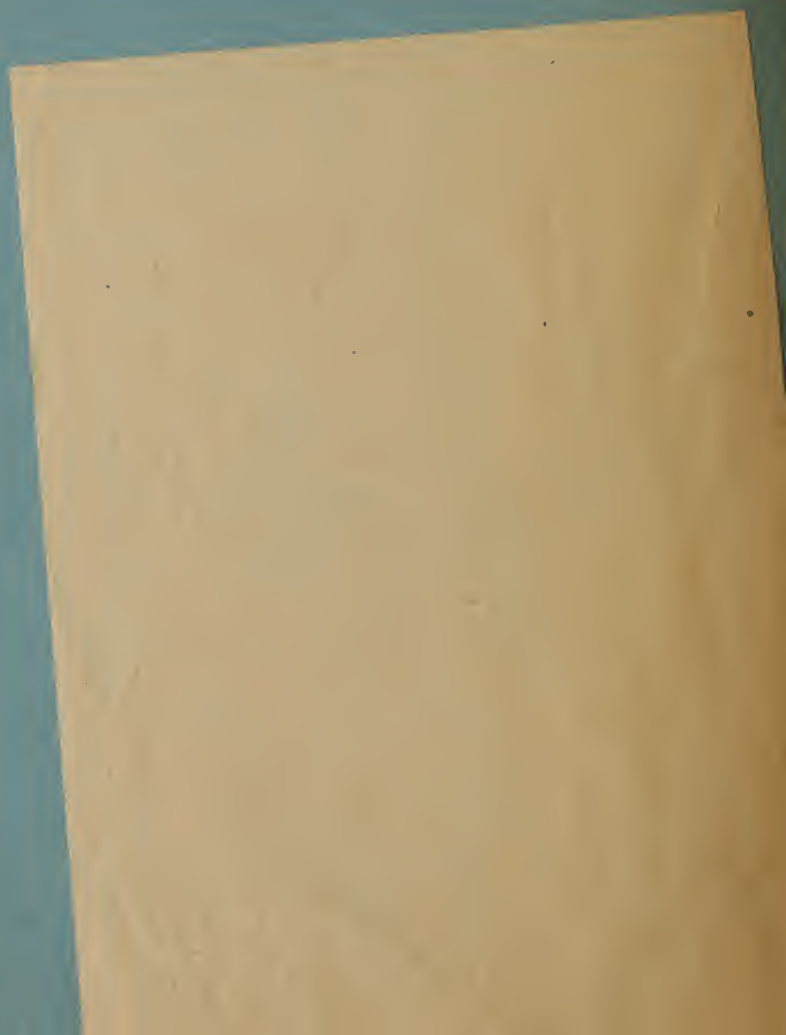

The apparent increase in the State debt is owing to the payment of accrued interest on outstanding warrants and bounties paid, together with the natural increase of the expense of the State Government by the creation of new departments.

The total amount of the appropriation made by the Seventh General Assembly is \$1,755,440.92; of this amount \$532,155.21 was considered unavailable, owing

to the decision of the Supreme Court that no more warrants could be drawn on appropriations than would be the probable income of revenue to meet the same, except in cases of casual deficiencies.

Heretofore the General Assemblies have made all appropriations for calendar years instead of fiscal years. Our Supreme Court suggests that it would be better to make all appropriations for fiscal years; therefore, I make the two estimates.

Notwithstanding the fact that all my predecessors, including the Territorial Auditors, have called attention to the subject, I wish to present for your Excellency's notice the injustice of our present revenue laws. A glance at the following comparison of valuations will show inequalities which would be impossible under just revenue laws.

The above statement tells its own story.

As a committee from the State Board of Equalization, I visited different counties to examine the assessment rolls,

and although only a limited period of time was at my disposal, such glaring inconsistencies and startling inequalities were apparent as to call imperatively for the most immediate legislation and comprehensive changes in the present revenue system.

A striking illustration of some of the above mentioned discrepancies will be found in the fact that although the individual deposits at the banks of Arapahoe county were in round numbers \$18,000,000.00, the total amount assessed as moneys and credits to individuals, banks, corporations and companies, was only \$808,958.00.

I would respectfully suggest that property, both real and personal, be made assessable and subject to taxation on January first, instead of on May first; this would allow the Assessors ample time in which to complete their assessments and send in their abstracts in time to be considered by the State Board of Equalization.

Under the existing laws, there is no penalty for a failure on the part of the County Assessors to file a copy of their abstracts of assessment with the State Auditor. I would suggest the passage of a law compelling the County Commissioners of each County to retain twenty-five per centum of the salary of the assessor until said assessor shall produce a certificate from the State Auditor, acknowledging the receipt of the abstract of assessment for his county.

This law should apply with equal force to County Clerks, in making their semi-annual revenue statements.

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT.

It is only necessary, in calling your Excellency's attention to this comparatively new department of our State Government, to show the great percentage of increase in the net earnings over those of the preceding term:

After paying all office expenses, including rent, salaries, stationery, printing, etc., we have transferred to the General Revenue Fund, during the past two years, \$48,120.36, a net increase of nearly 90 per cent.
