JOHN F．SHAFROTH，

I ear Nir：I submit herewith for your consideration the ammal report of the I＇ublic Examiner，Mr．H．J．Leddy，as provided in section 4，page 457，of the Nession Laws of 1909.

In the report proper you will find recommendations pertaining to state and county finances，and suggestions for the betterment of accounting condi－ fions thereill．

I desire to specifically call your attention to the I＇nblic Examiner＇s Act， appearing in the Session Laws of 1909，nuder which this department operates． This law is weak in certain respects，more particularly as regards county in－ restigations，and does not give the people of the state the proper protection．

Is an instance I will state that in certain counties，in which shortages and irregularities were discovered，the district attorneys have refused to start prosecutions or civil suits for recorery of such moneys．Such refusals may easily be accounted for when you consider that usually county officers are the heads of the ruling political party in their county，and district or county attorneys are dependent on their votes for re－election or political adrancement． To remedy this condition，and to carry out the purpose for which this depart－ ment was created，I would recommend that legislation be enacted empower－ ing and mandating that the Attorney General．on the request of the Gorernor of the state，prosecute violators of this act in the District Conrt of the proper countr．

Fon will find on page 7 in the report the technical wording of the sug． gested change of section 9 of the Public Examiner＇s Act，which，if the needed legislation is enacted，will effect the protection necessary．

The accounts of all the state institutions，boards，and bureaus have been checked for the year 1912，and it affords me pleasure to advise that all，in so far as we are able to determine from the investigation of their rouchers and books of record，are free from graft．

There hare，however，been irregnlarities disclosed in certain boards，all of which are covered in the report．

These are due more to the indefiniteness of the laws under which they operate，the laws not clearly defining or limiting the power of these boards in the matter of expenditures．

A matter of large importance to the state is the necessity of legislation mandating that all state institutions，boards，bureaus，and departments an－ nually invoice all property－real，personal，or mixed－moder their supervision．
 to investigate the comeretness and apprate the value of such items invoiced. there will be a very weat chance of graft.

No comparative statistirs, with any degree of romectuess, call be compiled showing the rxpense of one rean agatiost another for any institntion, moless such imworeries are considered.

Ss regards that part of the Poblie Examiners Aet pertaining to the in stallation of a miformstrem of arommting and reporting, I will state that, so far as the comties are concerned, forms of books and blanks for both the arombing and reporting have been compiled and sent to the county commissioncrs, with instructions as to their use. logether with an order that they be immediately installed.

Regarding the anmal reports of the county treasmers, hanseripts of which are included in this report. I will state that mumeroms errors appear in these statements. This is largely accounted for by the fact that these are the tirst reports filed mader the bew sustem of reporting, and the comnty offeers are not cutirely familiar with the maner in which the reports are to be made ont. Owing to the fact that the reports armed in this office at such a late date, it was impossible to return them for correction and include them in this rears report. Reports on the offices of county sheriffs and county rerks have been recapitulated and not transeribed in detail, on account of lack of space, the Public Examiners report heing limited by law to 300 pages.

## His Excellency, Governor John F. Shafroth, and the Members of the Nineteenth General Assembly

The following matters have come under my observation within, the last year on which some action should be taken, and recommendations for the improvement of these masatisfactory conditions are made, as follows:

## CLASSIFICATION-ORDER OF PAYMENT OF APPROPRIATIONS

On page 214 , section 166, of the Revised Statutes of 1908 appears the act governing the classification as to the order of parment of all bills carrying appropriations.

Owing to the indefiniteness of the section, it is lard to determine, in numerous cases, the class into which appropriations slould properly be thrown.

Serious questions necessitating legal advice arise under the existing law, and more especially between the first and fourth classes. There follows a transcript of this law :
"166. Order of payment of appropriations.-Sec. 1. In case the available revenues of the state for any fiscal year are insufficient to meet all the appropriations made by the general assembly for surh year, such appropriations shall be paid in the following order:

First-The ordinary expenses of the legislative, executive and judicial departments of the state govermment, and interest on any public debt. shall first be paid in full.

Second-Appropriations for all institutions. such as the penitentiary, insane asylum. industrial school and the like. wherein the inmates are confined involuntarily, shall be next paid.

Third-*Appropriations for educational and charitable institutions: Provided, That in case there are not sufficient revenues for any fiscal term
to meet in full the apropriation for educational and charitable institu－ tions，after providing for the necessary amounts appropriated acrording to paragraphs first and second of this art，then in that erent whatever there may be to apply on aceount of said appropriations for said educa－ tional and charitable institutions，shall be distributed amoug all of said institutions appropriated for ander this chase of said act）pro rata ascording as the amome ippropriated for each of said institutions shall bear to the total amount arailable for all of said educational and char－ itable institutions for said fiseal term．［L．＇99，p．21，§1，amending L．＇97， p． $21, \$ 1, ~ \uparrow 3$.

Fouth－Appropriations for ayy other officer or officers，bireaus and boards，to be paid pro rata，if there be not sufficient funds to pay in full．

Fifth－All other appropriations made pro rata out of the general fund shall next be paid from all reveumes available to meet such appro－ priations．［L．＇97，p．21，sec．1．＂
＊The third class as specified by L，＇97 was amended by adding the proviso（L．＇99，p． ए．21，sec．1）．［See alsn chapter 57，Funds．］
Legislation should be enacted clearly defining，as regards the first class． what is inteuded by the words＂legislative，executive and judicial departments of state government：＂and the fourth class should be equally explicit，to en－ able the State Anditor to determine as to what officers，bureans，or boards do not come properle under the first class，as legislative，judicial，or execntive departiments．

As regards the second and third classes．I will state that in rare cases appropriations for the same institutions appear in different rears under dif－ ferent rlasses．

If this matter of classification can be simplified，it will save murh labor on the part of the Attornes General，Auditor，and Treasurer，and will do away with the unfairness that any auditor or treasurer might manifest against a particular board or institution，in cases where the law as to rlassification is not clear．

