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

To His Excellency,
JOHN F. SHAFROTH,
Governor of Colorado.

Sir: In accordance with the provisions of law, I herewith submit my biennial report of this department. It contains, in addition to the usual financial statements and estimates of the Auditor's office, a statement of the Inheritance Tax collected and due the State. My purpose has been not only to maintain this office at the highest standard, but to still further increase its efficiency. (See separate reports of the Bureau of Building and Loan Associations and Public Examiner).

Appropriations made by the Sixteenth General Assembly from the General Revenue Fund and from the Internal Improvement Fund, aggregating \$2,466,467.25, have been placed upon the books of this office. The Seventeenth General Assembly appropriated from the General Revenue and the Internal Improvement Fund the sum of \$3,703,205.19, which is \$1,236,737.94 more than the Sixteenth General Assembly appropriated from the same Funds.

Warrants have been issued against the Revenue of 1909 to the extent of \$1,338,010. These warrants have all been called and there is a surplus remaining to the credit of the Revenue of 1909 of approximately \$16,580.

Up to the present time warrants have been issued against the Revenue of 1910, amounting to \$1,263,455, and after the taxes are collected from the 1910 revenue, I estimate that there will be a surplus of \$165,279, in the General Revenue Fund of 1910, or a total surplus of \$181,859 for the period. This does not include the appropriations made for the maintenance of the Capitol building nor for the building of the State Museum.

The report of the Canvassing Board will show that the Constitutional Amendment Funding the State Warrants has carried, and the Outstanding Interest-bearing Warrants, amounting approximately, principal and interest, on November 30, 1910, to the

sum of \$2,114,762.96, will be taken up by a Bond Issue. In this connection I desire to recommend that the Eighteenth General Assembly make an appropriation to cover the expense of the necessary lithograph work, and additional clerical assistance if needed.

Senate Bill No. 122, authorizing the issuance of Bonds for outstanding certificates of indebtedness, has not stated any time in which interest would cease on outstanding certificates of indebtedness, therefore this Legislature will have to pass an act setting the date on which interest will cease on the present outstanding certificates and indebtedness, as it has omitted that in S. B. 122. Serious complications will arise with this bond issue if the date is not set for which interest should cease on outstanding certificates and indebtedness.

CASES IN WHICH AUDITOR OF STATE'S OFFICE IS INTERESTED.

The General Assembly, at the 1909 session, as an additional aid to the State departments in checking up the expenditures and amounts paid out by the different State departments, enacted the following provision in the general appropriation bill:

"All warrants issued under the provisions of this act shall be made only to the party to whom the State has become indebted, including all subordinates and employes of departments and all accounts for services rendered and items furnished shall, before the issuance of a warrant therefor, be itemized and sworn to before an officer authorized by law to administer oaths, etc."

This provision of the law was lived up to to the letter by all persons coming within the above class except as to the office of Secretary of State. One Thomas F. Dillon, a deputy in said department, saw fit, evidently with the permission of his department, to question the right of the Legislature to enact any such provision, as well as the right and authority of the Auditor to carry the same into effect, and, as a consequence and for reasons satisfactory to that office, Dillon refused to make the affidavit complying with the above provision. The Auditor in turn refused to issue the warrant without such affidavit, and a mandamus proceeding was instituted in the District Court of the city and county of Denver, requiring the Auditor to issue the

warrant without such affidavit being furnished. This order was issued by the court, Greeley W. Whitford, judge, presiding, and an appeal was taken to the Supreme Court of the State of Colorado, which appeal is now pending in said court, being case No. 6903, entitled "Roady Kenehan, Auditor of the State of Colorado, plaintiff in error, vs. Thomas F. Dillon, Deputy Secretary of State, defendant in error."

It is the purpose of the Auditor to carry this case through to completion, for the reason that he concurs in the evident purpose of the legislative department, and considers it important to put a check upon the promiscuous payment of money by any State department without satisfactory evidence being furnished that such service was in reality rendered or that the items to be paid for were in truth furnished to the State.

I still believe that the same diligence should be used in checking the State funds and the same evidence furnished concerning the items paid for as would be required by any individual or up-to-date business corporation, and I consider that the refusal to comply with any such reasonable legislative requirement, especially by the members of the executive departments, should not be tolerated.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

STATE FINANCES.

