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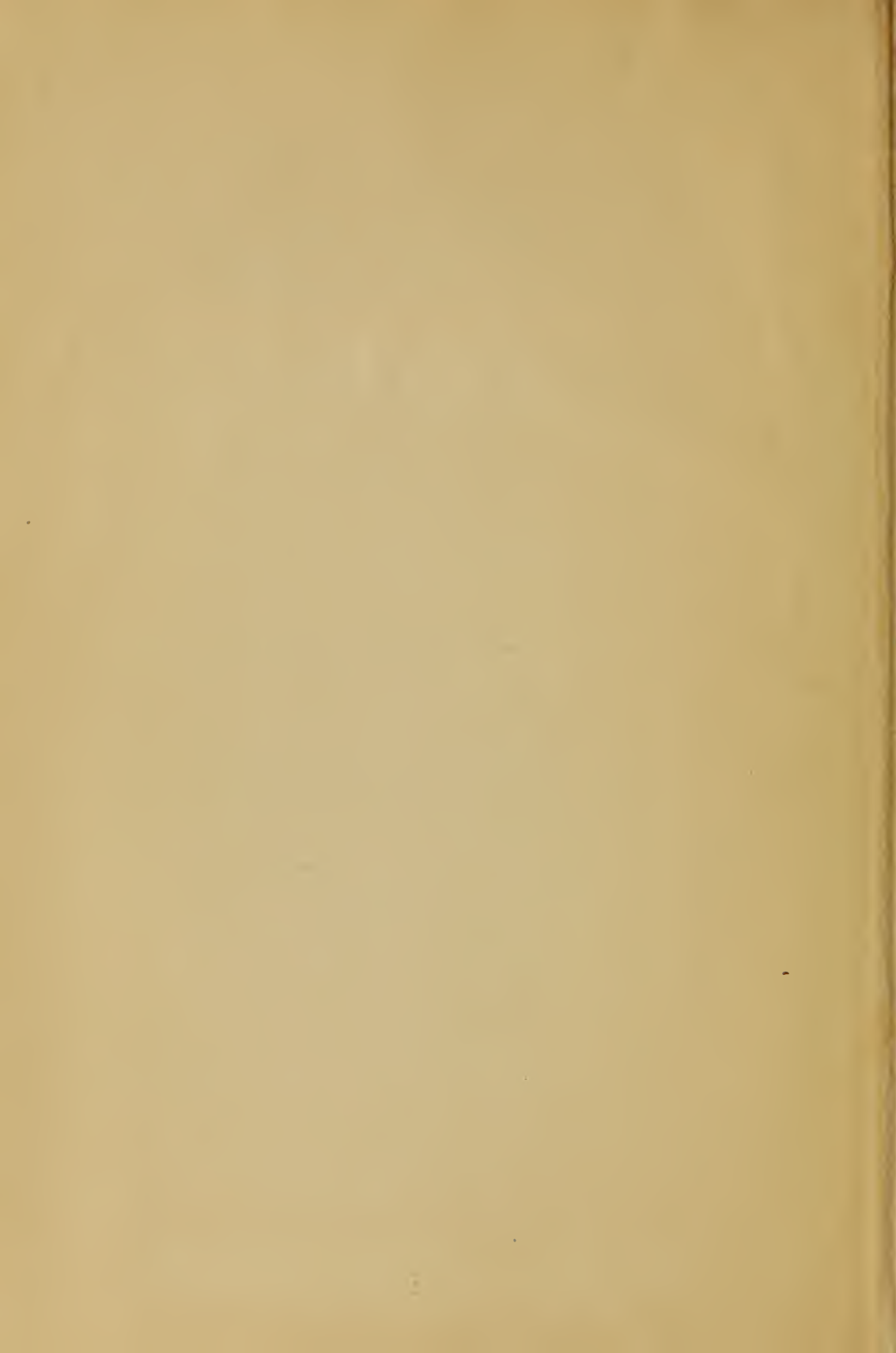

The one-half mill tax levied by the Eighth General Assembly, to pay the Ute war debt, is sufficient to cover both the outstanding Ute war debt warrants of \$17,185.06, and the outstanding Ute war certificates of indebtedness of \$8,432.94.