I also recommend that a law be provided requiring that all bills currving ＂appropriations＂slomid，before passage，be presented to the Attorney General for approral as to legality，form，and whether in conflict with other legisla－ tion．This recommendation is prompted by the haphazard manner in which appropriation bills of all classes have heretofore been passed．constantly plac－ ing the State Auditor and State Treasurer in the unfortunate position of haring to determine in each indiridual case whether parment under such ap－ prompiations shomb or shonld not be made．thus requiring these officers to shoulder the responsibility relative thereto．Many embarrassing questions under this head have been presented during the present biennial period－ques－ tions which were incapable of determination without disappointment and dissatisfaction．This condition shonld be remedied．This was also recom－ mended by my prederessor．

## STATE IUDITOR

PUBLIC ENAMINER＇S ACT－SUGGESTED CHANGE
This matter is referred to in my letter of transmittal to the forernor， and it is recommended that section 9 on page 459 of the Session Laws of 1909 be repealed．and the following reconstructed section he enarted in its stead：

Scelion 9 as enacted and in force:
"section 9. The Attorney-General, Disuract on Comety attorney, shall, when called upon by the Auditor of state, the Public Examiner, aid in any investigation or matter, giving legal advice; and shall smervise the prosecution of all riolations of the provisions of this anct."
Section 9 as reconstructed for enactment:
 when called upon by the Pnblic Examiner, aid in any investigation or matter, giving legal advice, and shall supervise the proserution of all violations of this law. Whenever it shall appear to the Public Examiner that any person has committed any crime or misdemeanor under any of the laws of this state, he shall forthwith inform the district attorney of the proper district of the same, who shall prosecute any such crimes or misdemeanors as provided by law. In the erent that the distriet atorney shall faril or refuse to prosecute as aforesaid, the Public Examiner may present the matter to the Governor of the state, and unon request of the Governor the Attorney General shall prosecute any person charged with such erimes or misdemeanors, in the District court of the proper countr, and to that end the Attorney General may file informations as informant, subscribing his name or that of his deputy thereto, and all provisions of law relating to informations, except as above designated, shall be applirable in the trials of surl rimes and misdemeanors.

In all cases where it shall appear to the Public Examiner that any moneys are due or owing to any county, public institution, or other public body other than the state, coming within the provisions of this act, from any person, firm, association or corporation, or public officer. or whenerer it shall appear to the Public Examiner that a course of action exists in favor of any county, public institution, or other public body other than the state, coming within the provisions of this act, against any person, firm, association, corporation, or public officer, for the parment or recorery of money or otherwise, it shall be his duty to present such matters to the proper officers of the county or public institution, as the case mar be, and to the attorney, if any, required or authorized by law to bring action for the payment or recovery of such moner or otherwise: and in the event of any failure or refusal to act in the bringing of such action, the Public Examiner may present any such matters to the judge of the District Court of the proper county, who shall, if he finds that the officer required or authorized to bring such suit is interested or negligent in the performance of his duty, appoint some competent attorney of record. who shall be authorized to begin and carrer on said action, in belaalf of any such countr, public institution, or other public body, as the case may he, and as its attorney, and such attorney shall be entitled to such compensation for his services as the court mas fix, to be paid by the county, public institution or public body in whose behalf the action is brought. Except as above designated, all provisions of law now relating to the bringing of any such civil actions shall be applicahle."

PLBLISH 1N LOCAL PAPERS PL'BLIC EXAMINER'S REPORTS
It is recommended that legislation be enacted making it necessary for the county commissioners to have published in their local papers the findings, as reported by the Public Examiner, as regards the investigations of country offices and officers.

Such publication to inchate the eomplete report on all fee offeres, and any statement as regards owerpatment of salaries or manthorized paymemts of whaterer matmere.

## ALL NTATE INI COUNTY OFFMCDRA

 OR DEI'ARTMENTV

It has appeared from our investigations that certain laws afferting the collection of pmble reveme have in some rases been orerlooked, and that unanthorized payments have, with extreme frequency, been made by various state and combly otheers. Such payments are violations of the statntes, hut are largely acominted for from the fact that the arerage office-holder is ignorant of many of the laws limiting and defining his duties, as regards commty reveme and the expenditure of combty funds.

It is a matter of large importance that some plan be employed to educate the oftiocers along these lines.

Frequently connty moness are dishmed for purposes which the statute sperifically prohibits. Dfter such expenditmes are made (and in many cases they are made with the best of intentions on the part of the comontr officers), it is difficult to recover such moness.

Even thongh such collections conld be made, it would work hardship on many homest oftioers, who have excerded their anthority solely thromgh ignorance.

It is resommended, therefore, that legislation be enacted providing for the compilation of a rolume segregating, under each and every connty and state officer and department, any and all laws pertinent to snch offices or departments, county or state, concerning revenue. expenditnre of funds, etc., and further providing that on the proper department of state government there be imposed the duty of advising, after each session of the legislatnre, every officer of any new laws enacted affecting his particular department of govelliment.

I draft of any new laws enacted shonld be pasted in the rolnme compiled, in order that at all times this volume may be up to date.

## MARKIN゙G STATE EQTHMMENT TO INHICATE OW゙NE1SN111

It is suggested, as a safegnard against loss, that all equipment, such as merhanical devices, equipment used in the improvement of highways, tooks, implements, wagons, automobiles, ete., be marked in some ineradicable manner, to show plainly that any surch article is the property of the State of colorado. This recommendation applies to all institntions, penal and charitable, and to all state boards, bmreans, and departments. Legislation should be enaded providing that persons empowered to purchase supplies of this nature for the different departments of state govermment shall have snch sulpplies so marked.

## COMAISSION CHARGED FUR COLLECTLON OF STATE TAX

Section 5531, page 1301, of the Revised Statutes of 1908 provides that the state shall not pay any expense incurred in the assessment or collection of taxes.

