TO HIS EXCELLENCY,

JAMES B. ORMAN,
Governor of Colorado.

Sir—I respectfully submit herewith my report as Auditor of State for the fiscal years 1901 and 1902.

At the time of my assuming the duties of this office the financial affairs of the state were in a most deplorable condition. The various state institutions, heretofore compelled to get along with appropriations much less than they could be properly maintained on, were calling loudly for increased appropriations. On the other hand, the estimates of revenue to be received for the fiscal years 1901 and 1902 as based upon receipts of former years, would not justify the legislature in making an increased appropriation. I am now glad to be able to state, however, that, owing to the combined efforts of the legislative and executive departments resulting in the passage and adoption of our present revenue law, our state institutions have been paid in full every appropriation allowed by the Thirteenth General Assembly, the same being greatly in excess of those allowed in former years.

This has relieved the situation as far as the present needs of the institutions are concerned, but I desire to call

the attention of Your Excellency to the fact that deficiencies incurred during former years were not provided for by the last legislature, and it now becomes an important duty of the Fourteenth General Assembly to provide for payment of all deficiencies brought forward from previous years.

The deficiencies which the Fourteenth General Assembly should provide for are as follows:

Penitentiary	\$32,000.00
University	70,000.00
Insane Asylum	15,000.00
Certificates of Indebtedness	23,446.13
Stock destroyed by order of Veterinary Board (Estimated)	2,600.00

My attention has been called many times to the fact that many of these claims making up the above deficiencies, are held by persons performing the services or furnishing the supplies who can not well afford to carry this indebtedness.

The appropriations made by the Thirteenth General Assembly for the maintenance, heating plant, insurance, fire escapes, river protection, and repairs of the State Insane Asylum, provided \$141,500 conditional upon the amount derived from the one-fifth mill levy, as the total paid the institution could not exceed \$241,500 in any event. In the same manner the appropriation for support of the State University was conditionally \$120,000, the payments to the institution not to exceed \$220,000. The appropriations for buildings for the School of Mines and Normal School of \$25,000.00 each, together with \$18,000.00 for additional maintenance of the Deaf and Blind Institute, were made conditional upon the amounts derived from the mill levy fund payments for the biennial period of 1901 and 1902 being limited to \$125,000.00, \$125,000.00 and \$118,000.00 respectively.

This manner of making appropriations, as far as I can see, has been productive of no good results whatever, but has served merely to tie up the above appropriations until the amount of mill levy collections for the two years could be determined, which, of course, was just prior to the close of the biennial period.

In addition to the fact that the institutions were necessarily prevented from enjoying their respective appropriations for more than a year, a considerable amount of trouble and annoyance was caused this office on account of the unsettled condition of affairs.

In future appropriations of these institutions it is to be hoped that the legislature will make as careful an estimate as may be of the income of the tax levy fund, and in addition thereto, allow appropriations for the necessary buildings or proper maintenance of the institutions as the case may be, not contingent upon the event of the income of the tax levy fund not being in excess of the estimate made.

One of the most difficult and important features with which this office has to contend is in getting satisfactory reports of the state's finances from the several counties of the state. Some counties are prompt and render this office accurate and satisfactory statements, while others are dilatory and quite indifferent regarding their statements, thus causing the Auditor much inconvenience and worry. A tax roll so perfectly extended that no mistakes can later be found in assessments or has no property omitted from taxation, is inconceivable, yet this office receives semi-annually many revenue statements from county clerks containing no information whatever, except a statement of amount of taxes remitted to the State Treasurer. As our only record of state taxes rebated is furnished by the counties themselves, would it not be possible for a county to very generously rebate state taxes as originally extended on their rolls. While the state may be counting as assets the uncollected taxes of this county the same may have been almost wiped out by rebate, the county reporting uncollected taxes for six years at the end of this time, declaring the taxes unavailable, which ends the responsibility for collections of any one year.

There seems to be no law that will permit the Auditor to investigate the county offices and compel the county clerks of the different counties to render accurate and honest statements.

One of the greatest necessities of the executive department, in my opinion, is a traveling auditor, who should have authority to investigate the different counties, and also the state institutions, where money is collected and turned into the state treasury. Through the efforts of the present administration over \$10,000.00 in interest on delinquent taxes has been collected from the counties of the state, and it seems to me that a traveling auditor such as I have mentioned, would result in a saving to the state of thousands of dollars each year.

In the law enacted by the Twelfth General Assembly relative to the Fish and Game Department, a fund was created and is known as the "Game Fund." The moneys accruing to this fund are the results of fines, penalties, and the seizure and sale of contraband goods. The present law permits the Fish and Game Commissioner to draw against this fund for expenses incident to this department. The legislature invariably makes ample appropriation for the carrying on of this department, and the money accruing to the game fund should, in my opinion, be either held intact for appropriation by the legislature, or turned into the general revenue fund for the redemption of warrants.