In the foregoing statement of debt, I have included two items never given by any previous Auditor, viz.:

In making an estimate of General Revenue Fund receipts for the fiscal years 1893 and 1894, I assume that the present plan followed by county assessors of assessing at about one-third value, will be continued during the coming two years. The plan, however, should not be continued, and I will allude to the subject later.

#### RECALCITRANT COUNTIES.

Nine of the fifty-five counties in Colorado refused to make the tax levy of 1891, as levied by the State Board of Equalization and certified to the county clerks by the Auditor of State. The reason of this action, as stated by county officials, is that part of the levy was unconstitutional. But in order to show that opinions may differ, even among as learned lawyers as county attorneys, I list these counties, with statement of action taken by each.

*Boulder County*—Deducted Ute war debt levy, \$2,456.22, and capitol building bonds interest levy, \$654.99, from general revenue levy.

*Chaffee County*—Refused to make Ute war debt levy, \$1,396.82, and capitol building bonds interest levy, \$372.48.

*Douglas County*—Deducted Ute war debt levy, \$1,027.13, and capitol building bonds interest levy, \$273.90, and \$0.01 from general revenue levy.

*Eagle County*—Refused to make Ute war debt levy, \$659.80, and capitol building bonds interest levy, \$175.95.

*Fremont County*—Refused to make Ute war debt levy, \$1,685.13, and capitol building bonds interest levy, \$449.37.

*Garfield County*—Refused to make Ute war debt levy, \$1,358.78, and capitol building bonds interest levy, \$362.34.

*Lake County*—Refused to make capitol building bonds interest levy, \$2,242.64.

*Larimer County*—Refused to make Ute war debt levy, \$2,176.11, and capitol building bonds interest levy, \$580.30.

*Weld County*—Refused to make Ute war debt levy, \$4,356.21, and deducted capitol building bonds interest levy, \$1,161.66, from the general revenue levy.

In December, 1891, I reported this delinquency to the Attorney General, with request that he institute suit to compel these counties to collect the tax levy as made by the State Board of Equalization; the Attorney General's report will, doubtless, show how far advanced the suit now is.

#### STOCK INDEMNITIES.

The State Veterinary Surgeon has issued certificates of indemnity for stock ordered killed by him. Of this issue, about fifteen hundred dollars' worth is on file in the Auditor's office; certificates of indebtedness are outstanding to the amount of sixteen hundred and four and thirty-one one-hundredths (\$1,604.31) dollars, which have been issued in payment of the indemnity certificates issued by the State Veterinary Surgeon. Some provision should be made to pay both the certificates of indebtedness and the indemnity certificates of the State Veterinary Surgeon; and the further issuance of this paper ought to be stopped.

#### SCALP BOUNTIES.

During the fiscal years of 1891-92, the State has paid for scalp bounties \$52,511.00, being an increase of 112 per cent. over the amount expended for this purpose in the immediately preceding fiscal period. Tree premiums have cost \$2,762.92, and loco weed certificates \$11,164.12, making a total of \$66,438.04 paid from the general revenue fund of the State, by the county treasurers, without an appropriation and without the Auditor's warrant. At my suggestion, the question of the constitutionality of this law was made the only issue in the suit of the Mute and Blind Institute, which was taken to the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court promptly declared unconstitutional the manner of paying scalp bounties, tree premiums, and loco weed certificates. In consequence of this decision, about thirty-five thousand (\$35,000) dollars per annum will be saved to the general revenue fund.

## SEMI-ANNUAL STATEMENTS.

The Honorable Darwin P. Kingsley, in his biennial report, says: "Under existing law, the Auditor is much embarrassed in his work by carelessness or inefficiency on the part of certain county clerks. Semi-annual statements are sent in so full of gross carelessness that it has now come to be almost impossible to make the records of this office tally with the records in the offices of the several counties."

My predecessor has spoken mildly; he has stated the case in a most conservative manner, because gross carelessness and inefficiency are both stamped indelibly upon many of these semi-annual statements. I have been unable to find any law conferring upon the Auditor the authority to compel county clerks to correct erroneous statements, and must appeal to the Legislature for a remedy. Some clerks, when an error is pointed out, make haste to correct it and write a very kind letter thanking the Auditor for calling attention to the matter; others return their statements, saying they know their statements are correct, "because they made them out."