On page $\begin{gathered}-1 \\ \text { the following sedion alperats: }\end{gathered}$
 shath rharge and receive the following fees and commissions:

1. I'pon all moners reecived hy him for town and dity daxes, whether such towns or cities be incorporated under the general laws of he see eial chater, and anything in salid charter to the emtrary notwithstanding. and mpon all sehool taxes in combies of the first rlass, one per remt.; in eombies of the serond class, one per cent.; in comaties of every other class, one per cent. on school taxes, and two per erent. on town and eity taxes.
$\because . \quad$ Upon all moneys received by him for taxes of erery other kind in comblies of the first class, one pere cent.; second class, ne and one-half fere cent.; third class, two per cent.; fommth class, thee per rent.; fifth class, five per cent.
2. For receiving all moners other than taxes in counties of every class, one per cent.
3. For each eretificate of purchase in counties of erery class, wemb-
 cents.
4. For each certificate of redemption in counties of every rass. twenty-five cents; for each tract therein described in counties of every class, five cents.
5. For making treasurer's deed in counties of every class, one dollar; if such deed contains one description, and for erery subseenent deseription, five cents. [L. .97, 1. 159. §1: amending L. '91, p. 211, S6]."
Under the authority given in the second division of section $2 \pi=3$, which reads, "Upon all moners received of every kind," the county treasuress quite generally charge a commission on the collection of state taxes, and as section 5531 mandates that the state shall not pay the expense in collection of taxes. such charge is made against the rounty and collected from the comnty.

The reason for county treasurers so doing is to increase the fees of theiroffice, thereby increasing the treasurers' salaries.

If it is the intention of this law, as interpreted by the legislature. that the treasurers are entitled to no fee for collecting state taxes, legislation should be enacted to remedy the conflict in the above-quoted sections.

## COUNTY FUNDS-BEARING NO INTTEREST

Some legislation should be enacted to compel county treasurers to collect interest on the connty moneys in their hands. Page 4 ..... shows the general balance of public moneys in the hands of each county treasurer on the 1st of January, 1912.

The total in the hauds of all treasurers on this date amounted to $\$ 2, \pi 21,399.08$.

The arerage daily balance for the rear would largely exceed this amomet. due to the fact that countr finances in the months of Derember and January are at a lower ebb than at any other time of the rear.

Of the above amount there is $\$ 937,797.05$. the moners of fonteen counties. on which the countr treasuress draw interest from the banks and place same to the credit of the county.

The funds of the remaining fortr-eight counties, aggregating on January $1,1912, \$ 1.783,602.03$, according to statements of the county treasurers, draw no interest.
 as fourteren counties draw interest, and considering the fact that the state draws 3 per ent on its money, deposited in many cases with the same banks Which allow the counties no interest, it is rery erident that some legislation is needed to remedy this condition.

A little further light on this matter may be of interest, and in this connection 1 will take mp the mater of coment treasurers bonds. Page .... abowe referred to, indicates the amount of county treasurers' bonds by counties, the cost. if purchased from bombing companies at current rates, etc.
seremal county treasurers state that no interest is collected on county funds from banks, but the banks furnish the treasurer's bond.

Therest from bomding companies of bonds for all of the sixty-two county treasmers, at the current rates, would amomet to $\$ 10,5 \mathrm{~b} 5$, which, if advisable, could be paid from the county funds, if authorized by legislative enactment.

In this erent, if county treasurers were forced to collect interest on deposits-which can be easily complied with, as mumerous sound banks in the state would be bery glad to get the deposits on a fair rate of interest-there should still remain as a saving to the counties from $\$ 35,000$ to $\$ 50,000$ a year.
$I$ further argment in favor of such a plan is the advantage of having regular bouding companies carry these bonds in place of individuals or banks, from whom, in case of defalcations, it sometimes is inumssible to make collections.

COL゙NTY OFFICERS--FISCAL YEAH—HME INCOMING OFFICLALS SHOULD TAKE OFFICE
It is recommended that necessary legistation be enacted to effect the induction into oftice of all county officers on the first of January, instead of (un the second Tuesday in the month.

The fiscal year ends on the 31st of I hecmber, and for practically all the countr officers to rum ower for from ten to twelve days in the next rear's business canses a rery great deal of confusion in the matter of accounting.

The rear's business is closed up on the 31st of December; but. instead of leing turned wer to the incoming officer at that time, and when the books are in balance, etce, the outgoing officer holds office for several days, and then makes his turn-over.

Thder the present fee system this is particularly confusing, making it rery difficult to compute the exact salary allowances, etc.

## FUNLS OWHNG CO COLNTHES-WHEN SUCH DEBTS OUTLAW

I am advised through the Attorney General's department that criminal action after thres rears, and civil artion after six years, cannot be brought against county debtors. To mable the counties to recover funds, owing and uncolleded, which have run in excess of this limit of years, legislation should be enacted to the effert that dobes to the country shall never ontlaw. The state is protected in this respect, and it is important that the counties shonld be also.

The meressity for such a law is rery apparent from a consideration of defaleations, shortages, etco, of county offices, which in many cases are not discovered matil years after. in which rase it is impossible to bring the offenders to justice.

As regards this matter I wish to recommend that legislation be rataberd prohbiting connty or district judges from appointing committers or individuals to andit the romby oflices, and rombty rommissioners from paying county moness to private individual or firms for such anditing.

Moners spent by the several combties of the state during the year 1 gh 11 for anditing the comty offeres amomed to $\$ 2-4,36+17$. The cost of maintaining the I'ublic Examineres department for the fiscal years 1911 and 1912 amomed to $\$ 57,72=.8!$, or appoximately $\$ 29,000$ per rear. From this it will be seen that the romites spent within $\$ 4,(635) .83$ of the entire amonent necessary to maintain this department.

The state board is anthorized to do this work, and when done by both the state and individuals, there is a duplication of expense and labor cutirely nucalled for.