The present State Treasurer and State Auditor have had the entire system of State finances impressed upon them as being erroneous in its indefiniteness, uncertainty and unreliability as to available funds at all times. We also find many comments in the Supreme Court decisions of our State calling attention to the existing conditions in former administrations. Not only does this condition handicap the various State institutions and departments in their active work, but the executive department proper is constantly and painfully embarrassed by the question of how far the available funds for any biennial period may reach until the time for the intelligent use thereof is often passed.

I especially recommend that a resolution be passed appointing a committee, to consist of ten members—two of whom shall be selected by the Senate; two by the House of Representatives and two by Governor Shafroth—to act with Governor Shafroth, State Treasurer Galligan, State Auditor Kenehan and the Attorney General in perfecting and recommending a plan to the General Assembly whereby ways and means may be provided for placing all State departments and State institutions upon an absolutely cash basis.

APPROPRIATIONS.

I also recommend that a law be provided requiring that all bills carrying "appropriations" should, before passage, be presented to the Attorney General for approval, both as to legality and form. This recommendation is prompted by the haphazard manner in which appropriation bills of all classes have heretofore been passed, constantly placing the State Auditor and State Treasurer in the unfortunate position of having to determine in each individual case whether payment under such appropriations should or should not be made, thus requiring these officers to shoulder the responsibility relative thereto. Many embarrassing questions under this head have been presented during the present biennial period—questions which were incapable of determination without disappointment and dissatisfaction. This condition should be remedied.

OFFICE HOURS.

While the hours during which offices in the State House are kept open for business are generally understood to be between 9 a. m. and 5 p. m., there seems to be no statute governing the

matter, and I would recommend that the Legislature pass a law defining the hours during which such offices should remain open to the public for the transaction of business.

GENERAL INCIDENTAL FUND.

The Seventeenth General Assembly appropriated \$65,425.00 for the general incidental fund. The Auditing Board, contrary to precedent, has economized to such an extent as to keep its expenditures not merely within the sum appropriated, but has turned back to the general revenue fund an unexpended balance of \$10,114.90. (See report of general incidental fund, page 33, in report.)

SCALP BOUNTY CERTIFICATES.

The amount of scalp bounty certificates on file in this office now aggregates \$50,000.00. As has been repeatedly urged, provision should be made to pay these claims; and as the certificates continue to be filed with the Auditor of State, the Legislature should either repeal the present law or make provision for their payment.

TRIPS OUTSIDE OF THE STATE.

I find that it has been the custom of many of the heads of different boards and of some of the different departments to make "joy trips" into different States and parts of the country upon quasi State affairs at the expense of the State. The present Auditor, following a rule laid down in the third volume of the Court of Appeals report, page 11, in the case of Carlisle vs. Hurd, has disallowed the bills for all of these "joy trips." In this way a large saving in the expense account has been made; besides, the precedent has now been thoroughly established that these trips should not in the future be made at the expense of the State.

THE SHORT APPROPRIATION BILL.

The General Assembly passes a short appropriation bill, covering the months of December, January, February and March, providing for the payment of the salaries of the several departments.

As this short bill is not usually passed until the last of February, all of the clerks and employes of the departments, whose employment is not provided for by law except by appropriation in the general appropriation bills, are left without their salaries during a period of from two to three months in each biennial period.

The absolute necessity for continuing the employment of clerks and employes during this period is generally recognized, and it has been the practice to continue the employment of such clerks without any authority of law, trusting to the Legislature to make provision in the short appropriation bill.

I would recommend, therefore, that such legislation be enacted as will provide for the employment of necessary clerks and employes in the several departments of State, and fix their

salaries in such manner as to make them continuing appropriations. This would do away with the short appropriation bill.

SALARY OF AUDITOR OF STATE.

The Auditor of State, being the protector of the people's money, and thus one of the most important officers of the State, should receive, at least, a salary equal to that of the State Treasurer. The new departments added to his office in the past few years have multiplied his duties, and have made the office one of very great responsibility. The Bureau of Building and Loan Associations, the Inheritance Tax Department and the Public Accountant Department are all now a part of the Auditor's office.

I would recommend, also, that, in addition to the increase in salary for the Auditor of State, the Legislature provide a contingent fund, out of which his traveling expenses may be drawn. His duties require frequent visits to the various counties and to our public institutions, and as no provision is made for these expenses he is compelled to pay them.

UNCALLED FOR WARRANTS AND CERTIFICATES OF INDEBTEDNESS.

