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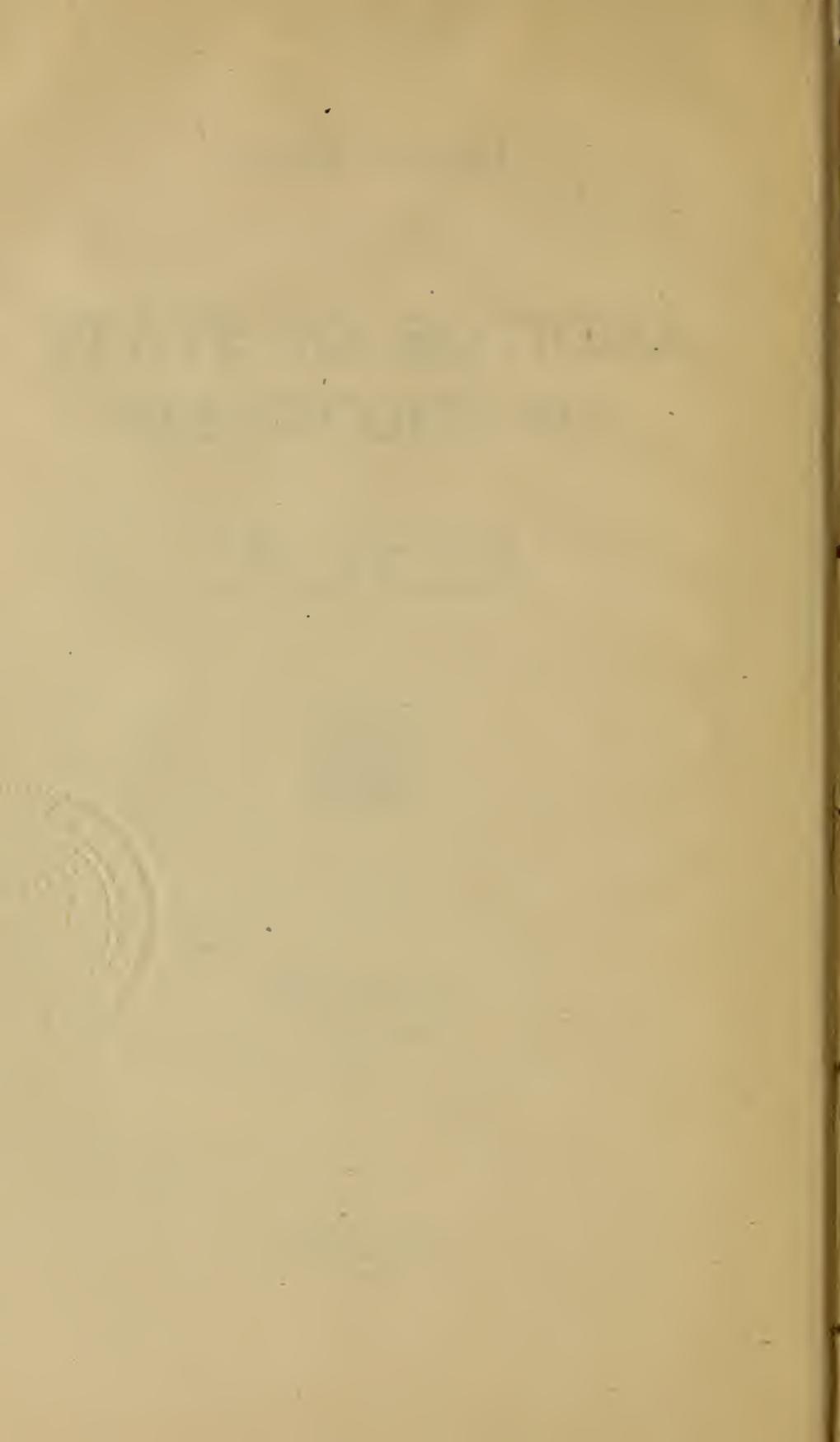

To His Excellency,
GEO. A. CARLSON,
Governor of the State of Colorado.

