TO HIS EXCELLENCY,

JAMES H. PEABODY,

Governor of Colorado.

Sir—I respectfully submit herewith my report as Auditor of State for the fiscal years of 1903 and 1904.

At the time of assuming the duties as Auditor of State I found the Auditor's and Insurance departments in excellent condition, but not so with the Flat Tax Department. I found that the books did not correspond with the Auditor's report, and upon examination I found that the cash turned in to the State Treasurer did not correspond with the books.

At my request you appointed L. B. Schwanbeck, Expert Accountant, to examine the accounts of the Flat Tax Department in the State Auditor's office, and after a careful examination he reported the Flat Tax cash short \$10,087.30. Of this amount the former Auditor gave the State Treasurer a check for \$6,993.40, leaving a shortage of \$3,093.90, which has not up to this time been turned over to the Treasurer. Besides this amount there was collected \$34,895.16, which was paid under protest and which has never been paid over to the Treasurer, nor any accounting having been made to the State.

As the appropriations made by the Fourteenth General Assembly was in excess of the estimated revenue, all of the appropriations could not be paid.

After consulting with the Attorney-General, also with the heads of the various institutions of the State, and explaining the

condition of the revenue of the State, they realized that the condition of the State's finances were such that they would have to cut their expenses down to the lowest notch, which I am pleased to report all heads of the departments did, and very near all the departments have a little surplus to turn back into the General Revenue.

The World's Fair Board had an appropriation of \$100,000.00; of this amount they have used \$68,848.03, leaving a balance of \$31,151.97.

The Fourteenth General Assembly passed a bill providing that the surplus of 1901 and 1902 be made a fund to pay all deficiencies of former administrations. From this fund I have issued warrants which have been paid to the amount of \$158,929.48. There still remains \$53,993.62 of this class of claims not paid, which, with interest approximately due of \$13,500.00, would make a total of this class of claims \$67,493.62 on file in the State Auditor's office.

The Fourteenth General Assembly gave this administration an Incidental fund of not more than about one-fourth of what the former administration had for the same purpose, but through the economical administration of the heads of the various departments we managed to pay all the incidentals and expenses of the various departments, and have a surplus to turn into the General Revenue of \$7,841.60.

One of the disagreeable things that came up in this office was the injunction served upon this office, stopping the issuing of warrants on the General Appropriation bill, and the sustaining of same to the District Court and the extra session of the Legislature, which necessitated a great deal of additional work in the Auditor's office. One other thing was that the Auditor's estimate of revenues for the years 1903 and 1904 was largely in excess of what the amount should have been, consequently had to turn down a great many appropriations; in fact, refuse to draw warrants on the Third and Fourth-Class appropriations, but I believe at this time that with the amounts turned back into the General Revenue from the various appropriations that have been paid, there will be some moneys to pay on Third-Class appropriations.

Finding that the revenues of the State would be far below the estimate of the Legislature, the Board of Equalization decided to have some of its members visit every county in the State, placing before them the necessity of a large valuation of the State to provide for the various institutions. For this purpose James Cowie, Secretary of State; R. R. Leese, secretary of the Board of Equalization, and myself, visited nearly all of the counties in the State, and as a result we had an increase in the valuation, which in 1903 was \$333,000,000, to \$342,000,000 in 1904.

I beg to call your attention to the excellent record of the Insurance Department. In 1901 and 1902 the receipts for that department were \$259,315.96; in 1903 and 1904 the receipts were

\$318,219.43, showing an increase in 1903 and 1904 over 1901 and 1902 of \$58,989.34.

The receipts of the Flat Tax Department in 1901 and 1902, as shown by the Treasurer's books, and turned over to the Treasurer, were \$58,013.82, and the amount turned over to the Treasurer after November 30, 1903, was \$12,328.27, making a total of \$70,342.09. The receipts for 1903 and 1904 and turned over to the Treasurer were \$76,590.53. Paid under protest and in the Western Bank is \$11,016.77, making a total of \$87,607.30. By the advice of the Attorney-General, the amount under protest has not been turned in to the Treasurer, and is in the Western Bank, ready to be turned over at any time when the Flat Tax case is decided in the Supreme Court.