Errors frequently begin with such county treasurers as are unable to apportion the State tax correctly between the eleven State funds. Sometimes the county commissioners discover these errors, and then the treasurer reports to the county clerk his monthly remittances to the State Treasurer as they would have been had they been correct in the first instance, well knowing his later figures do not represent the actual transaction. The county clerk, with equal knowledge of the facts, certifies, over his official seal, to monthly remittances that he knows were not made, and then a majority of the board of county commissioners certify to the correctness of the whole thing.

The Legislature should either abolish this farce or give the Auditor such powers as will enable him to secure correct semi-annual statements. If the following section, relative to county assessors, was so changed as to apply to county clerks, I believe it would correct the evil:

"SECTION 17. It shall be the duty of the board of county commissioners to retain twenty-five per centum of the salary or per diem of the county assessor of any county of the State until the said county assessor shall produce a certificate from the Auditor of State that he, the said county assessor, has duly delivered to said Auditor a copy of the

abstract of assessment for his county, and that the same has been made in accordance with the law. Any county assessor who shall fail to produce such a certificate from the Auditor of State shall forfeit said twenty-five per centum of his salary. In case of failure to receive such abstract of assessment in due course of time, the State Board of Equalization shall at once dispatch a messenger to obtain such abstract of assessment, the expenses thereof to be paid from the said twenty-five per centum retained by the board of county commissioners."

There are, at this writing, half a dozen county clerks who have not sent in their semi-annual statements for the six months ending June 30, 1892, although they have been written regarding the matter.

#### SALARIES.

The Ninth General Assembly should increase the salaries of the Secretary of State, Auditor of State, Superintendent of Public Instruction, and Attorney General, to \$5,000 per annum. The salaries of the Register of the State Board of Land Commissioners and Adjutant General should be increased to \$3,000 per annum. From a business point of view, I do not consider it good policy for the people to underpay their public servants. Competent men should be elected to office, and paid a fair salary. It is wrong that a State officer must feel, when he turns his office over to his successor and leaves the capitol for his home, that he is a poorer man than when he entered the public service. This, unfortunately, has been the common experience.

#### THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT.

This department in times past has been useful; it has protected the citizens of Colorado from the ravages of the insurance hyenas that have infested other States, weak companies have been promptly examined, compelled to reinsure their risks, and leave the State. The business of the department has been conducted with dignity and ability by my predecessors, so that the insurance department of Colorado has taken high standing, both with insurance companies and with departments of sister States. During my term, the department has paid into the general fund of the State \$61,269.03, and since its creation, \$166,047.49, and has spent less than \$500 in making examinations of foreign companies. The five Auditors of State who have at various times been superintendents of insurance, Mr. Tedmon

and Mr. Hurd, who have been deputy superintendents, and Mr. Simmons, who, for years, has made a most efficient chief clerk, may all take a just pride in the record which this insurance department has made. Through all the attacks made upon various State offices and officers in the past few years, this department has come unscathed.

It was not until a year and a half ago that the department was attacked, and, as I believe, from personal and partisan motives. The legitimate expenses of the department were not paid by the State Treasurer, the department was crippled—unable to protect either the policy holders of Colorado or the sound insurance companies doing business in the State. As a consequence, our policy holders have already lost thousands of dollars, the solvent and safe companies are dissatisfied and threatening to pay no more fees for protection they do not get, while the wildcat and underground insurance fakes are beginning to scent their prey. The department went to the courts for redress, in the suit of "N. S. Hurd, Deputy Superintendent, vs. J. N. Carlile, State Treasurer," and in the District Court of Arapahoe county the suit was decided in favor of the department, in an able and business-like opinion by Judge Graham. The case was then taken to the Court of Appeals, by the State Treasurer, where, when it was finally reached, the decision was against the department. The insurance department has in turn carried the case to a higher court, and I am confident that the Supreme Court will affirm the District Court, and reverse the Court of Appeals. Should the present decision of the Court of Appeals be law, the insurance department might as well be abolished. It would be, at best, but an office to extort revenue, in the form of fees, from insurance companies, and which would, in the end, be paid by our own people, through increased rates; while if the revenue is really needed, the same amount could be raised by direct taxation at one one-hundredth part of the cost required to maintain even a weak and powerless insurance department.