Sir: Acting under the provisions of law requiring reports from various officers of the executive departments of the state government, I have the honor to submit herewith a report of the transactions of the Auditor's department for the period from December 1, 1914, to November 30, 1916, inclusive.

A careful perusal of this report will show the receipts and disbursements of every penny of state money handled in each of the departments and institutions of the state. The state is to be congratulated upon the condition of its splendid financial standing at this time.

The last General Assembly made appropriations amounting to \$3,147,250.09, all of which has been disbursed save and except such balances as remain unexpended in various appropriations. In addition to this amount the Auditor and Treasurer have paid salaries, the same being designated as continuous, and for which no specific appropriation reached this office, these officers being statutory, and the salaries for which were paid upon the advice of the Attorney General. These salaries amounted to \$15,450.00.

PENITENTIARY DEFICIENCY, 1914

The State Penitentiary issued deficiency vouchers amounting to \$33,879.48 for the year 1914, an appropriation for which was made by the Twentieth General Assembly to be paid out of

the revenues of the biennial period of 1915-1916. Bills to the amount of \$33,398.51 have been paid, leaving a balance of \$480.97 in the fund.

From labor troubles in the Southern Colorado Coal Fields during the year 1914, items of expense in connection therewith amounting to \$168,600.00 were paid by this administration.

The Barela-Wycoff Legislative Contest cases totaling an expense of \$5,896.00, and the Mayer, Boyle and Humason Contest, the expense of which was \$1,102.00, an appropriation for both these having been made by the Twentieth General Assembly and approved by you, have been paid.

The state's share of the building of the bridge across the Grand River at Grand Junction during the year 1909, amounting to \$6,153.89, was paid.

The Twentieth General Assembly made an appropriation of \$15,000.00 for the State Board of Immigration to put it on a workable basis. All of this appropriation has been exhausted except the sum of \$148.49, the same being paid out upon vouchers issued by said board.

An appropriation was made by the last General Assembly for a Memorial to the Spanish War Veterans in the sum of \$1,500.00. The board which was appointed to carry out this project has entered into contract, a part of which has been complied with, and the sum of \$750.00 has been paid out on this, and the balance will be paid upon the presentation of vouchers for the same.

SOLDIERS' AND SAILORS' HOME.

The provisions heretofore made for the maintenance of the Soldiers' and Sailors' Home seem to have been inadequate for the purpose of properly taking care of the veterans who reside at that institution. In making a personal survey of the home I found quite a number of cottages which have been erected for the purpose of private homes for old soldiers who have their wives with them. There are not enough of these cottages to provide homes for all of these veterans.

It seems to me that, in view of the splendid service these people have rendered our country, that the state should provide them with every comfort possible commensurate with the needs of the case.

Permit me to suggest that an appropriation be made for the purpose of erecting more of these cottages in order that the old soldier, who has a wife, can have her with him to comfort him in his declining years.

COLORADO STATE INSANE ASYLUM

The Twentieth General Assembly passed appropriations out of the general revenue of the state amounting to \$226,500 and \$30,000 from special funds for the construction of buildings at the asylum, and the furnishing of the same in order that the insane

of the state, numbering approximately 350, and who were confined in hospitals and private institutions throughout the state at a large expense to the various counties of the state, might be taken care of. These buildings have been completed and are now occupied by these unfortunates. This is the first time in many years that the state has been able to take care of all of the insane. The appropriations for these buildings have been paid.

RELIEF OF EDITH LESTER

An appropriation was made for the relief of Mrs. Edith Lester, whose husband was killed while in the service of the state militia. This has been paid in full.

Upon referring to the detailed report, which follows, it will be seen that many of the smaller claims have been adjusted and paid:

CONTINUOUS APPROPRIATIONS

No specific appropriations having reached this office for the payment of the salaries and expenses of the Boiler Inspectors, Free Employment Bureau No. 2 and Mineral Superintendent of the Land Board, upon advice of the Attorney General that these officers were statutory, we have paid these salaries, the same amounting to \$15,450.00.

