To His Excellency,
JULIUS C. GUNTER,
Governor of the State of Colorado.

Honorable Sir: Complying with the mandatory provision in the statutes of the State of Colorado, requiring reports from the executive departments of the state, I have the honor to submit, herewith, a report of the State Auditor's Department for the period from December 1, 1916, to November 30, 1918, inclusive.

In order to effect a substantial saving to the State of Colorado, by reducing the printing cost, etc., I have combined in this published volume, in addition to the report of the Auditor's Department proper, also reports of the subsidiary departments under my direction, namely, the Public Examiner's Department and the Bureau of Inspection of Building and Loan Associations.

The 21st General Assembly made, for all purposes, including state departments, executive, legislative and judicial, and for state educational, penal and charitable institutions, war activities, etc., appropriations amounting to \$3,422,070.77, of which \$3,367,144.97 has been expended or contracted.

The estimated revenue to the General Revenue Funds, out of which these appropriations are paid, for the biennial period 1917 and 1918, amounted to \$4,092,258.31.

Deducting the total expended in satisfying these appropriations a surplus of revenue over expenditures amounting to \$725,113.34 remains.

This indicates the excellent financial condition of the State of Colorado on November 30, 1918, as all appropriations made in this administration, of every class or nature, have been satisfied and there remains a surplus of \$725,113.34, which is represented by cash on hand or collectible, and which is a working balance available for expenditures authorized by the next Legislature.

There follow, under special headings, matters coming under my supervision, all of which bear on the state's finances, and in some cases recommendations are made which I believe would effect a betterment of conditions.

STATE TAX LEVY AND ASSESSED VALUATION

The State Tax Levy for the year 1917, for all state purposes, was increased over the Levy of 1916 by 1 and 2-100 mills, and the assessed valuation increased from \$1,211,697,270.00 in 1916, to \$1,305,286,409.00 in 1917, effecting an increase in taxes collectible for state purposes in 1917 over 1916, of \$1,564,-280.60. Six very essential factors contributed to the necessity for this increase in state taxes, which are enumerated as follows:

First: The Military necessities, mobilization expense, food conservation, War Committees, Soldiers' & Sailors' Home Improvements, etc., all abnormal outlays of money due to the war. For these war measures \$326,321.60 was raised by taxation and \$140,000.00 appropriated from other state revenue, making a total, chargeable to the war, of \$466,321.60.

Second: The extreme need of new buildings for our educational institutions and the necessary repairs to the old buildings. This was a very vital need, owing to the crowded condition in these schools, and the tax levied to relieve this situation and make these fine improvements, amounted to \$391,-585.92.

Third: The very necessary enlargement of our State Hospital, at Pueblo, for the insane, which institution, prior to the time the new buildings were built, was unable to accommodate the insane committed to their custody, with the result that many were kept in County Hospitals not properly equipped for their care. This purpose and the upkeep of the institution necessitated an increased levy of \$265,599.93.

Fourth: The increased cost of maintenance of our educational and charitable institutions, due to the present high prices of all commodities, labor, etc., for which the increased levy of taxes amounted to \$280,468.82.

Fifth: The increased cost of labor and material used in maintaining the Capitol Building at Denver, together with the new State Museum. The increase in the tax levy on this account amounted to \$97,921.10.

Sixth: Local improvements to state property in the city of Denver, for which the increase in the tax levy amounted to \$112,059.52.

There follows a statement showing how the entire increase in state taxes, for the year 1917 over 1916, was applied:

In concluding remarks relative to the tax levy for 1917, I wish to call attention to the very moderate increase, amounting to \$35,873.82, raised for general state purposes to apply in defraying the salary and expense of the executive, legislative and judicial departments of state, maintenance of the penal and charitable institutions, which include the State Penitentiary, the Reformatory, the Boys' Industrial School, the Girls' Industrial School, the State Home for Dependent Children, the Mental Defectives' Home, Workshop for the Blind, etc.

When we consider that the general state's revenue fund, out of which these expenditures are made, was only increased by \$35,873.82, through the increased state tax levy, and further taking into account the fact that \$140,000.00 for Mobilization expense was paid out of this fund, it is apparent that extreme economy has been effected in this administration. It is indeed surprising that such a showing as this could be made under the present conditions, where increased costs are apparent in every walk of life.

STATE ROADS

The balance in the funds available for use on our State Highways on November 30, 1916, amounted to \$269,543.93, divided as follows:

The revenue collected for good road purposes, in the biennial period 1917 and 1918, and placed to the credit of these three funds above mentioned, amounted to \$1,862,143.20.

There was disbursed in the biennial period for good roads and chargeable to the three funds above mentioned, \$1,879,622.98, leaving available the unexpended amount of \$252,064.15, divided as follows:

PENITENTIARY DEFICIENCY

For the last several years, at the end of each biennial period, the Penitentiary has found itself without funds to carry it through the biennial period.

The Legislature should make a larger appropriation for this institution, as the inmates must be fed and clothed and the state administration should not be put in the embarrassing position, year after year, of having to get credit for the needed supplies until such time as the succeeding legislature makes the appropriation satisfying the deficiency.

