Sir—In accordance with the provisions of law I herewith submit my biennial report of this department. The form of this report does not differ from the plan of my predecessors. It contains, in addition to the usual financial statements and estimates of the Auditor's office, a report of the Bureau of Building and Loan Associations, and a statement of the financial condition of all accredited associations doing business in the State. When the present Auditor assumed the duties of the office, January 8, 1907, the office was found to be in most excellent condition in all business details. My purpose has been not only to maintain this high standard, but still further increase its efficiency.

Appropriations made by the Sixteenth General Assembly from the General Revenue Fund and from the Internal Improvement Fund, aggregating \$2,466,467.25, have been placed upon the books, and there will be ample revenue to pay these appropriations in full.

Warrants have been issued against the revenue of 1907 to the extent of \$1,252,961. These warrants have all been called, and there is a surplus remaining to the credit of the revenue of 1907 of approximately \$175,000.00.

Up to the present time warrants have been issued against the revenue of 1908, amounting to \$957,210.21, and after the taxes are collected for the 1908 revenue, I estimate that there will be a surplus of \$100,000.00 in the General Revenue Fund of 1908.

For the years 1898 to 1906, inclusive, we have a surplus revenue of approximately \$110,000.00. This money is available for disposition by the Legislature. I recommend that this surplus be applied to the redemption of all outstanding warrants for the year 1891 and subsequent years.

All deficiency indebtedness remaining unpaid at the beginning of this administration is now paid in full, the amount being \$130,497.89.

At the commencement of the present administration there were remaining unpaid the following appropriations for the years 1903 and 1904:

There was not sufficient revenue to pay these appropriations in full, consequently the revenue available was pro-rated, according to law, and the following amounts were paid, after a waiver had been filed by the various institutions of the balance of their appropriations:

There are outstanding interest-bearing warrants issued against the revenue of 1887 amounting to \$130,776.71; against the revenue of 1888, \$277,555.65, and against the revenue of 1889, \$418,227.54, making a total of \$826,559.90, and with accrued interest aggregating \$1,870,838.28.

The Sixteenth General Assembly of the State of Colorado adopted a constitutional amendment which was submitted to a vote of the people at the general election of November 3, 1908, and failed of approval by a very small vote. I view with regret the failure of this amendment which proposed a bond issue by the State to secure funds for the purpose of "liquidating or redeeming the principal only" of these warrants. The various investment funds of the State hold the major portion of these warrants, and the balance are in the hands of innocent purchasers.

and are known as "the repudiated warrants of the State of Colorado." These warrants are in no sense fraudulent, but were issued for property which the State now has in its possession and has not paid for. Many were issued for the salaries of Legislators, executive and judicial officers. The necessary expense of the Penitentiary and Insane Asylum were paid from the proceeds of these warrants. The payment of this debt concerns the honor of the State of Colorado and her citizens. Further delay only adds to an already enormous accumulation of interest, and emphasizes the disrespect of the State's credit. I would therefore recommend that the Seventeenth General Assembly authorize the submitting again to the vote of the people at the next general election a constitutional amendment authorizing a bond issue to pay these warrants. The bonds should bear such a rate of interest as would make them salable in the bond markets at the present time.

There are now on file in this office scalp bounty certificates aggregating \$35,000.00. Some provision should be made to pay these claims, and as these certificates continue to be filed the Legislature should either make provision for the payment of these claims in the future or repeal the law.

As a result of the insurrection in Teller county damage claims amounting to \$542,020.00 have been filed in this office.

#### GENERAL INCIDENTAL FUND.

The sum of \$65,000.00 was appropriated by the Sixteenth General Assembly for the General Incidental Fund for this biennial period. This amount has proven inadequate to meet the needs of the various departments of State, and as a result the expenditures have exceeded the appropriation by several thousand dollars. Frequently the requisitions of the departments for necessary supplies could not be granted. A number of new departments and commissions were created by the last Legislature, and no corresponding provision was made for the increased incidental expense, and the result proved a great embarrassment to the Board.

I would, therefore, not only recommend, but urge, that the Seventeenth General Assembly appropriate the sum of \$75,000.00 for the General Incidental Fund for the next biennial period.

#### INHERITANCE TAX.

The collection of the Inheritance Tax has become a matter of great importance by reason of the amount of revenue derived by the State. The Inheritance Tax clerk, directed in all legal questions involved by an assistant of the Attorney General's office, has made a very gratifying record in this department. Uniform blanks for procedure and reports have been supplied to all County Courts in the State, and a system of permanent records has been adopted by this office showing in detail the disposition of every estate and the tax collected or now due.