Every appropriation made to the various Educational Institutions of the state has been paid in full. This is the first time in the past six years that the institutions have received the full amount of their appropriations.

STATE LEVY AND ASSESSED VALUATION

The levy for all state purposes for the year 1915 was increased seventy one-hundredths of a mill, which was caused by reason of the fact that the people of the state voted fifty hundredths of a mill for state roads. An additional levy for educational institutions amounting to twenty one-hundredths of a mill was made, making the total levy for all state purposes for the year 1915, two and ten one-hundredths of a mill; that for the year 1916 is two and seven-hundredths of a mill, or three-hundredths of a mill less, which was taken from the general revenue of the state. The assessed valuation for the state for the year

1914 was \$1,311,210,345.00
1915 was \$1,249,199,210.00
1916 was \$1,211,697,270.00

It will be noticed that a material reduction of assessed valuation throughout the state has been made, and in consequence the tax-paying public have benefited thereby.

STATE ROADS

The total amount of revenue for the State Road Fund is \$936,164.62. There has been disbursed the sum of \$770,736.63, leaving a balance of \$165,427.99 to the credit of this fund. There is in the Internal Improvement Permanent Fund a balance of \$57,941.36, and in the Internal Improvement Income Fund a balance of \$46,174.58, or a balance in all three of these funds amounting to \$269,544.93 subject to disbursement by the State Highway Commission for good roads purposes. A statement of these funds will be found in this report, showing the balances, transfers, receipts and disbursements for the period, and from what source the revenue is derived. Doubtless the report of the Highway Commission will evidence the manner and for what purpose these disbursements have been made.

INHERITANCE TAX

Because of the fact that a large amount of inheritance tax for the years 1915 and 1916 has not been collected by that department, it is impossible at this time to state exactly what the amount of inheritance tax will be for the period. There has been, however, paid into the treasury the sum of \$936,226.05 collected by that department and applicable to the present biennial period.

ESTIMATE OF REVENUES FOR THE YEARS 1917-1918

Below I hand you my estimate of the revenues for the years 1917-1918, based upon the collections by the various departments in 1915 and 1916, and tax levy and valuation of 1916 of \$1,211,697,270.00:

It will be noticed that in the matter of inheritance tax I have estimated the sum of \$300,000.00 for the period, as you understand it is impossible for any one to make an intelligent estimate of this source of revenue at this time.

Referring to inheritance tax, it is my opinion that this revenue should be placed in a sinking fund for the purpose of meeting any unforeseen contingencies of the state, or for the purpose of placing the state on a cash basis when sufficient revenue is in this fund. In case this is done, the Legislature should make provision by way of tax levy to meet the general obligations of the state without using this fund for that purpose.

MINIMUM WAGE FOR TEACHERS

Included in this report will be found a statement showing the amount paid to the various counties of the state under the Minimum Wage Law. The total paid out by the state during the biennial period amounted to \$41,233.71.

BOARD OF CAPITOL MANAGERS

This department has been on a cash basis during the past eleven months. The Colorado State Museum, which was built under the supervision of this board at a cost of \$500,000.00, has been completed and all bills against the same paid. All outstanding warrants have been called in and paid. At the close of the biennial period a balance is shown to their credit in the sum of \$11,113.86. This is the first time in the history of the state that this board has been completely out of debt.

In the year 1891 the Board of Capitol Managers borrowed from the "Internal Improvement Fund" the sum of \$150,000.00 to be used for the completion of the Capitol Building. None of which had been paid back to said "Internal Improvement Fund" until the present Treasurer and Auditor made a transfer of the sum of \$60,000.00 from the Capitol Building Fund to the "Internal Improvement Fund" or "Good Roads Fund" as a partial payment on this loan. This was done for the purpose of enabling the Highway Commission to complete certain unfinished roads in the state, and was warranted for doing so under Section 2794 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Colorado.