ESTIMATE OF REVENUE FOR THE YEARS 1919 AND 1920—GENERAL REVENUE FUND ONLY

There follows a statement indicating the probable revenue collectible and available for appropriations for the biennial period 1919 and 1920. The estimate is based on collections made by the various departments in 1917 and 1918, and the tax levy and valuation of 1918. In figuring the revenue of the various departments the revenue to the Inheritance Tax Department is extremely uncertain, and an intelligent estimate cannot be made, therefore, I have taken, as a safe figure, an amount within the limit of this department's collections, for several years back:

In addition to this estimated amount of collectible revenue there may be added the amount of the surplus, namely \$725,113.34.

ESTIMATED EXPENDITURES

Owing to the lack of a budget system, and departments and institutions not being required to file with the office statements of their requirements for the coming biennial period, it is impossible to determine with any degree of accuracy the amount necessary. This lies wholly with the Finance and Appropriation Committees of the Legislature.

BONDED INDEBTEDNESS

This bonded debt, in the biennial period 11-30-16 to 11-30-18, has raised from \$3,762,700.00 to \$4,451,800.00; a total increase of \$689,100.00. This increase is due to the 1917 Bond series for War and Defense measures.

PRIOR YEARS' SHORTAGE IN THE TREASURER'S OFFICE

The Public Examiner's Department, through Deputy Examiner James Kerwin, reported to me a shortage of \$41,186.50.



Dear Sir: I herewith submit my report on the Building and Loan Associations for the biennial period just closing. Acting upon your suggestion, you will note I have condensed the report as much as possible.

There are at present thirty-eight Building and Loan Associations actively engaged in business, and one that is in process of dissolution. Three associations were organized during the two-year period, viz., the Florence Building and Loan Association, the Sterling Building and Loan Association, and the Colorado Springs Building and Loan Association. Twelve were dissolved, entirely without court action; viz., The Newman, Trinidad; The Western, Pueblo; The Prowers, Lamar; The Holmboe, Pueblo; The Wildin, Pueblo; The Rambo, Pueblo; The Colorado, Denver; The Capitol, Denver; The Markey, Denver; The National, Denver, and the Burnett in Denver.

Upon assuming charge of this Department I found the files laden with complaints regarding the Financial Contract Investment Company and the Financial Contract Security Company: companion companies with practically the same set of officers, doing business at the same address and one of which, the Financial Contract Security Company, had applied to this department for Certificate of Authority as a Building and Loan Association.. I made an extensive investigation into the affairs of these companies, with the result that on June 5, 1917, they were closed to further business by agreement between the companies' officers and the representatives of the Attorney General's office, the Bank Commissioner's office, the Insurance Commissioner's office, and myself. I found these companies insolvent and they are now in process of liquidation through trusteeship appointed by Wm. B. Harrison, Referee in Bankruptcy. These companies have never come under any sort of state supervision; they did not qualify as Building and Loan Associations, nor as Banks, nor as Insurance Companies, though, in a way, doing business resembling all three institutions.

Certainly some legislation should be adopted at the coming session of the Legislature to provide protection to the public against the activities of such companies as may be organized in such a fashion as to avoid the supervision provided now by statute for the examination and control of financial institutions.

I may add that there are many companies now operating in this state, and by various plans collecting money from the citizens, which are outside of any state or governmental supervision.

Building and Loan Associations of this state, taken as a whole, are in very good condition and are rendering a service to the different communities in which they operate. I think that those that are purely mutual should be exempted from the flat tax provision of the General Corporation Laws: since what they term stock is in reality only shares in community enterprise for the pooling of funds for their own use. About seven million dollars of the people's savings are invested in the Building and Loan Associations of this state.

I would recommend that an assistant to the Deputy Inspector be provided, with sufficient traveling fund appropriated to permit the annual inspection of all Building and Loan Associations that are now subject to the statute and, in addition, those concerns that are doing similar business, yet have not applied to this department for certificates of authority.

I have collected, in fees, and transmitted to the State Treasurer, \$2,793.25, during the past biennial period.

Honorable Sir: I herewith submit my report as Public Examiner for the biennial period, December 1, 1916, to November 30, 1918.

Conforming to your expressed desire to economize on the cost of publication, and taking also into consideration the opinion of the Attorney General, that the Public Examiner's Department is not authorized to publish a report separate from the State Auditor's, I have condensed the findings as far as possible.

Examinations and reports were made during this period on fifty-seven of the sixty-three counties, as well as on all State Institutions and Departments. Copies of these detailed reports are bound and on file in this office, subject to inspection at any time.

A general summary is included in this report covering all financial transactions of the State Institutions. There are also tabulated detailed statements indicating the disposition of all moneys appropriated by the Legislature.

I wish to call your attention to the deficits or indebtedness contracted, in excess of their available funds or income, by the following State Institutions:

To obviate the necessity of such overdrafts, it seems a necessity that in the case of the Penal and Charitable Institutions, larger appropriations be made.

As regards the Educational Institutions legislation should be enacted preventing these schools from exceeding their income.

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
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