The General Appropriation bill, in which the salaries and expenses of the Boiler Inspector's department are appropriated, invariably provides that such salaries and expenses shall be paid out of the fees collected for the inspection of boilers.

It is impossible for the State Treasurer to apply this money directly to the redemption of these warrants from the fact that the law provides that all warrants issued for appropriations must be redeemed consecutively in the order of their issue.

I desire to recommend that the fees collected by the Boiler Inspector be turned into the treasury and create a cash fund out of which the salaries and expenses of this department can be paid, and thus avoid the necessity of the legislature making provision for this department in the General Appropriation bill, and also avoid the necessity of issuing interest bearing warrants, which should save the state a considerable sum each year.

The Corporation License Tax Department has been a source of disappointment, as far as the amount of revenue derived from this department is concerned. (A statement in another part of the report shows the receipts.) A great amount of labor and considerable expense has been attached to the inauguration of this system of taxation. Under the original act creating the department, a large amount of money would eventually be derived, but after the act was amended and the rate of taxation lowered, the amount to be derived is insignificant in comparison with other departments.

I would recommend that the rate of taxation either be changed to what it was in the original act, or that the department be abolished. If the department is to be main-

tained, some course of procedure should be adopted whereby the collections of this tax could be enforced. As the present law stands, we can simply demand payment, but are powerless to enforce collection, when payment is refused. Under these conditions, any corporation, that is not compelled to appear before the courts, is enabled to exist and transact business throughout the entire term of their corporate existence without paying this tax; the result is that a large proportion of corporations ignore our demands altogether. An appropriation for three clerks should be made to carry on the business of this department.

I notice in previous Auditors' reports that mention is made, and recommendations offered relative to the salary of the Auditor of State, but I presume that the Fourteenth General Assembly, as former legislatures, will pay no attention whatever to the recommendation.

The responsibility attached to serving as Auditor of State is second to no other executive office, and the idea that this high executive office should pay only \$2,500.00 per annum, placing it on a par with such appointive offices as Boiler Inspector, Commissioner of Mines, receiving the same salaries, and with the State Engineer receiving a higher salary, is ridiculous. During the past administration, an additional responsibility has been placed upon the office on account of the collection of the corporation license tax.

I earnestly recommend an increase of salary for the State Auditor from \$2,500.00 to \$4,000.00 per annum.

I find it a difficult problem to make an accurate estimate of the excess revenues that will accrue to the general revenue funds for the years 1901 and 1902, the large corporations having refused to pay taxes upon their 1901 assessed valuations, except in a few counties, where a compromise has been effected. Should the corporations pay fifty per cent of the taxes charged against them, we can estimate that there will be an excess revenue of approximately \$200,000 for the biennial period, after having paid all appropriations made by the Thirteenth General Assembly. The disposition of this money is a matter for careful consideration. I would recommend one of two things. First—An appropriation of this money for the payment of deficiency claims of previous administrations, and the redemption of outstanding certificates of indebtedness; any excess to be applied to redemption of outstanding warrants of previous years. Second—Apply

the entire amount to redemption of outstanding warrants of previous administrations which were issued in excess of the revenues of their respective years. This indebtedness is drawing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, and if the warrants are not redeemed in the near future, the interest will be fully as great as the principal.

I beg to call your attention to the fact that the past excellent record of the Insurance Department has not only been maintained, but we are able to report the substantial increase of \$42,923.57 in receipts over those of the previous biennial period.

Reviewing the financial condition as a whole, I can not but feel that the present administration is to be congratulated. The floating debt of the state has been decreased over \$300,000 during the past two years, owing largely to operations of the new revenue law, whereby the income of the Secretary of State's office has been largely increased, together with the income from court fees and liquor licenses of the Treasurer's office, and corporation taxes collected by the Auditor, all of which will eventually lessen the rate of taxation upon the property owner.

In view of the fact that the appropriations made by the Thirteenth General Assembly were, in the aggregate, greater than ever before appropriated by any legislature, and taking into consideration these appropriations have all been paid in full, it is an agreeable surprise to find the floating debt of the state decreased to the extent mentioned. Should this record be maintained, it will be a question of only a few years when the state will be on a cash basis.

Following, in detail, will be found records showing the transactions of the office for the preceding two years.

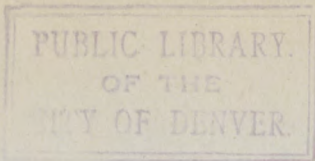
