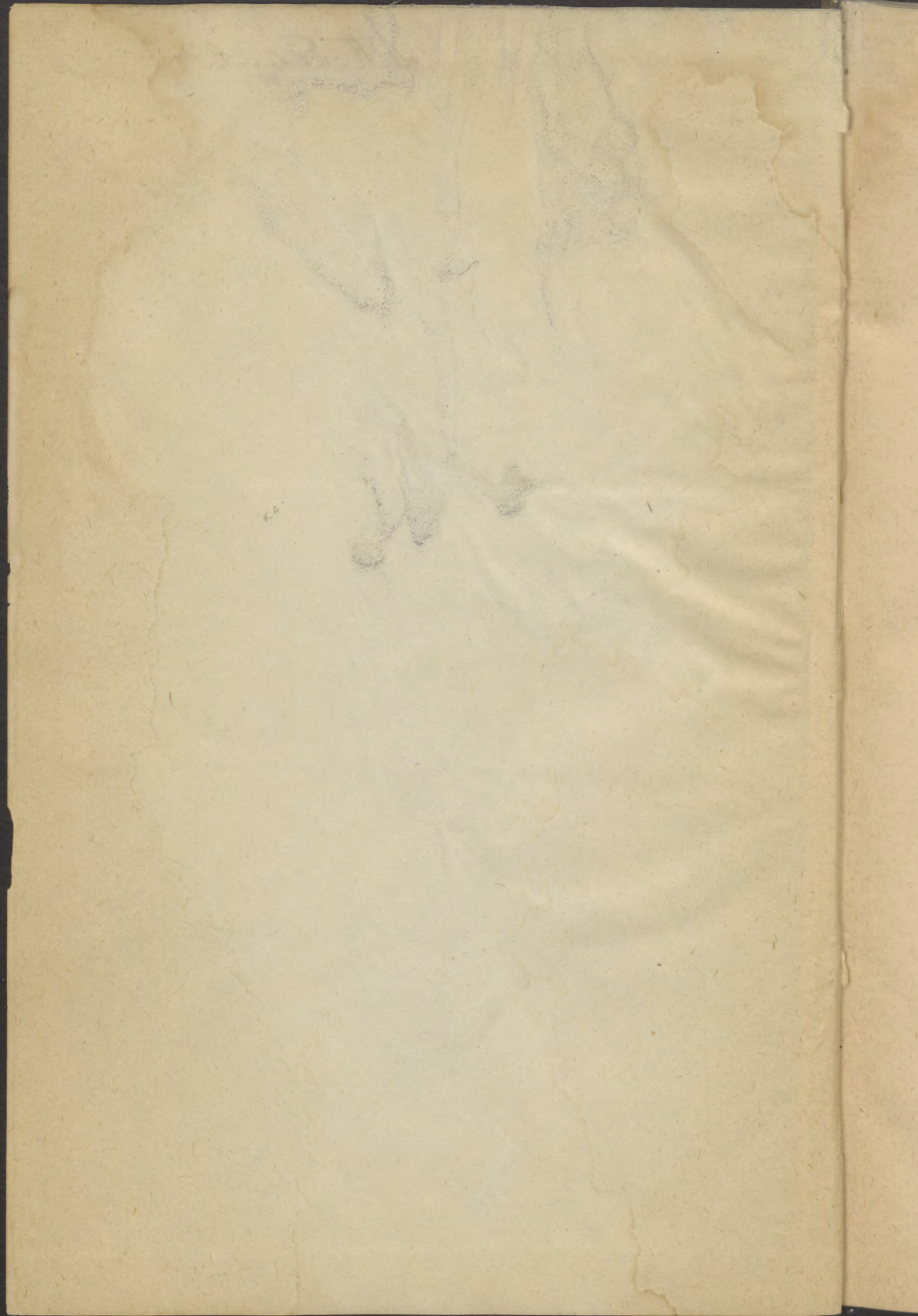

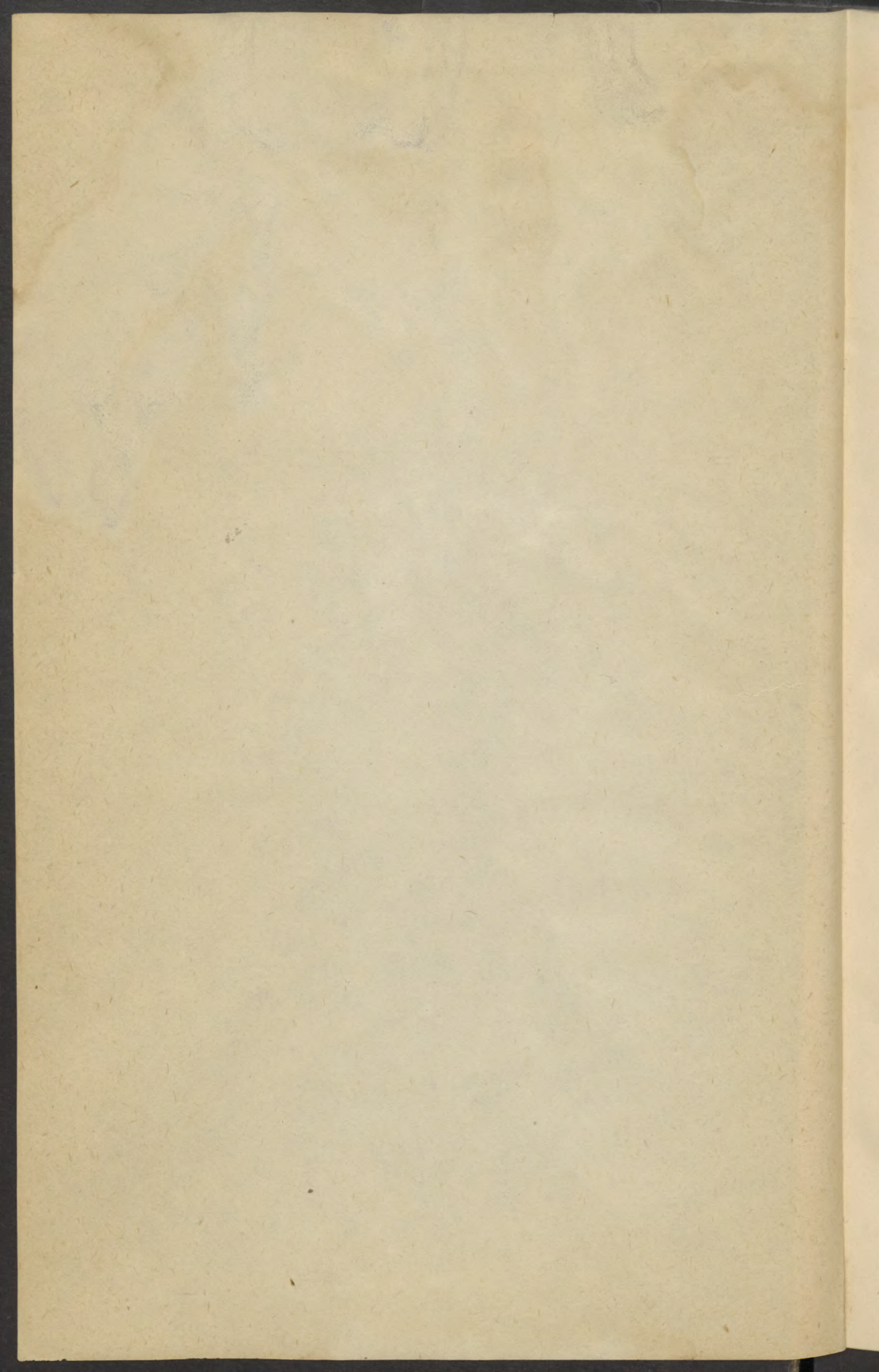

Governor:

SIR: I have the honor to herewith submit my biennial report, commencing December 1, 1884, and ending at close of business November 30, 1886, in which you will find the operations of this department in detail, as by law directed.

CONDITION OF THE TREASURY.

The balance in the treasury at the close of the last fiscal term, November 30, 1884, in cash and securities was \$513,135.61; there was received from all sources during the two years ending November 30, 1886, the sum of \$1,837,395.24, making a total of \$2,350,530.85. The total disbursements from the treasury for this period were \$1,515,951.80, leaving a balance at the close of business, November 30, 1886, in cash and securities of \$834,579.05.

THE STATE DEBT.

The State debt consists of outstanding warrants, drawn against appropriations made from the General Fund, bearing six per cent. interest; certificates of indebtedness, issued in pursuance of an act of the Fifth General Assembly, six per cent. interest, and loco weed certificates unredeemed, as follows:

In consideration of the liabilities above mentioned, our appropriations for real estate, buildings, etc., now held by the State, show the liabilities are small. I have departed from the usual course of publishing the liabilities, and presented a statement herewith, showing the amounts appropriated for each of the State institutions, as follows:

THE STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.

Have met regularly at the time provided by statute, but as usual with preceding boards, did not accomplish much. I find that all my predecessors since 1872 have complained in their reports of the law, as it now stands.

The revenue law provides a time at which county assessors shall make return of the assessment book or roll, but

the clerk is given *unlimited* time in which to make his return to the Auditor. If the General Assembly will *fix a time* at which the county clerk shall send the proper abstracts to the Auditor, it will greatly facilitate the operations of this department, and tend to produce a just representation of values between the different counties of the State.