To show the fallacy in such contracts entered into with individual firms, I will bring to yonr aftention the fact that it often happens that, in order for an accombing firm to serme a county contract, it is necessary to gain the support in some cases of the officers whose accounts are to be checked. In such cases it is human nature to feel kindly toward the man who is helping and employing you, with the result that the report of such findings may be mejndiced.

Firther, as regards insestigations, I will state that the condition of combty finances often governs the commissioners in the latitude of the investigation ordered for their county. The report ordered one year may include all offices and cover every phase of accounting. together with a report as to whether or not all mandates of the statutes have been complied with, as regards the expenditure of comnty funds; whereas another rear, for reasons of economy, only part of such report would be contracted for.

Another objectionable feature of having different auditing firms report on county work is the lack of uniformity. One firm's report is made in a certain form, while the form of report of another firm may be rery different. This is a detriment in the way of compiling comparative statistics for one county as against another.

The reports, if made through the state government, under the statutes, must be absolutely fair and unbiased.

As there is no obligation on the part of the Public Examiner's department to any county officers, as is the case with private accomtants, such reports should be more impartial.

A statement indicating the amount paid by the different counties for this work will be found farther on in the report.

## ABOLITION OF FEE SYSTEM

The fee system, in so far as it applies to the compensation or salaries of county officers, is one of the most pernicious practices of the modern political srstem, and the abolishment of this evil, in so far as economic conditions will permit, should be the basis of action by the legislature at its next session.

I am informed that this matter was under discussion at the eighteenth session of the legislature, with the idea of placing every county officer on a specified salary, to be paid out of the county general fund, irrespective of the fee earnings of that office. This plan met with serious objection, more especially with respect to counties of small population, on the ground of economy. It was contended that the salary expense of the small counties would be con-
siderably incteased, imasmuth as, mader the present system, the ofticers have nerer been able from their fees to earn the maximm salaty allowed by law, and if reimbinsed with a straght salarr, based on the present maxinum ahowances, this increase would have to be borne by the taxpayers.
diranting the logic of this contention, it would appear that, if the counties were rectassified according to popmlation, together with a consideration of the comparative fee earnings of the different connty offees, one county against another, a salary hasis comld be determined whereby neither the earnings of the oflices nor the expense to the commes would be materially affected.

If it is the will of the legislature that this fee system be not abolished in toto. mquestionably the offices of countr sheriff, county treasurer, and connty rlerk in each and every county in this state shonld be placed on a straight salary basis.

In this connection I wish to refer you to Report No. ...., on page ...., which shows in detail the present elassification by comnties, the population of connties as indicated by the census of 1910 , the maximmm salary allowed clerks, treasurers, and sheriffs of the different connties, and the deficit in those conntios in which these oflieres faled to make from their fees the maximmm salary allowed by law.

Yon will notice, in considering Report No. ...., that in 189 offices, consisting of treasmrer, sheriff, and clerk, from the officers' reports from sixty-one connties, ouly forty-one of these officers failed to earm sufficient fees to satisfy the maximm salary allowed under the statutes, and the entire amome of deficit from the maximm allowance in these forty-one offices amounted to only $\$ 19,434.93$.

The amount of expense to which the connties are pat, throngh fee officers endeavoring to make their fees sufficient to pay the maximum salaries, is sereral times as great as this deficit. This is easily understood by considering, for instance. the office of sheriff, in which, for every fee earned for criminal service in addition to the fee, the county bears the expense attending such service. The expense to the county for feeding prisoners shonld be materially decreased if the fee system as a salary hasis was discontinned.

As a foundation for the legislation necessary to correct this evil, ron will find on page .... of this report a draft of a bill providing for the reclassification of the counties, abolishment of the fee system as regards county sheriffs. treasmres, and clerks, and indicating the deputies that shonld be provided, the salary of the officers conforming to the connty classification, ete.

In this connection I will state that I believe it wise, in reclassifying the counties according to population, to make this classification cover not only the salaries, but also the fees collected for service to the public. Under the present classification as to fees charged, certain counties of approximately the same popmlation have a different scate of prices for the same services, and at the same time the salaries of these officers, being under the same classification, are identical. This should be remedied to the effect that the classification as to salaries. and as to fees diarged for services. in any one county may be the same.

Sec．2．The sheriffe of the sereral comnties of this state，with the exerer－ tion of the slereff of the City and Comety of Denver，shall receive，as their only compensation for their services rendered，an ammal salary，to be paid ont of the general county fund；to－wit：in counties of the second class，the sum of $\$ 3,000$ ；in comnties of the third class，the sum of $\$ 2.800$ ；in comnties of the fon th class，the sum of $\$ 2,500$ ；in comnties of the fifth class，the sum of $\$ 1,700$ ；in counties of the sixth class，the sum of $\$ 1,500$ ；in counties of the seventh class，the sum of $\$ 1,200$ ．The sherifts，undersheriffs，and deputies shall be allowed actual traveling expenses，payable out of the county treasury， mpon verified itemized accounts being presented for the same，for service of all warrants，capiases，mittimuses，commitments，body attachments，conrt orders，requiring same，etc．；provided，howeerr，that the artual expenses in－ curred for the service of executions，writs of attachment，replevins，restitu－ tions，or other process not hereinbefore mentioned shall be paid by the paries receiving such services．

In romnties of the second class the sheriff may appoint an undersheriff， and may，under the direction of the board of county commissioners，appoint deputy sheriffs，who shall be paid an anmal salary from the General County Fund，the undersherifl the sum of $\$ 1,800$ ，and each deputy the sum of $\$ 1,200$ ； provided，however，that the mumber of deputies in any county of the second class shall not exceed six．

In counties of the third class the sheriff may，under the direction of the board of county commissioners，appoint deputy sheriffs，who shall each be paid an annual salary of $\$ 1,200$ ，in montly installments．from the general county fund；provided，howerer，that the number of deputies in any third－ class county shall not exceed four．

In counties of the fourth class the sheriff may．under the direction of the board of county commissioners，appoint deputy sheriffs，who shall each be
patid an ammal salay of $\$ 1,200$, in monthly installments, from the general combty fund: powided, howerer, that the mimber of deputies in any fonrthclass countr shall not exeed two.