I find the following uncalled-for warrants and certificates of indebtedness, amounting to about \$1,800.00, dating back a number of years, which have been passed down from one administration to another, with indications that many of them have been abandoned and the payee's whereabouts unknown. I would recommend that some action be taken by the Legislature whereby these may be turned into the general fund:

BOND OF STATE OFFICERS AND APPOINTEES.

The law properly requires that many of the State officers and appointees who handle public moneys shall furnish indemnity bonds to the State. In most of these instances, surety companies' bonds are required. With one or two exceptions, no provision has been made by law for the payment of the premiums on said bonds by the State, and, consequently, the officials are required to pay the premium out of their own pockets. A number of these bonds required to be given amount to many thousands of dollars and necessitate the payment of large premiums therefor.

The bond of the State Treasurer is \$1,000,000, and, if furnished by a surety company, would require the payment of a premium of \$2,500, or more than 40 per cent. of that officer's salary for one year.

I regard the giving of personal bonds in many instances as inimical and detrimental to the public service, in that many officers are frequently compelled to place themselves under obligations to the persons becoming sureties upon the bonds, and sometimes the obligations are of such a character as to give to third parties undue influence and control over the disposition and custody of the moneys indemnified.

Another advantage derived from the bonds of surety companies is that in case of defaults, indemnity is generally made with promptness; whereas individual sureties always resist payment as long as possible, hoping thereby to escape it altogether or to force some beneficial compromise.

In view of the foregoing, I recommend that an act be passed by the General Assembly providing surety bonds to be

given by all persons from whom bonds are required under law, and that a sufficient appropriation be made in each instance to pay the premium upon such bonds.

Such a law, when enacted, would enable the State and its officers to exercise full control and direction over the deposit and custody of public moneys which, under present conditions, is sometimes impossible, and would, I believe, result in better safeguarding of the public funds, and generally promote the interests of the State.

INTERNAL IMPROVEMENT FUNDS AND THE STATE HIGHWAY
COMMISSION.

I recommend that the whole amount of the internal Improvement Fund be placed for the use of the State Highway Commission. The Legislature should make an appropriation covering the total receipts of the Internal Improvement Fund and the Income Fund for the period, and the same should be transferred to the State Highway Commission for its use.

PUBLIC EXAMINER.

The report of the Public Examiner, filed in the Auditor's office, shows that the books and accounts of all the State Institutions have been examined during the years 1909 and 1910. Also the records and accounts of various State Departments have been examined and reported upon.

A uniform system of accounting and reporting for all State and County Officials and for State Institutions was installed January 1, 1909, as provided by law. (See report of Public Examiner.)

REPORT

OF

Bureau of Building and Loan Associations

To His Excellency,
JOHN F. SHAFROTH,
Governor of the State of Colorado.

Sir:

This Department has to report that the Building and Loan Associations proper doing business in this State have had a wonderfully successful period since the last report, notwithstanding the fact that they have had to compete with incorporations doing a very unsatisfactory business in the State under various names, commonly known as Contract Investment Companies and Contract Loan Companies, Home Companies, etc. Most of these corporations are foreign and are doing business under a claimed authority under and by virtue of our General Incorporation Acts, and without coming under the jurisdiction of either the Banking Department or Bureau of Building and Loan Associations.

These companies take advantage of the popularity of Building and Loan Associations and draw their contracts, applications and agreements in such form as to mislead the public into the belief that they are in reality Building and Loan Associations, at the same time claiming to the various State Departments throughout the United States that they are not Building and Loan Associations. As a consequence, we find that in a great many states of the Union they are operating in the same unsatisfactory manner as in Colorado. Many of the more conservative states of the Union have passed very stringent, and in many cases prohibitory laws to govern these institutions.