MOBILIZATION COLORADO NATIONAL GUARD

In June, 1916, the President of the United States authorized the mobilization of the Colorado National Guard, or, in other words, to put the same upon a war basis. This has been done, and the Colorado Regiment is now at the front.

The expense of the mobilization has cost the sum of \$49,613.05. Certificates of indebtedness to the amount of \$52,340.95 have been issued, but refunds in the amount of \$2,727.90 have been made for various reasons, leaving a net expense as stated

above, an itemized statement of which will be transmitted to the Twenty-first General Assembly for their action.

In my opinion, some of this expense should be a charge upon the general government and the state reimbursed. This is a matter, however, for the Adjutant General's office to take under consideration.

PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

There was appropriated for the use of the Public Utilities Commission for the years 1915 and 1916 the sum of . . . \$63,000.00

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of which there has been disbursed and transferred the sum of \$78,283.10, leaving a balance in the Appropriation Fund amounting to \$966.40, and in the cash fund \$69.63, a total of \$1,036.03. During the last biennial period the expenses of this department were \$50,130.55 more than that of the years 1913 and 1914. This is caused by reason of the fact that during the years 1913 and 1914 this department was known as the Railroad Commission for twenty months, and Public Utilities Commission for four months of that period, and the expenses of which amounted to \$28,153.05, and also for the reason that the department has been enlarged to the extent of carrying on the activities of the board, by way of employment of engineers, inspectors, etc., making this a Public Utilities Commission in fact as well as in name.

INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION OF COLORADO

The Twentieth General Assembly enacted a law creating what is known as the Industrial Commission of Colorado. An appropriation of \$50,000.00 was made for the maintenance of the department, and because of the fact that this sum was inadequate to pay all of the expenses, clerks had to be loaned from other departments to assist them from time to time. This appropriation was exhausted entirely, with the exception of \$14.85 balance remaining at the close of the biennial period.

An appropriation in the sum of \$20,000.00 was made towards paying premiums for the Compensation Act, which was attached to that of the Industrial Commission. All of this amount has been paid out except a balance of \$1,241.45.

The Compensation Insurance Fund of the State, the same being created under the Industrial Act, shows a balance on November 30, 1916, of \$151,245.59.

I would suggest the advisability of sufficient appropriation being made to cover the expenses of this department in order that the work may be carried on in an efficient manner.

The Workmen's Compensation Act requires that the Auditor obtain information from the various taxing bodies of the state, such as counties, cities, and school districts, as to the salaries paid

by each of them for services other than elective officers for the purpose of fixing the premiums. The Auditor's office necessarily must disburse the funds of this department and it requires a great amount of extra work as compared to what has been done prior to the passage of this act. This work has been done through this office during the past two years. I would suggest that the Workmen's Compensation Act be amended to the extent that said department look after the matter of securing this information, and the sending out of the charges against the various taxing bodies, as it seems to me that this is the proper department to do the work.

DENVER UTILITY COMPANIES—DELINQUENT TAX

After coming into office I discovered that the Board of Commissioners of the City and County of Denver had made a compromise settlement with the Denver Tramway Company and the Denver Gas & Electric Company on account of their delinquent taxes. In making this compromise with these corporations, the sum of \$25,059.09 of state taxes was included in the reduction given. The representatives of these companies were asked to call at this office with reference to the same, and in consequence the state's portion of the taxes, as stated above, was paid into the State Treasury without litigation.

WALSH ESTATE

The State Examiners of this department discovered that a judgment had been rendered in the Court of Arapahoe County against the Walsh Estate for taxes for the years 1907, 1908, and 1909 in the sum of \$78,338.25 as principal, of which the sum of \$10,073.25 was state taxes.

