance which had been carried on extensively throughout the State has been stopped. At present the insurance business of the State is on a safe basis.

There are sections of the law which need amending, viz: The law relating to mutual assessment or co-operative companies is not fully expressed, either relating to the admission of foreign companies, or the organizing of such companies within the State, and that portion relating to companies established in this State or Territory previous to this enactment; and also its intent relating to benevolent societies should be more definite, they not being held amenable under nor governed by these laws.

The number of companies authorized by this department to transact business in the State is one hundred and five, for which twenty-four hundred and fifty agent's certi-

cates have been issued. The revenue derived from the department during the eighteen months ending November 30, 1884, has been \$26,720.03. The expenses incurred for printing of blanks, books, reports, for office furniture and salaries amount to \$13,694.48, leaving a balance of \$13,025.55, which has been transferred to the Public School Income Fund, in accordance with the law. Therefore, the department while protecting the insured and insurer, has become a source of revenue to the State.