Their practices, concerning which the public should be officially warned, consist generally of an agent approaching a citizen, whom he understands to be desirous of purchasing a home, and who is known to be of limited means. The representation made to the would-be purchaser by the agent is along the line that, if he will subscribe to a certain contract, that after paying a very limited amount of money, often less than \$100, that the company will advance him a loan of perhaps \$1,000, to be paid back in small monthly payments at a very low rate of interest; at the same time presenting an application in writing for the would-be investor to sign. This is usually signed by the purchaser, without reading, and delivered with \$20 to \$50 in

money to the agent, and by him sent in to the home office of such corporation. After making several additional payments, the purchaser becomes anxious about his investment or loan, and upon investigation learns for the first time that the promises made by the agent are claimed by the company to be made without authority, and that he will have to wait until the \$1,000, or other sum mentioned in the contract is accumulated from what seems to this Department to be an impossible source. He will then visit some State Department and learn that his signed application bears out, on its face, the contention of the company; that he will only be entitled to money when same is accumulated. Too often he will then lapse the amount he has paid in to the company, who will go on its way rejoicing, only to gather in new applications. These companies and agents are very diligent and sure that "a signed statement of the applicant," as well as the "wording of the contract," which he accepts, are in such form as to corroborate the statement of the agent who received the application (as against the understanding of the applicant), and consequently close the door, in so far as proofs are concerned, to criminal prosecutions.

In addition to the above faults, these contracts usually provide, on their face, in plain language, that of the amount paid in by the applicant monthly, about 75 per cent. goes to the Loan or Investment Fund; about 20 per cent. is to go as expense for operating the company, and about 5 per cent. to a reserve fund, ostensibly to insure the applicant that his 75 per cent. will be safe. And while we do not entirely excuse the public or individuals for signing up such applications and accepting contracts, so impossible on their face, it is surprising to find how many persons of intelligence will be taken in by these schemes, in preference to investing their means with legitimate Building and Loan Associations, or with established Banking Institutions; this Department feels that an absolutely *prohibitory law* should be enacted by the next Legislature preventing the possibility of the public falling into any such traps.

Many people rely upon their faith in the laws of the State governing corporations as to whether or not such corporations conduct their business legitimately, and when they find that a corporation is permitted by law to carry on a certain work, they assume that their manner of doing business, as well as their authority, has been investigated, and that the transactions of such companies have the law's endorsement.

Senate Bill No. 270, entitled "A Bill for an Act to Regulate Bond and Investment Companies, and to provide for the protection of persons dealing with them, and to provide penalties for the violation thereof, and to repeal all Acts and parts of Acts in conflict therewith," was introduced at the last General Assembly, upon the recommendation of this Department; and would, we believe, have had the desired effect along this line, but failed to become a law; we would recommend similar action to the next General Assembly.

While, as heretofore indicated, the Building and Loan Associations proper, have quite generally come within the law governing such institutions, we recognize many defects in the law itself, especially in respect to withdrawals, management and expenses permitted to associations generally, we would recommend that all laws on this subject receive the careful attention of the incoming administration, and that the same be modernized and brought down to present day requirements in every detail.

We would recommend in such law that greater authority be given to the inspector, prescribing rules governing the management of associations generally, as well as directing the manner and mode of keeping books, etc., and that the cumbersome method at present provided for reaching insolvent or other associations violating the law, should be amended in such way as to place the authority directly into the hands of the Bureau of Building and Loan Associations.

This Department made certain recommendations at the last session of the Legislature along these lines, and a Bill was also introduced covering to a considerable extent these questions; however, the Bill did not pass, and we would suggest that the matter be taken up thoroughly at the next session of the General Assembly; there are many defects in the present law, which, if corrected, would not only benefit the legitimate Building and Loan Associations themselves, but also protect the members from absolute hardships.

Upon the recommendation of this Department, the Attorney General caused one association—The Colorado Investment Loan Company—to be placed in the hands of a receiver during the last year, upon the grounds that the said association was insolvent. The affairs of this association are being closed up under the direction of the District Court in the City and County of Denver.

Only one new association was authorized during the past year, to wit: The Golden Building and Loan Association, incorporated in June, 1910.

We believe that it is the province of this Department to not only safe-guard the public and those doing business with Building and Loan Associations, but that a like effort should be shown to protect the diligent and honestly managed Building and Loan Associations themselves from out-law competition.

There are now thirty-nine Building and Loan Associations coming within the jurisdiction of this Department; an extract from the reports of these associations to this Department, covering the six months' period immediately preceding June 30, 1910, is embraced in this report.

This Department has collected and turned into the State Treasury \$2,948.25 in fees during the biennial period ending November 30, 1910. We have on hand considerable data as to the laws of states other than Colorado covering this class of institutions, which the Department will furnish as an aid to the next

General Assembly in their effort to perfect our laws along these lines.

The special laws governing Building and Loan Associations are embraced in Sections 950 to 974, inclusive, of the "Revised Statutes of Colorado, 1908."