Increase is accounted for on account of issue of \$739,000.00 certificates of indebtedness and additional interest on \$800,000.00 outstanding warrants of the years 1887, 1888 and 1889.

I have registered 784 Refunding Bonds at 10 cents each, making \$78.40, and paid the same to the State Treasurer.

I would recommend that an appropriation be made to pay the Assessor's mileage and per diem. The statute provides for an annual meeting to be held in August of each year, and also provides for paying mileage and per diem, but the Thirteenth General Assembly failed to make an appropriation for same. I would also recommend that an appropriation be made for paying the committee which is appointed to examine the books of the State Treasurer, as provided for by the statute.

I think that there should be a Traveling Auditor or a Commissioner appointed to examine public accounts; at any rate, the Auditor's accounts should be checked as often as the Treasurer's. I also recommend that a bill be passed by the Legislature to make it monitory for all employes of the State Auditor's office and the State Treasurer's office to be bonded in some reliable bonding company, the same to be paid for by the State. I further recommend that where the statute provides for salaries and expenses for a department of State that the Legislature should follow the same in making appropriations or change the statute, as it makes it very disagreeable in the Auditor's office when they make demand that their salary should be as the statute provides.

The Attorney-General, during this administration, held that

the appropriations provided for by the statute would have precedent over the appropriation bill.

For the reason of the increase of the amount of business in the State Auditor's office, I would recommend that an assistant bookkeeper be provided for.

Two years ago there was a request made of the Legislature that they provide for a new set of filing boxes in the vault of the State Auditor, but they at that time saw fit to turn the request down, which I have regretted very much since. If there is a department in the State that needs a new set of filing boxes it is the Auditor's, as the facilities we have at the present time for filing vouchers and other documents are very primitive, and we are very much crowded for room. I trust that the Legislature will take this matter up and see that there will be a new set of filing boxes for the vault of the State Auditor. I would also recommend that when an appropriation is made by the Legislature for the maintenance of a department of state the cash fund of such department be turned into the General Revenue.