TAXATION OF MINES.

The question of taxing the mining industry being one of the most important financial matters attracting the attention of our people, I have, with some delicacy, ventured the opinion that if all our mines which have obtained or applied for Government patents were valued at \$500, the revenue of the State would be increased to a large extent. I find on file in the United States Surveyor General's office 11,505 patents or applications, which, at \$500 per patent, would increase the assessed valuation \$5,752,500.

EXCESS VOUCHERS.

The last General Assembly passed resolutions increasing the pay of its employés. The case was submitted to the Supreme court, and by them declared to be illegal. Deductions were then made, to conform with statutes rates, which leaves each of the employés with what is termed an excess voucher. The excess being \$17,702, which the Sixth General Assembly will be asked to appropriate.

DELINQUENT EX-COUNTY TREASURERS.

There is due from the ex-county treasurers of the following counties, on account of State revenue collected and not remitted, as follows:

The attention of the county commissioners have frequently been called to these delinquencies, but I am unable to report what action has been taken.

THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT.

This department is not only self-sustaining, but a source of considerable revenue to the State, and also affords the public protection from worthless or wild-cat companies. The revenue derived during the two years ending November 30, 1886, \$39,935.96. The expenses incurred for printing, blanks, books and salaries amount to \$19,425.20, leaving a balance of \$20,510.76; of this amount \$17,821.51 has been transferred to the General Fund, and the balance, \$2,689.25, is in the hands of the department. There are 95 fire companies, 16 life companies, 12 co-operative companies, 11 fidelity, casualty and accident companies, 1 mutual live stock company and 1 mutual hail company, doing business in this State.