In cominties of the fifth clase the sherift maty, mater the ditection of the board of combty commissioners, apoint one deputy sheriff, who shall be pad an ammal salaty of $\$ 1.200$. in monthly installments, from the general comty finind.

In connties of erery (lass the modersheriff, and ead and every deputy Wherifl in comnties of whaterer "lass coming moder the provisions of this act, shall make to the sherifi a monthly report in writing, minder oath, of all fees follected of any deseription whatsoever, and all expenditnres, necessary expenses pertathing to the discharge of the duties of his office. The sheriff, undersheriff, and deputy shall be allowed actual traveling expenses, payable fint of the county theasily, nom wrified itemized account being presented for the same.
sec. 3. The combty clerks of the seremal commes in this state shall receive. as their only compensation for their serviess, an ammal salary, to be paid monthly ont of the general combty fund: in counties of the second rass, the sum of $\$ 2 . T 50$; in comnties of the third class. the smm of $\$ 2.400$; in commes of the font class, the smm of $\$ 2,100$; in counties of the fifth class, the sum of $\$ 1.750$; in counties of the sixth class, the smm of $\$ 1,500$; in connties of the serenth class, the sum of \$1.50).

In comities of the second and thind classes the comnty clerk shall appoint, with the approval of the board of connty commissioners, a chief deputy, who shall be acting deputy clerk to the board of county commissioners; and the connty fletk may, with the approval of the board of connty commissioners, sippoint office depnties, each to be paid an amnal salary out of the general county fund: provided, the mumber of depmies so appointed slath not at any one time exceed five. The interpretation of this faw，as construed by the State Forester，gives him a wirle latitude for the dishursing of moneys from this fund，with which 1 cannot agree．The state Forester claims that in the last wo lines of section 3，page 40 ，Session Laws of 1911，he finds authority for spending the money for almost anything he should desire．

Voucher No. 1393, to State Forester, dated November 25, 1912, for L'nion Facific raidroad mileage books Nos, $43813,43814,43815,43816$, at $\$ 40$ each, $\$ 160$. These books were made out to W. W. Roblins and B. O. Longrear. Mr. Longyear is state Forester; Mr. Robbins is assistant professor of hotany, and was such during November, 1912. He also was paid \$100 salary for Norember and $\$ 100$ salary for October out of this fund, during which time he was not employed in this work. Mr. Longyear informed me he intended to use these mileage books next summer.

Fort Collins, Colorado, Norember 22, 191シ.
To the state Board of Agrienlture and Forester of Colorado.
Gentlemen: In answer to ronr request for a brief report of my work of organzation of the different comnties containing forest lands in our state. for the prevention and control of forest tires; also an estimate of the expense necessaly to carry on the work in the comnties not already risited, I wish to make the following statement:

Of the forty-two counties listed to me as containing forest lands, I have risited twenty-three romnties and combty seats, and have obtaned lists of deputies to be appointed as special fire wardens from all the sheriffs risited, except the sheriff of Eagle Countr, and have been promised a list from that county. (The list from El Paso County has been lost, and I shall doubtless get a new one from the sheriff of that county.)

The total number of deputies and sheriffs contained in the twente-one lists in my possession is $\mathbf{3 4 4}$. This number should be at least doubled when the work is completed.

I have copies of a resolution adopted by the boards of commissioners of Larimer, Garfield, Douglas, Jefferson, Pueblo, Pitkin, Huerfano, and roulder Counties, stating their interest and agreeing to rooperate in the work. So far I have succeeded in securing such resolntion by the boards of connty commissioners whenever I have been able to meet the full board in session, with the exception of El Paso Countr. Lake Comnty was divided -one member of the board for, one against, and one absent.

I found the people interested in erery section risited, and I anm conriuced that four plans can be successfully carried ont and will result in the saring of a rery ereat amonnt of timber foom destruction by fire. Now
that we have our agreement with the National Forest Reserve sigmed, we ex
 With al rope of the same and with instroctions from the state Forester in regard to prevention and control of forest tires. The work of secmring resolutions from the boads of combty commissiomers will require murh time as many of the boads meed only fone times a rear in regular ses. sion. It mas be possible that rome boad will comsider this part of the work tmmeressally in some cases, on areonnt of the time required to visit the different boards of commissioners at the times they ane in session, and that serems to be the only way fo serome the resolutions asked for.

The nimetren combias that hate not been visited by me on this work are situated in the sonthwestern part of the state. They are the most thinly settled combies of the state withont comvenicent transportation facilities.

The commissioners msually live long distane apsaty and, if possible rach one shond be informed in regard to the work hy personal intervew. The sheritts of these combties are murh of the time away fom the connty seat. From my experience, I think it will require ninety days to visit all the comity sats, to obtain a list of deputies from the different sheriffs. to secmor interviews with combty commissioners, and, whenever possible, to obtain resolntions of smport and co-operation.

I think this work can be completed, so far as completion is possible, at a cost of six landred dollars (\$000.00), and I hereby offer to contime my work, as yon have ontlined it, to full completion for the sum of six handred dollars $(\$ 600.00)$, and transportation in addition.

REMARKS
In dereking the aceombts of the members deposits, I conld not find Book No. 2. but this book was in the vault when I was at the Home last April. I am informed by Adjntant secknew that he did not see this book, and that it was not thmed over to him by former Adjntant Hunt. This book should be at the llome, and the board shonld take steps to recover same, wherever it may be.