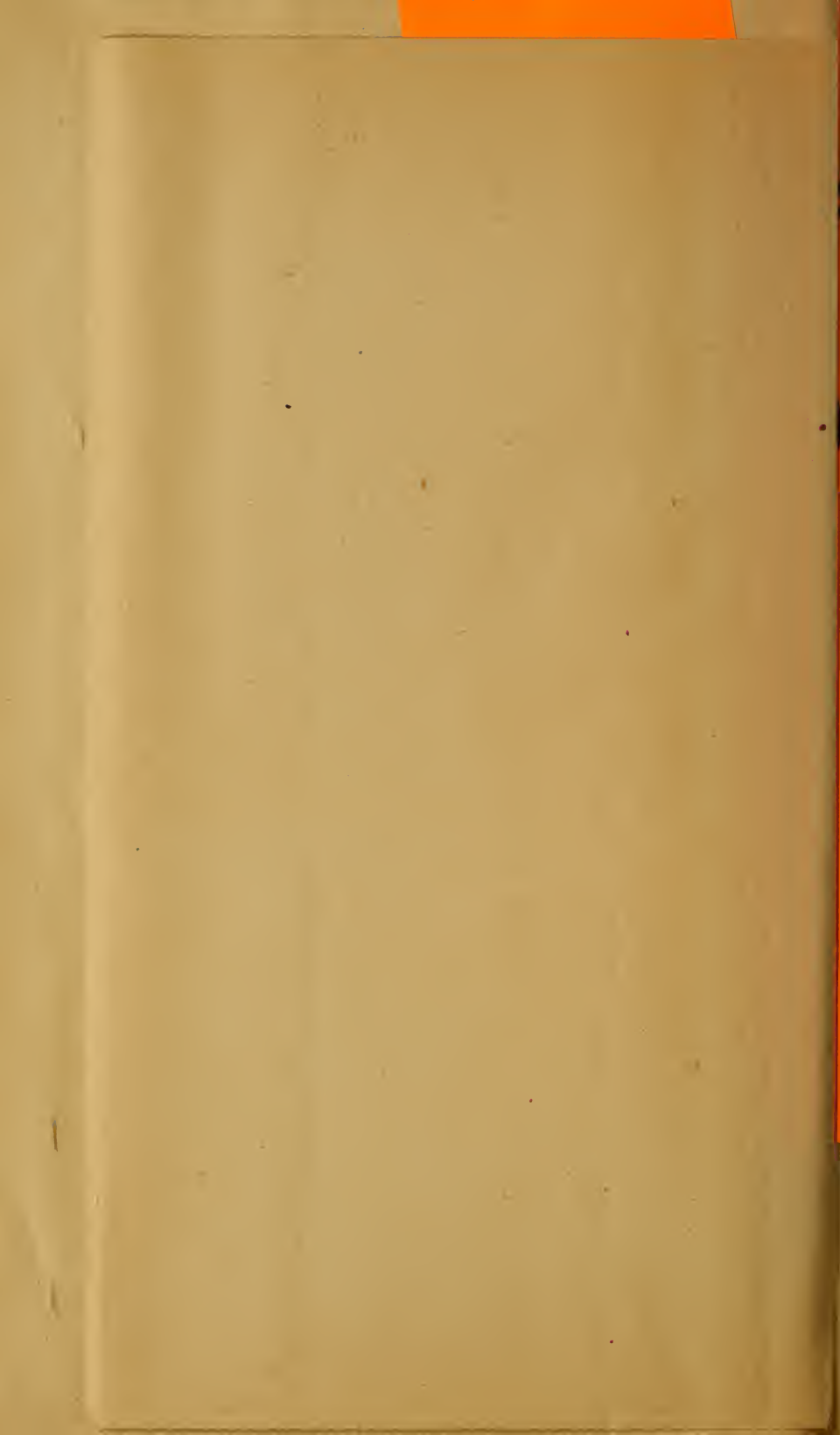
Charged Each County for State Taxes for the Fiscal Year 1903.

