## BIENNIAL REPORT

OF THE

Denter, Colo., Dec. 5. 1906.
To His Excellency,
JESSE F. McDONALD, Governor of Colorado.
Sir-I herewith submit you a review of the work of this Department during the past two rears.

It has been my constant aim to exert every effort to improve the efficiency of the Department.

Upon assuming jurisdiction, more or less laxness was found to exist with reference to the specific contents of vouchers, and an evident lack of application of thorough business principles to the details of the office. Regulations calling for complete specific rouchers in all cases have been introduced, which have proven rery beneficial to this and all other Executive Departments and State institutions.

A practice of requiring all institutions to disburse maintenance appropriations comparatively equally throughout the entire biennial period has been put into effect with most gratifying results.

Bills aggregating approximately $\$ 2,300,000.00$ passed by the Fifteenth General Assembly appropriating money from the General Revenue, Capitol Building and Internal Improvement Funds hare been placed on the books. All of these appropriations have been paid in full.

Warrants issued against the revenue of 1905 amounting to $\$ 960,000.00$ have all been redeemed, and now there is a surplus in this fund of $\$ 51,465.14$ which will be transferred, as provided by law, for the payment of deficiency indebtedness. A conserva-
tive estimate is, that the surplus in the 1905 revenue will erentually be $\$ 65,000.00$.

Deficiency indebtedness and interest thereon aggregating §2:., 202.18 has been paid during the past two years from the sur. plus revenues of 1901 and 1902 . There still remains unpaid deficience indebtedness to the amount of $\$ 74,695.36$.

I estimate that the surplus revenues of 1905 and 1906 will liquidate all of this indelitedness.

Ninety-eight claims aggregating $\$ 547,020.00$ have been filed by various persons as a result of the insurrection in Teller county.

Outstanding warrants against the revenues of $185 \overline{7}, 1888$ and 1889 aggregating, with accrued interest, \$1,821.244.69. regarding which much has been said, still remain unprovided for. The various Investment Funds of the State hold five-eighths of these warrants. Our Constitution forbids the impairment of the School Fund. These warrants draw interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum, while a State bond should sell at par, drawing interest at the rate of thrte or three and a half per cent., therefore, it would seem to be a business proposition for the Legislature to authorize the submitting to a vote of the people at the next general election a constitutional amendment authorizing a bond issue to pay these warrants, which action would at the same time eliminate this stain of long standing upon Colorado's credit.

Scalp bounty certificates to the amount of thousands of dollars continue to be filed in this office, with no money to pay them. The Legislature should either repeal the present law or make some provision for the parment of these claims.

I would recommend the establishment of a permanent surplus fund to be used for the redemption of the outstanding warrants for the year 1891 and subsequent rears wherein the warrant issue has been in excess of the revenue.

The Fifteenth General Assembly appropriated for the General Incidental Fund the sum of $\$ 65.000 .00$. This is an amount considerably less than has heretofore been appropriated for this purpose, nevertheless the Auditing Board has economized to such a degree as to keep its expenditures within the sum mentioned, and you are well aware the Auditing Board has denied requisitions for actual necessities by the Departments, in order to prevent a shortage in this fund, therefore, I am sure you will agree with me that the Sixteenth General Assembly should be urged to appropriate the sum of $\$ 75,000.00$ for this fund.

I desire to call your attention to over $\$ 700,000.00$ of outstanding certificates of indebtedness, and would suggest that this fact be presented to the Legislature with a view to procuring suitable provision for the parment of the same.

Permit me to also remind rou that there is no insurance whatever carried upon the Capitol building. I am informed that
the Board of Capitol Managers some years ago seriously considered the desirability of insuring the building, but, owing to the fact that the proposed rates for insurance seemed excessive, no action was taken.

I would recommend and urge that, providing satisfactory rates can be procured, steps should be taken to obtain a suitable amount of fire insurance on the building.

The office of the Auditor of State is a very responsible one. and the duties are excessive, and cover a broad scope, therefore, it would seem that the present salary of $\$ 3,000.00$ per annum is inadequate, and I would recommend a suitable increase.