If tind the members of the board continne to charge and allow bills to themselves for services as members. This is in direct conflict with section 6035 of the Revised statutes, page 1419, which reads: "No commissioner shall receive rompensation * * * " In the jears 1911 and 1912 they paid to themselves as compensation $\$ 1.058 .85$. This shonld be recovered to the state. (See detailed statement of items allowed each member.)

In my last examination I fonnd there was $\$ 394.15$ in the hands of Mr. Storrs. This money was in the accomet of Mr. Edward Todtenhopfer, who died at the Home June 25,1911 . In his application, No. 342 , dated Mareh 18 , 1896, he requested that in case of his deatli he be buried in the Home cemetery and that his effects be disposed of at the Home.

I am informed by Commander Foot that Mr. Storrs turned this money over to the German consul in Denver, but there is no arcount of this in the books at the Ifome. I think this money shomld be turned over to the Ilome, as designated by Mr. Todtenhoefer.

Many rouchers are issued and not entered in any book, not eren the roucher record; so it is very hard to make an acrumate cherk of the books, muless a great deal of time is taken, and then only by referring to the State Auditor"s and state Treasnrers books. This shomld not be, and something shonld be done at once to remedy the system at the Home.

The Contingent Cash Fund has over $\$ 3,1000$ cash on hand, while the Home is in debt, and this money should be nsed to pay some of the bills. Also, the contingent receipts should be thrmed into the state treasmor, as collected, and a revolving fund shonld be given the rommander to pay petty cash bills, and such bills should be vouchered through the State Auditor each month.

1 ear sir: We lave jnst combleterl an investigation of the Oil Inspector's otlice, and hive found that, on the amomet of oils inspected at the statutory ritte of one-tentli of one rent per aallon, the receipts of the oftice should aggemate, for the period from Derember 1, 1!)10, to November 30, 1911, \$11,24:3.39. So rash-book is kept, howerer, showing the actuil receipts.

Honse Bill No. 351 , on page 333 of the Session Laws of 1911, appropriates not to exceed \(\$(6,400\) for salaries, to be paid out of the fees, and also provides that a full and romplete statement, under oath, of all transactions of his offee shall montlly be made to the state Treasurer, and further that he shall pay into the state treasury all sums of money which he has received, as fees in excess of salary and expense there dne him, etc.

No reports or thrn-nver of fees to the state Treasurer have been made by the Oil Inspertor. From the above it would appear that the state is losing in the neighborthod of 5 , (0) 01 a rear, and I wish advice as to the legal phase of this question.

Is the Oil lnspertor within the law in retaining all fees as the personal and private rompensation of himself and deputies?

Dear Air: I beg to arkuowledge receipt of yours of December 15 . in which you state that you liave completed an investigation of the Oil Inspector's office, and call my attention to House Bill No. 351, on page \(\overline{3} 3 \mathrm{~m}\) of the Session Laws of 1911, creating a salary for the Oil Inspector, and inguire whether the Oil Inspeetor is within the law in retaining all fees under the old law of 1899. which reated his office, or whether he is smbject to the new laws of 1!911, so as to require him to turn over all of his fees to the State Treasurer and receive out of the same his salary of \(\$ 1,600\) per annum, as establislied by the new law.

I note tlat, while your letter sets out in detail the status of the office at the present time, your inquiry is directed solely to the proposition of whether the Oil Inspector is confined to the salary established by the new law, or whether he is entitled to receive fees collected, as provided by the old law. This letter is directed, therefore, only to the inquiry advanced by you.

Ber Chapter 121 of the Session Laws of 1599 , the office of Nate Inspector of Oils was created, and that act also provided for the inspection of petroleum oil, ete. By the first paragraph of sertion 2 of the act it is provided, as follows:
"The gormand. Dy ant with the adlice and ronsent of the senate. shall appoint a skilled and suitable person, who is not interested in manuficturing, dealing or vending in any illminating oil manufactured from
pelmoleman, as state insperolor of oils, "hose lerm of ohier shall be lwo yeras from the date of his appointment, and melil his sucerssom is appoinled and qualified. Such inspeetor, when so appointed and qumlificel. is lereby emporered to employ a smiluble number of alepuliess. which deputies ale herehy empowered to perform the daties of insperote and shall be liable to the same peralties as the state insperefor, provideal that



 and such state inspertor may remove ally deplly inspertors for ally reat somable c:anse alld appoint ofleres in thait piace."

The second paragraph of satid sertion provides, among other things, that the said inspertor and his deputies shall furmish at their own experse neressary mstruments, apraratus, stencils, brands and stamps for testing and marking oils. Seretion \(\mathrm{B}_{\mathrm{g}}\) provides that the sald inspertor and his deputies slabll exerente bonds, as provided therein; and the first paragraph of section + provides as follows:
"said inspertor or depmty insperfor slatl be entitled to demand and receive from the owner. or party calling on him, or for whom he shall perform the inspection. The snm of one-tenth of one rent per gallon for each gallon insperterl, whether in stomge tanks, tank rars, barrels on other packages."

It seems quite \(\left(\cdot l^{2} b^{\prime}\right.\) from the foregoing that moler the law of 1899 the State Inspector of oils was entitled to receive as a fee for inspecting oils the sim of one-tenth of one rent per gallon for eatro gallon inspected, and that his Geputy should receive such portion of the fees for inspertion as should be agreed upon between the inspector and the deputy; and that all the expenses of carrying on the department of oil inspection, including the furnishing of materials, should be borne by the inspector and his deputies.

No provision is made by this law for turning over any fees to the state Treasurer, and I conclude that it was the intent of the law that the inspector -honld retain any fers received, and out of the same pay the expenses of himself and his deputies, the rost of materials, and any and all expenses connected with maintaining his department. This, I understand, has alwars been the construction placed upon this law since its adoption, some twelve rears ago. This law was approved April 14,1899 , withont an energency clanse. and, therefore, becanue effective July \(1: 3,1899\).