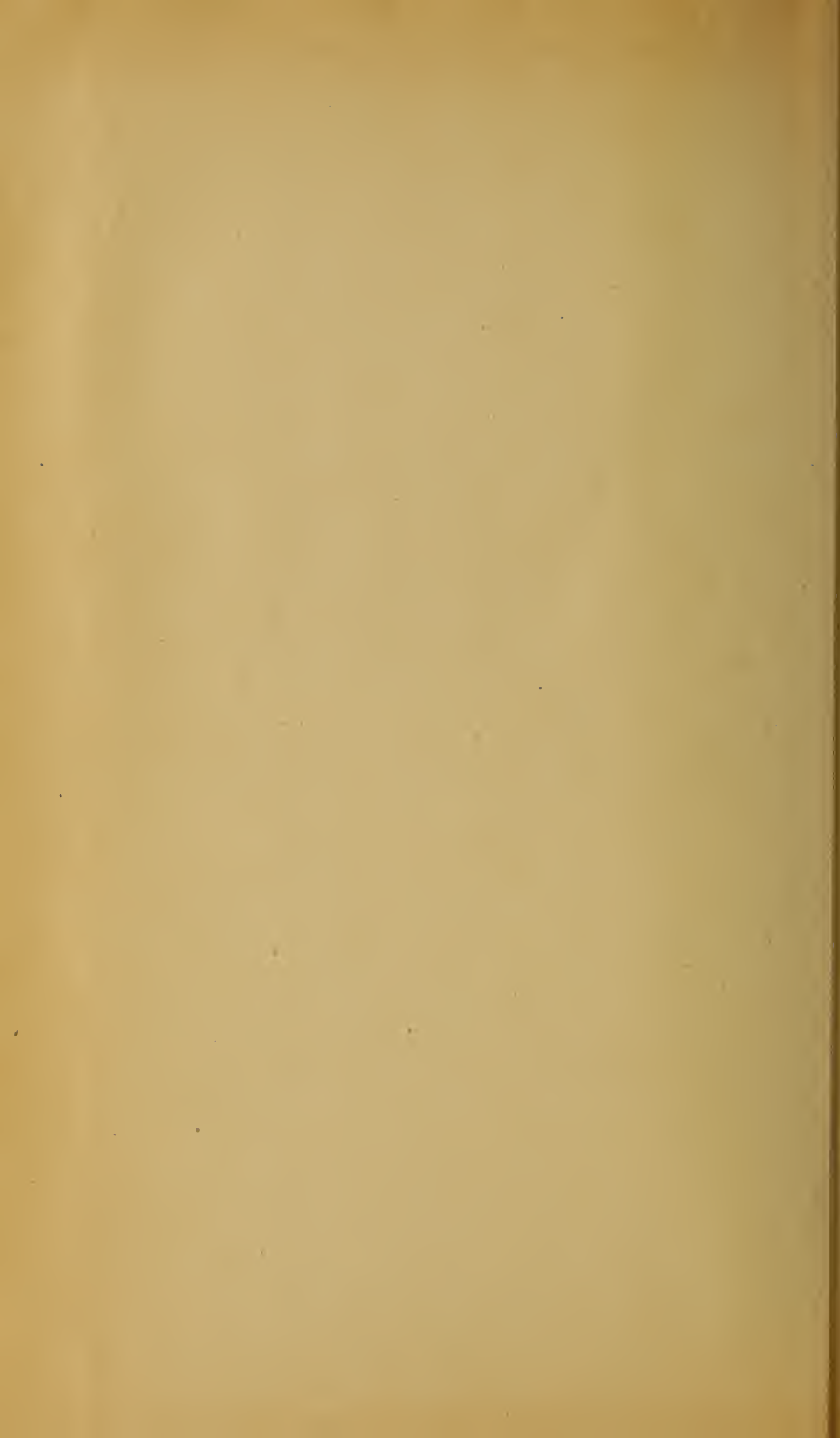

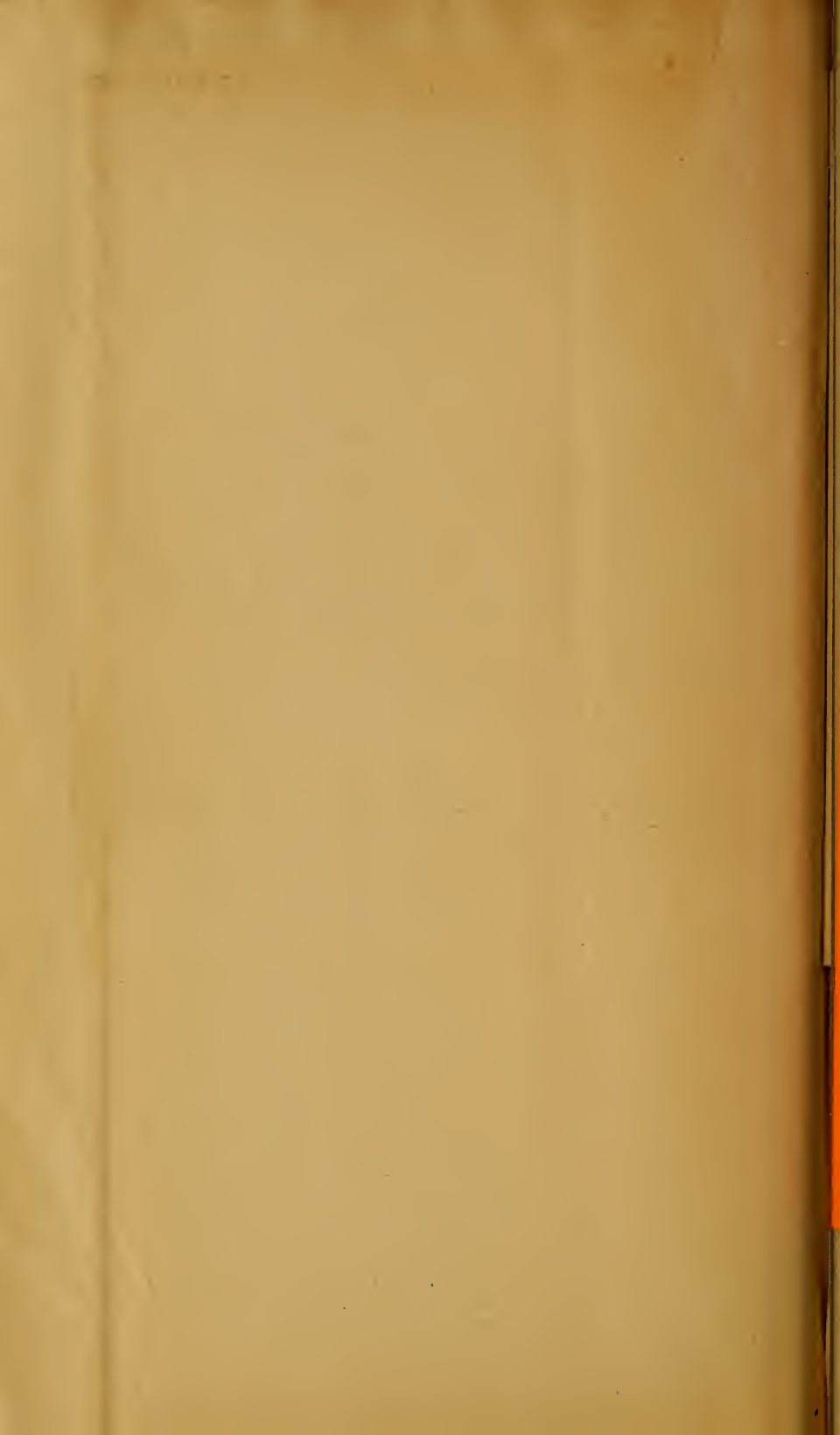

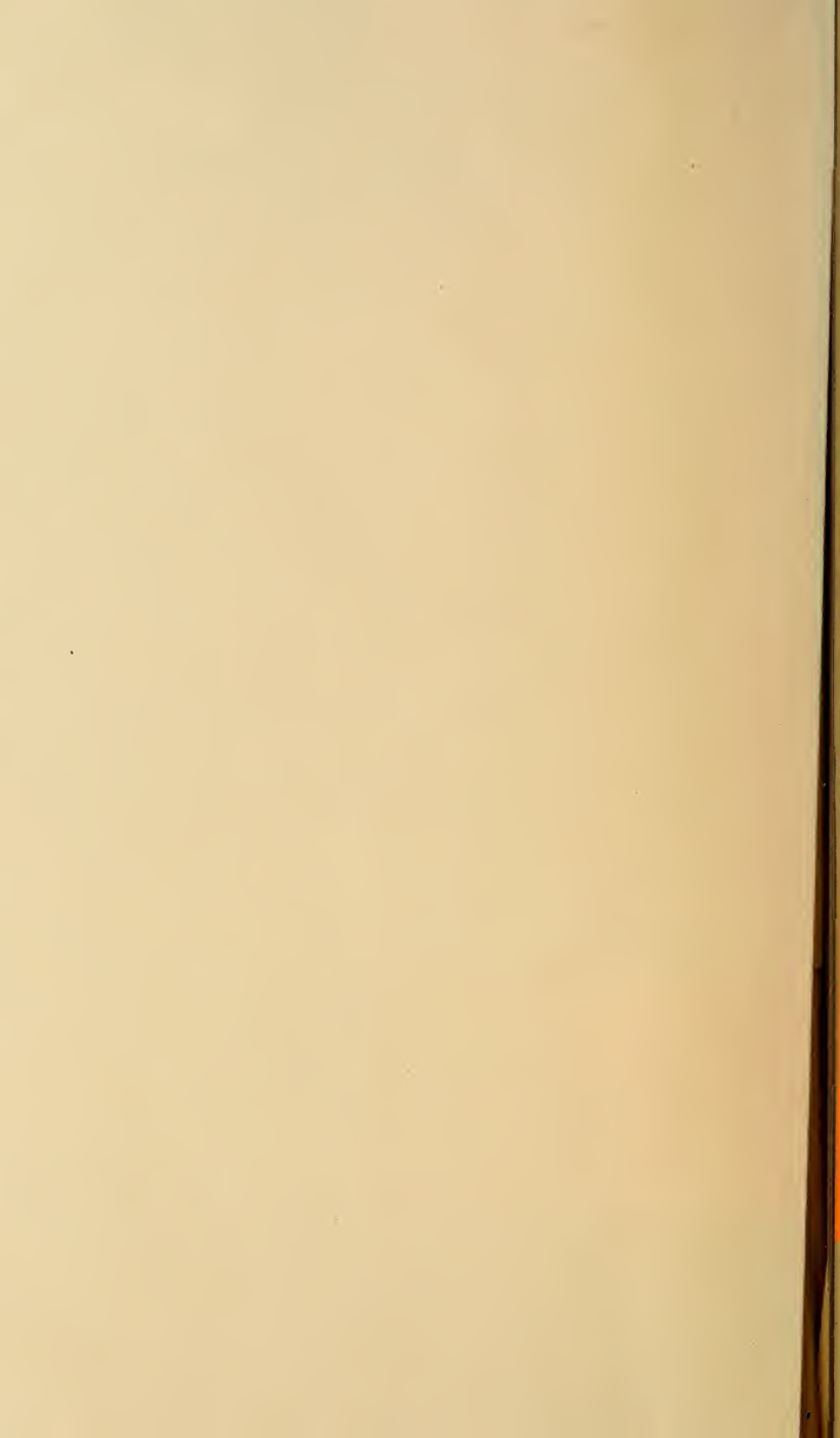

ANNUAL CORPORATION LICENSE TAX.

On the following pages will be found a synopsis of the amount collected by the Corporation License Tax Department (commonly known as the flat tax), also disbursements by way of refunds and other data in relation thereto.

At this time it would be pertinent and opportune to state that the law governing this tax is sadly deficient and lame, with reference to the method of enforcing collection; in fact, the present law almost leaves it optional as to whether the tax is paid or not.

Approximately computed, not one-third of the corporations authorized to transact business in the State of Colorado pay the annual tax, and while the rate of taxation is comparatively insignificant, yet if payment was enforced and made compulsory this department would be a source of revenue from which a handsome sum could be realized.