Diligence has been exercised in the collection of the Inheritance Tax, with the result that during the past two years the sum of $\$ 98,000.00$ has been derived from this sourse as compared with $\$ 11,921.20$ during the previous biennial period. This is an equitable and popular tax, and the process of its collection should be thoroughly systematized.

Inheritance Tax laws are in effect in twenty-nine states in the Union, and as Colorado grows in age, the revenues from this source will rapidly increase. A recent decision of our Supreme Court modifies the terms of section 21 of the Revenue Act of 1902 in such a manner that the sum of $\$ 10,000.00$ is now exempt from each portion of an estate. This decision has resulted in the presentation of claims for refund by various persons who had paid the tax under the interpretation of the statute exempting $\$ 10$,000.00 from the entire estate.

The importance of this tax and the necessity of a thorough knowledge on the part of the person representing the State in its collection, prompts me to recommend and urge the creation of the position of Inheritance Tax Clerk to be attached to the office of Auditor of State, who should be thoroughly versed in Inheritance Tax laws, and whose duties should be confined exclusively to the supervision and collection of this tax.

I would also recommend the following amendments, viz:
First: Amending section 21 of the Revenue Act of 1902 so as to clearly exempt the sum of $\$ 10,000.00$ from the entire estate, instead of exempting $\$ 10,000.00$ from each portion of an estate.

Second: I would also recommend that section 30 of the Revenue Act of 1902 be so amended as to authorize the Auditor of

State to draw warrants upon the State Treasurer for the payment of any refund of erroneously paid inheritance tax in accordance with the provisions of said section.

Third: I would also recommend that section 39 of the Revenue Act of 1902 be so amended as to require county treasurers to turn in their collections of Inheritance Tax under the law with their regular monthly remittances, instead of being permitted to hold the same until the first day of May and October in each year.

## COUNTY CLERKS AND ASSESSORS.

Section 87 of the Revenue Act of 1902 provides that at the hour of ten a. m., on the first Tuesday of August in each year, all the county assessors shall meet at the Capitol, etc. Owing to the fact that the date of this meeting is after all the assessors have completed their schedules and fixed their valuations, but little benefit is derived, therefore, I would recommend that section 87 of the Revenue Act of 1902 be amended, fixing the date of this meeting at the hour of ten a. m., on the first Tuesday in Feb. ruary in each year for the purpose of enabling the assessors of the State to arrive at uniform values on all classes of property assessed by them.

The provisions of section 63 of the Revenue Act of 1902 relative to the filing of annual statements with the Auditor of State by corporations doing business and owning property in two or more counties are not being generally complied with or enforced, due to the fact that the enforcement of the penalty for failure or refusal is vested in the Board of County Commissioners and should be amended to be made efficient.

I would also recommend that a penalty be exacted by law from county clerks who fail to file their semi-annual revenue statements with the office of Auditor of State within the time prescribed by law.

## PUBLIC EXAMINER.

Very soon after assuming charge of this office, the urgent necessity of a State Bureau of Examination was on every hand apparent. The head of this bureau might be designated as State Examiner or Public Examiner, and should be a high-class accountant, and thoroughly competent and equipped to supervise this kind of work, and this position should be as far as possible, removed from politics.

There is expended by this State for all purposes, State, city, county and schools, thirteen million dollars per annum, which is nearly four per cent. of the entire State valuation for taxation purposes, therefore, the tax payers are entitled to the establishment of a Department which will result in raising the standard of public service in every capacity throughout the entire State, and. also, in developing a uniform system of accounting and a uniform annual system of public reports, that will, by compari-
son, quickly demonstrate the economies or the extravagances of public officials in similar positions throughout the State, and public expenditures of a similar nature throughout the State, then the weak official who might be tempted, would hesitate to misuse public funds, knowing that exposure is practically certain.

It seems almost incredible that the rast business of the State has been carried on so long without the establishment of a Department of this character.