A hearing was held with reference to this by myself to which witnesses were subpoenaed, a copy of the testimony in the case being on file in this office. It was discovered that the County Commissioners of Arapahoe County had authorized a settlement of this amount (\$78,338.25) for the sum of \$24,500.00 and that they had disbursed the proportion due the state from that amount by way of paying various accounts against the county, the state not receiving its proportionate share of the \$24,500.00. Subsequent to this hearing the officers of Arapahoe County paid into the State Treasury the sum of \$3,150.36, together with \$295.77 as interest, a total of \$3,446.13. This was the state's proportion of the \$24,500.00. After deducting the principal amount due the state from the state's proportion of the judgment (\$10,073.25) there still remains a balance due the state from the County of Arapahoe the sum of \$6,922.89, together with interest on the same, for which I believe the officers of Arapahoe County, who conducted this transaction, or the county, should be held responsible, as you are aware the county is responsible to the state for its taxes under the law.

In making this settlement with the Walsh Estate, the state had no part in the same, neither was the State Auditor advised of the cancellation of these taxes for any reason whatsoever, except as was discovered in the hearing referred to. This amount, \$6,922.89, still remains charged on the books of the Auditor's office against the County of Arapahoe.

SURVEY COMMITTEE OF STATE AFFAIRS

Chapter 161 of the Session Laws, 1915, establishes a committee to make a survey of the affairs of the State of Colorado. This law appropriated the sum of \$8,500.00 for the carrying out the purpose of the act. Of this appropriation the sum of \$7,697.56 was expended, leaving a balance in the sum of \$802.44 unexpended, a statement of which is given below:

The Auditor not being advised as to the recommendations contained in the Survey Committee's report, except in a partial way, which I understand at this time are not official, I have refrained from making many recommendations, which I believe might be beneficial. This, you understand, would necessarily cover considerable ground. The purpose of this committee, as I understand it, is to make such recommendations, and doubtless you will have their report before you so that you may be advised as to their findings.

STATE SUPPLIES

My experience, during the last two years as Auditor of State, has made it evident to me that the purchase of supplies is one of much confusion. It is the practice with all departments, when requiring supplies, to go from one executive officer to another with a requisition for authority to purchase or order such supplies. You can understand how difficult it is for the various executive officers to understand the absolute necessity of these supplies.

In my opinion, a department should be established to be known as "Commissioner of Supplies" and everything that is needed in the way of books, stationery, etc., by the state should be purchased through that department, and furnished to the various departments, taking a receipt for the same.

PUBLIC EXAMINER'S DEPARTMENT.

The Public Examiner's Department, under this office, has made examinations and reports of all the counties of the state, four of which were examined for a period covering three years; thirteen for two years, and forty-six for one year; as well as the state institutions and departments of the state. School District No. 1 of the City and County of Denver for two years, and the State Treasurer's office for a period of five years, besides taking an inventory of all the state's property. A copy of this inventory is on file in this office, and a statement of the same will be found in this report, the total of which is \$13,040,666.32. This is the first time in the history of the state that this has been done. I notice the Survey Committee recommend the taking of this inventory, but they overlooked the fact that it has been done by this administration.

Copies of the county reports have been forwarded to the various counties, and a copy of each report is on file in this office. Where shortages have been shown to exist in any particular judicial district, a copy of the report has been furnished to the District Attorney of that district. I am compelled to state here that it has seemed almost impossible to get the District Attorneys to act on these matters. A report of the Public Examiner gives a tabulated statement of each and all of the accounts of officers where they have made examinations.

I can not speak too highly of the splendid work that has been done by this department. A majority of the examiners receive but \$100.00 per month. This does not seem to me to be a proper compensation for their service, as they must, of course, be learned in their profession. I can unhesitatingly recommend that the law be so changed that the Assistant Examiners receive \$125.00 per month and expenses as the minimum. The total expense of this department during this biennial period was \$49,307.69.

BUILDING AND LOAN DEPARTMENT

The office of the Inspector of Building and Loan Associations is a department under the supervision of this office, as you know. The Deputy Inspector, during the past two years, has made a detailed examination of each of the thirty-nine Building and Loan Associations in the state, something that has never been done heretofore. A report of the Deputy Inspector of Building and Loan Associations will be found in this report showing the condition of all of the associations. This report evidences the splendid condition of these associations, and is of material interest to people having dealings with them.