But I do not believe that this department, which has accomplished so much and which contains within itself such great possibilities for the future, will be allowed to sink into nothingness—the people, the Legislature and the courts of Colorado will not permit it. Instead of curtailing the powers of the insurance department, they should be largely increased. If I were considering this question from a partisan standpoint, I should advocate contracting rather than

expanding the authority of the superintendent of insurance, in order that my successor, of a different political party, might not make a creditable record in his office, and thus bring discredit upon him and his party; but I do not do this. In two years' experience as superintendent of insurance, I have learned that it is for the best interests of our policy holders, and that it is for the best interest of sound insurance companies, that the discretionary powers of the superintendent of insurance should be largely increased over anything that I, or my predecessors, have claimed a right to exercise. I leave it to the party now in power in Colorado to legislate in this direction, without further suggestion from me.

#### ASSESSMENTS.

At the last general election, the question of amending Section 11, Article X. of the Constitution of Colorado was submitted to the people, and carried. The section, as amended, reads: "The rate of taxation on property for State purposes shall never exceed four mills on each dollar of valuation." It now seems to me that the vexed question of unequal assessments, and consequent unfair taxation, can be solved by the incoming Legislature. Hitherto, the three hundred million mark has been the great bugbear which has excused all county assessors for continued and systematic violation of the revenue laws. It is doubtless true that if the total assessment had reached three hundred million dollars this year, and by constitutional provision the levy for State purposes had decreased to two mills, the general revenue fund would have been bankrupt. But now that this danger is avoided, through the good sense of our people in voting for the above amendment, the county assessors should be compelled to make their assessments according to law; that is, at full cash value. Such an assessment would increase the total assessed valuation of the State to at least five hundred million dollars.

The rate of levy for the State institutions and other funds, with two exceptions, should be reduced one-half, and will then provide more income than the present assessment of two hundred and thirty-six millions. The insane asylum levy must not be reduced, as that institution can use \$100,000 per annum to good advantage. The capitol building levy should remain at one-half mill, and thus bring to aid in the completion of our new capitol not less than \$250,000 yearly. The capitol building should be finished



with all possible haste, as the quarters now occupied by the departments of State are wholly unsuited to their present purpose, being unhealthy, with insufficient heat and light, and besides, we are paying more rent than would secure us commodious offices in the finest buildings in Denver. The  $\frac{1}{2}$  of one mill tax for interest on capitol building bonds should be reduced to  $\frac{1}{4}$  of one mill and included in the 4 mill levy as readjusted.

If the above changes are made,  $1\frac{1}{4}$  mills of the 4 mill levy will be used for State institutions and other funds, leaving  $2\frac{3}{4}$  mills for the general revenue fund, amounting to about \$1,300,000. Of this amount, not over \$600,000 will be required for the general expenses of the State government, the remaining revenue being derived from sources other than tax. Thus, in the years 1893 and 1894 our floating indebtedness can be completely wiped out of existence and the State put upon a cash basis. This can be done and no one feel that he is taxed for this purpose.

The Ninth General Assembly should also submit to the people the amendment to the Constitution proposed by Hon. E. M. Ammons, in the Eighth General Assembly, as follows:

“It shall not be lawful for any General Assembly to authorize any appropriations in excess of the actual revenue of the State of Colorado for the preceding two years, except to suppress insurrection, defend the State, or in time of war to assist in defending the United States.”

This amendment to the Constitution, if adopted, would place the State in such condition that it could never again get in debt.


#### APPROPRIATIONS.

There seems to be much doubt as to what constitutes an appropriation, and whether or not the State institutions have a sufficient appropriation in laws already passed. I have deemed it best to give the institutions the benefit of the doubt; but before the Ninth General Assembly concludes its labors, it should send to the Supreme Court a resolution which will elicit an opinion that will clear up the entire question, and prevent much trouble and confusion in the future.

About \$80,000 of the appropriations of the Eighth General Assembly have proved to be in excess of the revenues of the fiscal years 1891-92. I have done my best to so manage this deficiency that none should suffer, but have

probably succeeded only in a measure. I was determined, however, that no "excess warrant" should bear my signature, and it is with much satisfaction that I am able to inform Your Excellency that every State warrant issued by me will be paid from the revenues of the year against which it was drawn.