By' ("hapter 180 of the Session Laws of 1911 it was provided as follows:
"section 1. Ont of the fees and emoluments of his office the state in spector of oils shall receive a salaty of sixteen hundred dollats (\$1.600.100) a year, and his traveling expenses, not exceeding six hundred dollats ( \(\$ 600.00\) ) per annum, and his deputies shall each receive a salary of fifteen hundred dollars \((\$ 1,500.00)\) a rear, and his trareling expenses, not exceeding six hundred dollars \((\$ 600.00)\) per anmum. They shall devote all of their time to the performance of their duties.

The state inspector of oils shall appoint not to exceed two deputies, who shall be determined by lim and the governor of the state.

The state inspector of oils slall monthly make and file with the state treasurer a full and complete statement, under oath, of all transactions of his office. and shall pay into the state treasury all sums of money which lie has received as fees in excess of the amount of salary and traveling expenses then due to him and his deputies, which money shall by the
state treasmer be platered to the rexdit of at find to be kitown as the state

"These terms [referring to 'fees' and rommissions'] denote a compensation for a particular kind of service to be performed by the officer, and are distinguishable from each other, and are so nserd and muderstood by Congress in the sereral rompensation acts; they are also distinguishable from the term emoluments, that being more comprehemsive and embrating erery species of comprehension or pecuniary profit derived from a disclange of the duties of the office; and such is the obvious import of it in these acts."
In Reals is. Smith, 56 Pac., 690, 692 (Wyo.), it was said:
"'Emoluments' is gencrally defined as the profit arising from oftice or employment; that which is received as compensation for services or which is annexed to the possession of office as salaries, fees and perquisites; advantage, gain, public or private."
In Town of Bruce is. Dickey, \(6 \mathrm{~N} . \mathrm{E}\). (Ill.), 435, 439, it was said:
"The word emoluments' is peculiarly appropriate to office; denoting in its most ordinary signification the profit 'which is annexed to the possession of office, as salary, fees and perquisites.'"
In Appel is. County of Crawford, 51 Am . Rep. (l'a.), 20.). こot, it was held that a sheriff who received a certain sum per week for boarding prisoners was therelge antitled to an emolmment which could neither be increased nor diminished after his olertion, and the court said:
"section 13 of Article III of the Constitntion provides that 'no law shall extend the term of any public officer, or increase or diminish his salary or emolmment, after his election or apointment. That the sherifit is a public officer, coming within the operation of this constitutional provision cannot be donbted. The boarding of the prisoners was certainly one of his official duties imposed upon him by law. For the performance of this duty he was entitled to receive a compensation which was definitely fixed by law at the time of his election. While this compensation could hardly be called a salary, it seems to us that it included within the larger and broader term 'emolment.' In Webster"

C'nabritged lictionary the word 'emolmment' is thas defined: 'The protit arising from oftice or emphoyment; that which is reectived as compensation for servers, or which is amexed to the possession of otlice, as salary, fees and perquisites; adrantage, gatm, pmblid on private. We think the word imports more than the word "salary" of "fers." and becaluse it is contaned in the Constitution in addition to the word 'salary we ought to give it the meaning which it bears in ordinaly are ceptation. By the defintion above given it imports any perpuisters ad vantages, potit or gall arising from the possession of an office."

It therefore follows that in order for Chapher 180) of the session Laws of \(1!11\), restricting the rmolmments of the State Inspector of Oils to \(\$ 1\), (ion a rear, to berome effertive for that promese it mast operate mpon one whose term of oftice begins after this law goes into effect, for-wit, Angist 4,1911 . In the piresent case, if the semate had contirmed the appointment of the present ()il lospedor, his term womld have begun on Jnly 13, 1!911, or before Clapter 18t) womld become operative. On the other hand, the semate mot hatring contirmed the appeintment of the present oil luspector, it wonld seent that he is still holding orer muder his original appointment of duly, 1909); and ('hapter 180) not boing in operation motil Angnst, 1911, it wond follow that it could not affect his emoluments during his present term; to-wit, the term begimning in 1909, and which has as yet not reme to a conclusion.

That a holdower acts as such by virtue of his original appointment or election, and not by virtne of any new or double term, appears clear from the case of Ntate is. Moores, \& N. IV. (Neb.). :3s!, and the cases dited therem. in which it was held that where a person lawfully rontinues in an oftice created by the constitntion of that state, by virtne of his original election and qualification, after the expriration of the fixed term, bit before his successor is elected and qualified, the salary of such hold-over officer camot be increased or diminished. On page 400 the conrt, quoting from an Oregon case. says:
"One thing, however, is palpably manifest: That the right to hold over is by virtue of the previons appointment or election and qualification. It is a right aceorded by statutes regulating the temme of office. The loodding does not come to ane end on the day of the expiation of the statntory period, miness there romes a duly elected and qualified officer to ent it off. or unless his rerognized sumessor is inducted into the office. la one semse the holding ower is protempore because the time of the holding is dependent mpon the election or appointment of a snecessor; and in another it may be considered as the occupancy of a surcessor"s term which is shortened by that length of time. But the holding for the technical term and the holding orer is a recognized right arising from one appointment or one election. The tenure of office is indirisible. It cannot be considered as a broken term or as a donble term. It is one contimoms holding."

I am of the opinion, therefore, that, under the present circumstances, Chapter 180 of the Session Laws of 1911 does not-owing to the constitutional provision above cited-restrict the State Oil Inspector to a salary of \(\$ 1,600\) a vear, but by virtue of such constitutional provision he is entitled to the fres of that office, as provided by the law of 1899.

Dear Sir: In response to your letter of recent date, in which you inquired whether cierks of District Courts are entitled to fees for taking land proofs, without accounting for the same to the county, I beg leave to say that, by a recent decision of the Court of Appeals of this state, this matter, as well as other like questions, is set at rest; that is to say, all questions relating to fees of county judges and clerks of the District Courts, and like officers, in taking final proofs with reference to land entries, whether those fees relate to state lands or to federal lands.