SHORTAGE IN THE TREASURER'S OFFICE

The Public Examiner's Department reported to me that on the 31st day of December, 1914, there appeared a shortage in the accounts of that office, in the sum of \$9,868.50, and that this

amount was not turned over to the present State Treasurer. Suit has been brought in this case for the recovery of this money and is now pending in the District Court of the City and County of Denver.

STATE TREASURER'S OFFICE

It pleases me to be able to state, that in consequence of the relations between the office of State Treasurer, and that of the Auditor being so closely allied, and my personal knowledge of the way in which the Treasurer's office has been conducted. Treasurer Stocker and his assistants are to be congratulated for the splendid and efficient manner in which they have conducted the affairs of that office.

OFFICE FORCE

Whatever success we may have attained by way of conducting the affairs of the State Auditor's office, is not by any means entirely attributable to the head of the department. I would not have done my duty if I did not give credit to those to whom credit is due. My deputy and the assistants in all departments have performed their work in a loyal, efficient, and courteous manner, and I take pleasure in commending them for their splendid work at all times during the past two years.

STATE'S CREDIT

Never in the state's history has the state's credit been in better condition than it is today. Every warrant, every certificate of indebtedness bearing 4% interest that has been issued for the mobilization of the State Militia has been taken up in the open market at par. The bonds of the state are in great demand throughout the East; in fact the State Treasurer is unable to purchase state securities for investment in the funds that we have in the Treasury that can be used for that purpose. Every just claim against the state made during the past two years, that we have been advised of, and presented to this office, has been paid. We have endeavored to turn over to the succeeding administration a clean slate.

REPORT of INSPECTOR OF BUILDING AND LOAN ASSOCIATIONS

HON. H. E. MULNIX,
Ex-officio Inspector of Building
and Loan Associations.

Dear Sir: I have the honor to hand you herewith my report showing the condition of the Building and Loan Associations of the State. I have personally visited and made examinations of thirty-nine of these institutions, and I take great pleasure in stating, first, that your representative was treated in every instance with the utmost courtesy, and I wish to say I was agreeably surprised in going over the assets of these associations to find how little real estate they had taken in under foreclosure proceedings, when you take into consideration a long siege of depression and, of course, depreciation in values due thereto. I consider the building and loan associations of the State, as a whole, are in excellent financial condition, are officered by good representative men of their respective communities, are conducted on business principles, are economically managed and deserve the confidence and patronage of the public.

During the past two years the Garfield County Home Building and Loan Association, of Glenwood Springs, Colorado, and the Westminster Building and Loan Association of Denver, Colorado, have liquidated by paying up all the stockholders, and have ceased doing business. Upon the written opinion of the attorney general we have not recognized the Financial Contract Security Company as a building and loan association, and we have filed the articles of incorporation and authorized ten new companies to do business, viz., the Leven Savings Building and Loan Association, of Colorado Springs, Colorado; the Capitol Building and Loan Association, of Denver, Colorado; the Colorado Building and Loan Association, of Denver, Colorado; the Denver Building and Loan Association, of Denver, Colorado; the Holmbe Loan and Building Association, of Pueblo, Colorado; the Markey Building and Loan Association, of Denver, Colorado; the Newnam Building and Loan Association, of Trinidad, Colorado; the Rambo Savings, Building and Loan Association, of Pueblo, Colorado; the Western Savings, Building and Loan Association, of Pueblo, Colorado, and the Wildin Savings, Building and Loan Association, of Pueblo, Colorado.

I would recommend that the present appropriation for traveling expenses be very materially increased, as this amount is entirely inadequate to make proper yearly examinations, in my opinion the values of real estate and collateral securities of all the associations should be thoroughly looked into, which would require a longer stay in each place where there is an association, and, naturally, would necessitate more expense. In addition to making the examinations of the books and accounts of the associations of the State, I have offered a good many suggestions as to the way of conducting their business, which in each instance was taken in the same spirit as was intended and was adopted.