During this biennial period the sum of \$438,135.68 has been collected and paid into the State treasury. The sum of \$51,538.08 has been collected, and is now in the hands of the various county treasurers. There is due the State from various estates now in litigation \$60,852.00. Important legal questions are involved in appeals to the Supreme Court affecting the payment of the inheritance tax on some of these estates. In view of the large amount of this tax that accumulates in the hands of county treasurers, I approve the following recommendation of my predecessor: "I would also recommend that section 39 of the Revenue Act of 1902 be so amended as to require county treasurers to turn in their collections of inheritance tax under the law with their regular monthly remittances, instead of being permitted to hold the same until the first day of May and October in each year."

#### BUREAU OF BUILDING AND LOAN ASSOCIATIONS.

Senate Bill No. 287 was passed by the last session of the Legislature providing for the regulation and examination of Building and Loan Associations doing business in the State. This law is not all that was desired along the line of control of these and similar institutions, but was a start in the right direction—that of protection to the savings of the working classes. It has brought to light the virtues and benefits of right management of these institutions and the advantages to new communities received through Building and Loan Associations conservatively managed.

On the other hand, the Bureau has discovered many evasions of the law through general incorporations under various names, commonly known as "Bond Investment Companies," gotten together for the purpose of procuring business from would-be subscribers to Building and Loan Associations, taking advantage of the popularity of these institutions, but depriving the subscribers of most of the strong points thereof. They take away all voice of the investors in the management and control of their own securities, and attempt by contract to evade any and all present Banking and Building and Loan Association legislation along this line. This department has had more complaints concerning institutions of this kind than all the Building and Loan Associations under its supervision. It is the purpose of this department to submit to the next General Assembly a draft of a law that will as nearly control this class of business as experience and practice will permit.

Acting on the suggestion of this department many changes have been made in the manner of soliciting business, and some of the large Associations have been criticised for the expensive manner in which new business was obtained, as shown in their Semi-annual Reports, and the examination of their accounts by this department. These institutions are changing their mode as fast as possible to conform to the suggestions of this department. Two Associations are voluntarily liquidating and will dis-

continue business, but with such evidence of good faith on the part of their officers that after several conferences with the subscribers the officers and the Attorney General this department has permitted them to work out their own securities without the expense of receiverships. We have operated on the principle that, while the Bureau is safe-guarding the public and those doing business with these Associations, it should not impose extreme conditions on the diligent and honestly managed Associations. We have found the expense of operating the Associations in the smaller communities especially economical. In many instances men among the most prominent and influential, giving their experience as well as their time practically without compensation upon the directorate of local institutions solely for the good of the Associations and the benefits to be derived to the community therefrom.

There are now twenty-seven approved Building and Loan Associations holding certificates of authority from this department to do business in the State. This department has collected \$1,125.00 fees during the eleven months the law has been in operation, ending November 30, 1908.

#### FUNDING INSURRECTION INDEBTEDNESS.

The Sixteenth General Assembly passed an act authorizing the Governor, the Treasurer and the Secretary of State to issue negotiable 3 per cent. per annum interest bearing coupon bonds of the State of Colorado. The Treasurer is directed to dispose of these bonds at not less than par, and out of the proceeds pay the outstanding certificates of indebtedness resulting from the insurrections of 1899, 1903 and 1904. The act further provides an Auditing Board consisting of the Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of State, State Treasurer and the Attorney General, authorized and directed to examine *all* original accounts and vouchers, and determine whether they are a proper charge against the State. As a member of this Board you are aware that this work was taken up and completed, but the effect of the panic of 1907 on the bond market made it impossible to sell a 3 per cent. interest bearing bond at par. Up to the present time no bid has been secured for those bonds on the conditions imposed by the act, consequently the bonds have not been issued and the certificates are still outstanding.

#### PUBLIC EXAMINER.

The report of the Public Examiner, filed in the Auditor's office, shows that the books and accounts of all the State institutions have been examined during the year 1908. Also the records and accounts of various State departments have been examined and reported upon.

A uniform system of accounting and reporting for all State and County officials and for State institutions will be installed January 1st, 1909, as provided by law.

The act creating this department contemplates the examination and supervision of all public accounts of State and County officials and State institutions. It is clearly impossible for the Public Examiner and one Deputy to carry out the intent and purpose of the law in a satisfactory manner. I would, therefore, recommend that the next legislature allow this department two more deputies.