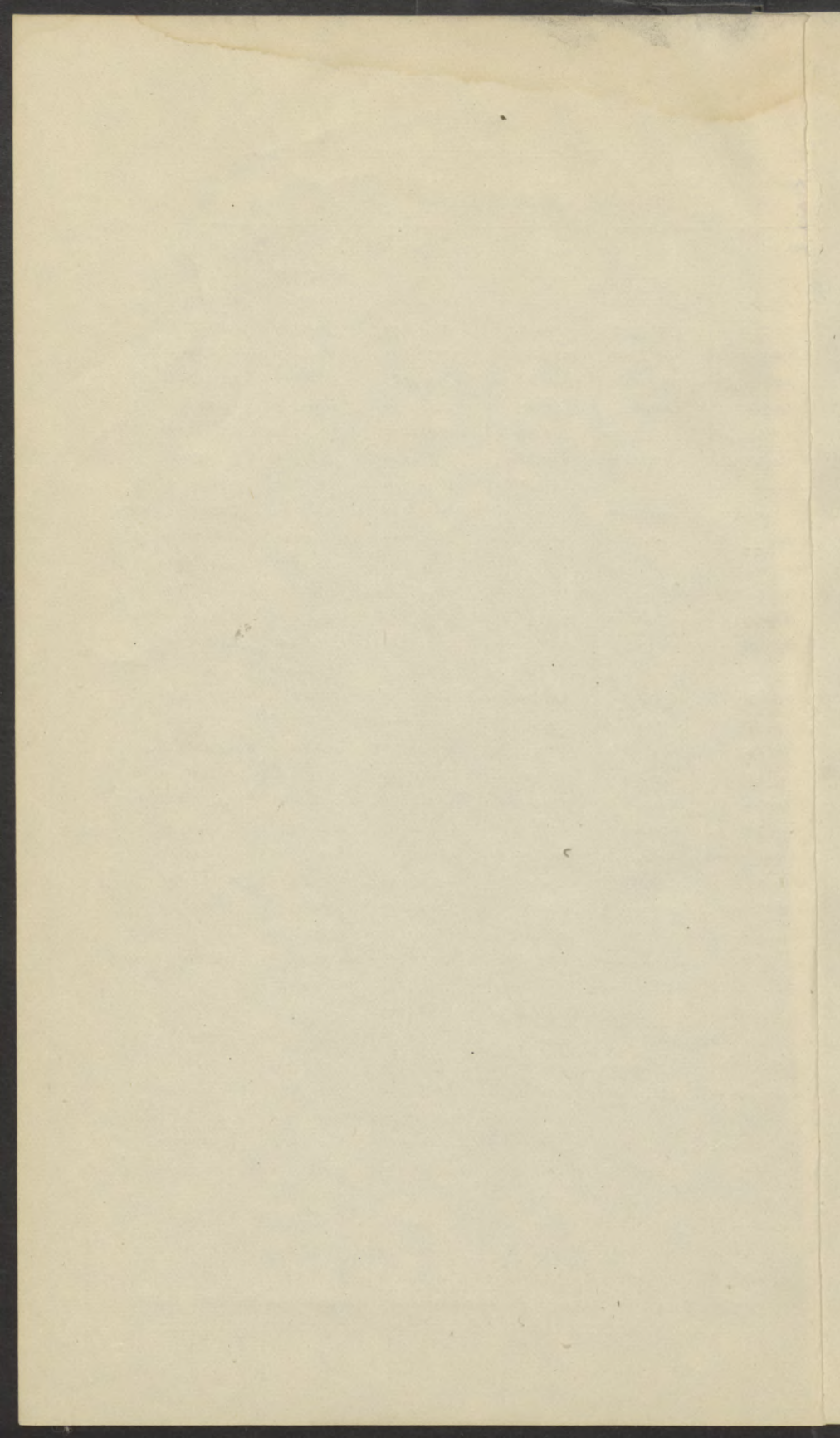

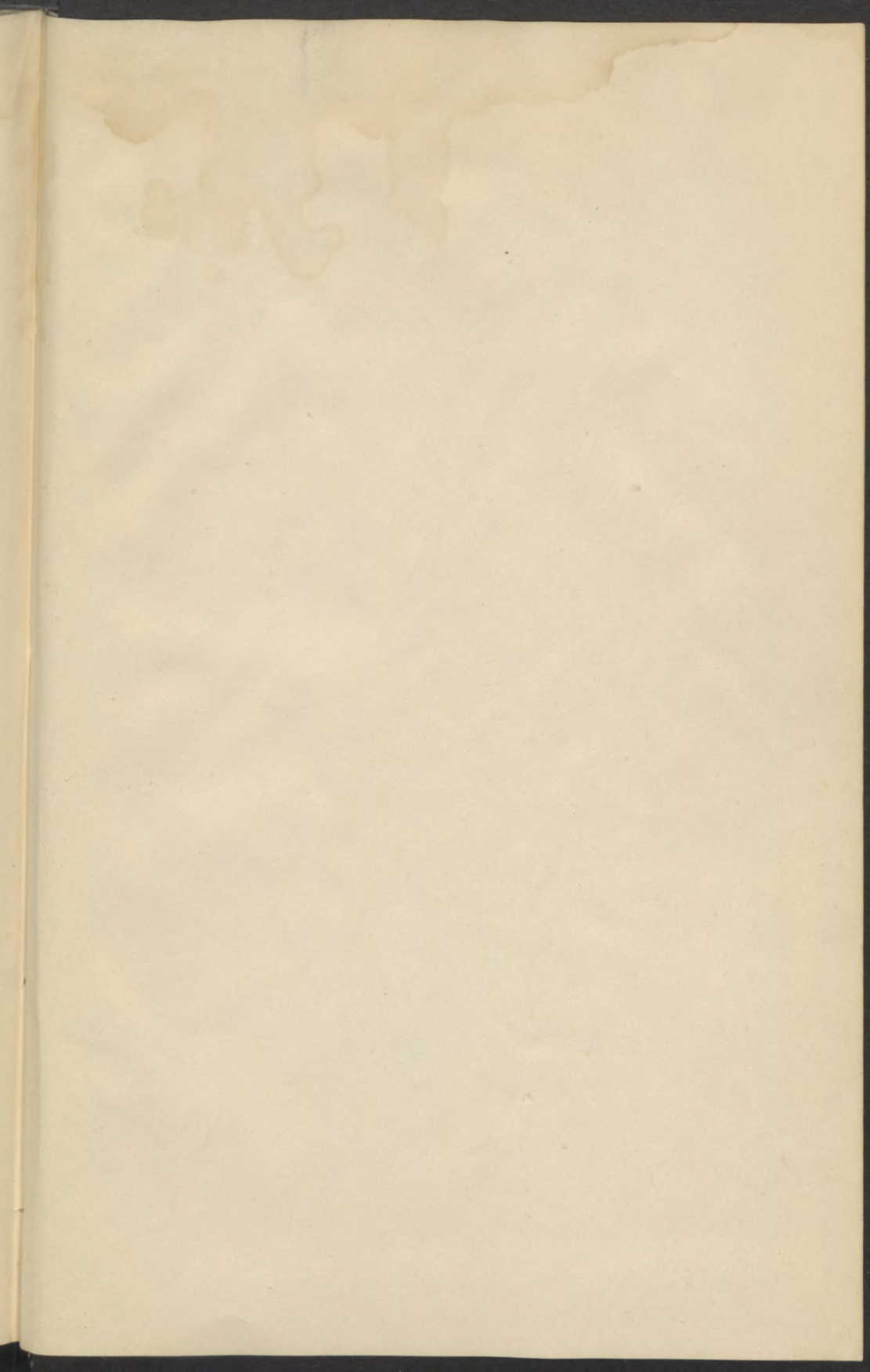