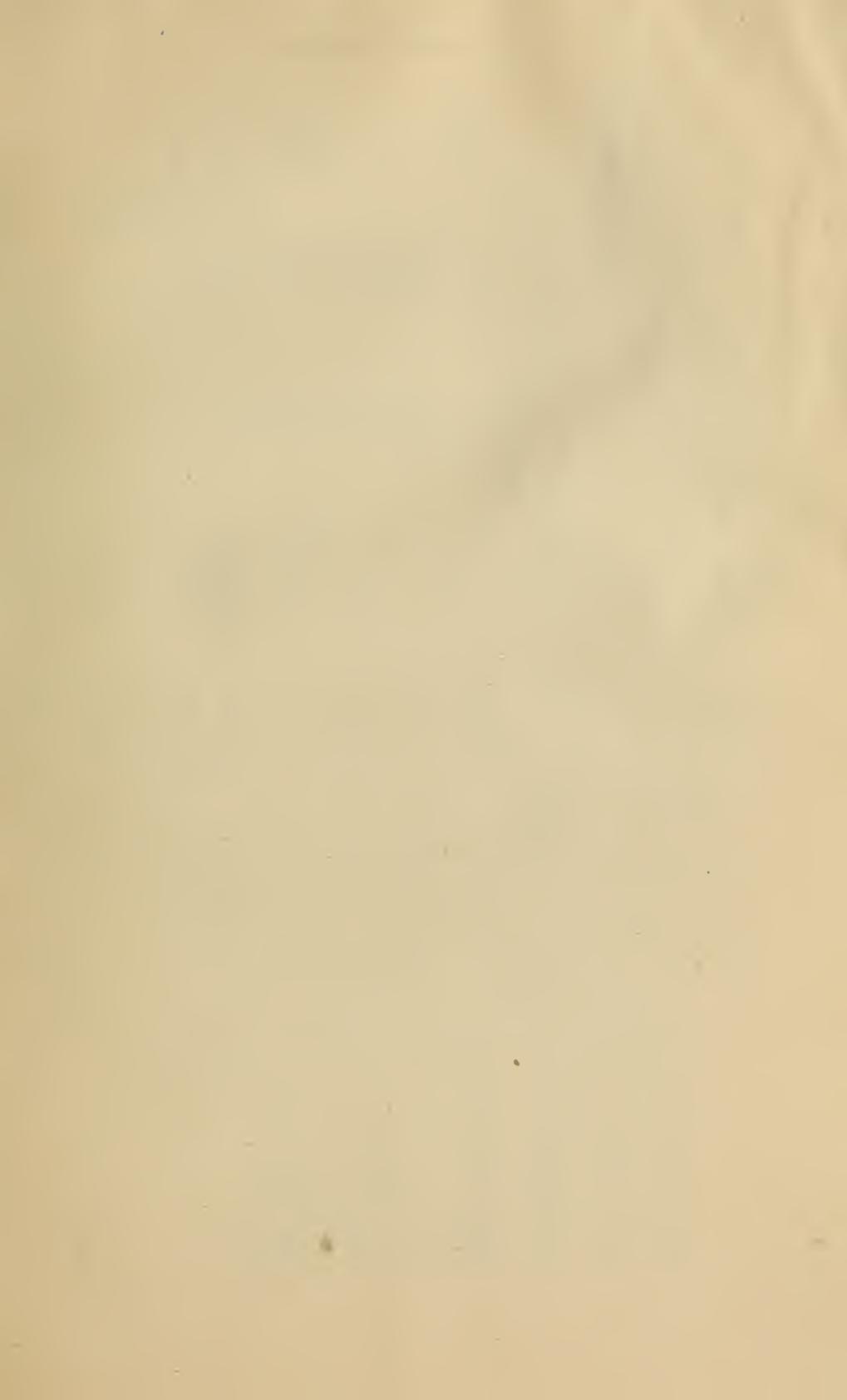