Colorado has fifty-nine counties, four first-class cities, twenty second-class cities, two hundred and sixty-four incorporated towns and fifteen hundred and fifty-eight school boards. Laws bearing on this subject are now in effect in Ohio, New Mexico, Wyoming, Idaho and Maryland, and perhaps several other states. Some confine the work to examination of county treasurers and commissioners in addition to all State Executive Departments and all monied institutions, except national banks, but Ohio and Wyoming virtually include all offices in these States, and in Wyoming, the Public Examiner is also Bank Examiner. Ohio in three years saved $\$ 600,000.00$ directly in fees and taxes, and the Auditor of that State says that easily $\$ 2,000,000.00$ have been saved directly and indirectly by improved service and by enforcement of the revenue laws. Wyoming has enjoyed similar satisfactory results.

Governor Hagermann of New Mexico advises that the operation of the traveling Auditor law is rery satisfactory to the tax payers.

An infinite amount of data and arguments could be presented in behalf of the establishment of this Department, but in view of the fact that the matter has been during the past year brought to the attention of a great number of the leading citizens of the State and the consensus of opinion seems unanimous in favor of a Public Examiner law, further elaboration would seem unnecessary, therefore, I would recommend that the next Legislature be urged to pass an efficient State Examiner law, the said Examiner to be appointed by the Governor, and to be a thorough and efficient accountant, and providing that uniform accounting be established not later than January 1, 1908, and providing for sufficient deputy examiners to put the law into effect and in perfect working order.

I would recomment that the proposed department have jurisdiction over all State Executive Departments and State institutions and such municipal and county officers as the wisdom of the Legislature may direct, and, also, all private and State banks, building and loan associations and bonding companies, and, in fact, all concerns of a similar character.

## INSURANCE DEPARTMENT.

In view of the fact that over eighty thousand people in Colorado hold policies in life insurance companies, and as many more
are insured in fraternal orders, and to the further fact that nearly every house-owner in Colorado carries fire insurance, thereby causing the work of the Insurance Department to be of interest to approximately ninety per cent. of the entire population of the state, it is of the utmost importance that laws relative to insurance and regulating the Department should embody every possible element tending toward protecting the policyholders and furnishing efficient service.

Hiligence and efficiency characterize the present management of this Department. Unusual effort has been exerted in the interest of the insured with a view to encourage legitimate insurance in all lines, and with a riew to discouraging illegitimate and questionable methods.

Our present laws relative to insurance are rery weak and inefficient, and in some cases ambiguous. in other cases contradictory, and in others lacking in suitable provisions for enforcement.

Our present laws designate the Auditor of State as ex-officiu Superintendent of Insurance, and the Constitution prerents the Auditor of state from serving more than two years consecutively. therefore, the frequent changing in the head of this Department has not been conducive to efficiency. The head of this Department should have a broad and thorough knowledge of insurance.

As a result of the disclosures br the Armstrong Legislative Committee in New York State, and the subsequent enactments passed by the New York Legislature, a general re-adjustment of insurance conditions is now taking place throughout the country.

With a view of meeting these conditions, the National Association of Insurance Commissioners has for more than a year deroted much time and persistent work in formulating proposed uniform laws for the regulation of life insurance companies and in the interest of the public. It is of the utmost importance that the insurance laws of Colorado, which are decidedly ineffective. should be brought up to date and in accord with the uniform legislation recommended by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners and by the Colorado Insurance Department.

I would recommend that the Insurance Department of Colorado continue as a separate and distinct department, and be in charge of an Insurance Commissioner. who should have a broad and thorough knowledge of insurance and who should be appointed by the Governor; and the duties of the Insurance Commis sioner should be clearly and specifically defined. He should be given sufficient latitude in the administration of the affairs of the Department to secure on behalf of the insuring public "insurance that insures."

The statutes should prohibit any salaried official or emplore of the Department from charging a personal fee for any service rendered any individual or company not specified in the laws.

Laws should be passed preventing the practice of disreputable methods in procuring insurance and the Commissioner should be armed with full authority to enforce them, even to the extent of withdrawing a certificate of authority to do business.