As the present law stands on our statute books payment can simply be demanded by annually notifying, previous to February 1st, each company as to the amount due, and when payable. The large majority of corporations not only refuse to comply with the demands and terms of said notification, but absolutely ignore them; we are powerless to enforce collection, and they continue throughout their entire corporate existence without paying the tax, and in view of this lax condition, I desire to recommend that the next Legislature amend the law governing this tax by adopting some method of procedure to enforce collection.

Under the original act creating this department, all corporations, irrespective as to the amount of capital stock, were to pay the annual tax at the rate of ten cents upon each one thousand dollars of its capital stock for foreign corporations, and five cents per thousand for domestic corporations.

During the extra session of the Legislature in 1902 the rate of taxation was reduced three-fifths, or making the tax four cents and two cents on foreign and domestic corporations respectively, and, furthermore, all domestic corporations capitalized for less than \$25,000 were exempt from taxation.

By way of comparison the amount collected for the fiscal years of 1903 and 1904 is greatly in excess of that collected by the previous administration.

It had been the intention of the department to make a most minute report of the business transacted, and to publish in book form every corporation having paid a license tax, the date, name and amount so paid, but after the work was completed it was found that the report would consist of about 150 pages, set in very small type, and that the possible benefits which might accrue would not be commensurate with the expense; therefore, a synopsis of the exact amounts of receipts and disbursements has been substituted.