You will recollect that heretofore we advised you that clerks of courts and county judges were entitled to their fees and did not have to account for the same to their respective counties, in the matter of taking land proof with reference to federal lands; and I believe that several county officers have acted under our opinion.

At the time the opinion was rendered there was no decision of our appellate courts with reference to the matter, and we followed the decisions of other states, which we considered good law.

However, it now appears that the Court of Appeals has decided the question adversely to our views, and I deem it wise, therefore, to inform you concerning the same, and would suggest that you send copies of this letter to every county attorney, county
judge, and every clerk of the District Court in thls state, since I believe the course decided in the Court of Appeals case has not been heretofore generally followed, and in the future, therefore, each officer should adjust matters and arrange to follow out to the letter the decision of the Court of Appeats.

The decision I refer to is in the case of Glaister vs. Board of Commlssioners of Kit Carson County, 123 Pac., 955 . This opinlon is found in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter, June 24, 1912, and will not be in a permanent volume for some tlme.

In this case an action was brought by the Board of County Commissioners agalnst the judge of the County Court for certain fees collected by him, over and above his salary, in taking certain land proofs with reference to federal lands, the fees being provided for by United States Statutes. The court holds that fees collected by a county judge, under United States Statutes relating to the making of proofs, etc., under the federal land laws, should be accounted for by him as for services rendered in his official capacity, and that all fees over and above his salary should be turned in to the county treasurer.

Dear Sir: A letter of yours submits two questions, to which we reply as follows:
"1. Is it legal for county sheriffs to charge constructive mileage when serving warrants on one or more persons, and in one or more actions on the same trip?"

This question is answered by a statute passed in 1907, and found as paragraph 8 of section 2532 of the Revised Statutes of Colorado, 1908, to-wit:
"Mileage for each mile actually and necessarily traveled in serving each writ, subpœna or other process, in counties of the first class, seven and one-half cents; second class, seven and one-half cents; third class, ten cents; fourth class, ten cents; fifth class, ten cents; PROVIDED, That actual, and not constructive mileage shall be allowed in all cases; and where more than one warrant is served by any officer on one trip, the actual mileage only shall be allowed such officer, and the actual mileage shall be apportioned among the several warrants served on the trip."

We further call your attention to a statute enacted in 1891, and found as section 2533 of the Revised Statutes of Colorado, 1908, which covers mileage in case service is made of two or more papers on the same person, or on different persons at the same time and place in the same action.
" 2 . Are county sheriffs allowed to charge mileage for guards attending when transporting prisoners to penal institutions?"

The answer to this question is found in paragraph 23 of said section 2532 , Revised Statutes of Colorado, 1908, which allows the officer transporting a prisoner, besides the actual expenses necessarily incurred, a certain amount per mile, varying in the different counties, and then adds:
"PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That such mileage shall be only by one officer, and no mileage shall be charged upon the guards attending the officer in the custody of the prisoner, or prisoners;"
and further provides for a certain daily compensation for said guards attending said officer.

He receives out of the fees of the treasurer's office a maximum salary allowed as treasurer, and in addition is allowed a certain amount for deputy hire, which is paid out of the fees of the treasurer's office.

As clerk of the District Court he receives fees amounting to about \(\$ 400\) per year, which he retains as his personal compensation.

Is this officer within the law in holding these two county offices?
If he is within the law, kindly consider section 2570 , on page 730 , of the Revised Statutes of 1908 , and advise the maximum he can receive for services to the county.

Dear Sir: Replying to your two letters dated February 28, we have to advise you as follows:

We do not know of any constitutional or statutory provision that forbids a man, who is otherwise qualified, from holding the offices of both county treasurer and clerk of the District Court.

Section 8 of Article V of the Constitution does not forbid it; and section 1320 of the Revised Statutes of Colorado, disqualifying certain officers from holding the office of county treasurer, does not cover the office of clerk of the District Court.

It was a rule of common law that the holding of one office does not in and of itself disqualify the incumbent from holding another office at the same time, provided there is no inconsistency in the functions of the two offices. This inconsistency or incompatibility between the two offices necessary to disqualify a person from holding both was a conflict of interest between the two, such as where the incumbent of one office had the power to remove the incumbent of the other.

By virtue of this common-law rule, we see no inconsistency in the functions of these two offices, though it is required by the Constitution that the incumbent devote his personal attention to the duties of his office.

A person who legally holds two county offices is entitled to the statutory salaries of both of said officers. This was determined in:

United States vs. Saunders, 120 U. S., 126.
United States vs. Brindle, 110 U. S., 688.
In re Conrad, 15 Fed., 641.

Therelore he would be entitled to the salary allowed for the county treasurer, as speclfied by section 2570 of the Revised Statutes of Colorado, and also the salary allowed for the clerk of the District Court, as specified in section 2568.

If he has a deputy county treasurer, and the work of said office is sufficient to require a deputy, such deputy would be entitled to the statutory salary provided for such officers, and paid in the inanner prescribed by the statute. If he has no deputy, he should not be allowed any amount for deputy hire.

A person occupying loth of these said offices should be required to execute two bonds-one covering the office of county treasurer, as required by statute, and the other covering his acts as clerk of the District Court, as required by statute. l3oth these bonds should be required without fail, as each relates only to the acts and duties of the respective office covered, and no action could be brought on one bond by virtue of a default or failure to perform the statutory duty required of the other office.

Regarding the necessity of having sureties on the bonds of county officers justify in any certain amounts, we have to advise you that the statute secms to allow the commissioners to accept said suretics without specific justifications in any amount, provided they duly approve said bonds. However, section 4706 empowers the county commissioners, either before or after the approval of said bonds, to require any one or more of the sureties thereon to make out and subscribe a statement, verified by an affidavit, of all of his property owned in Colorado, and the amount of his indebterlness, etc.

It thus appears that the affidavit of the property holdings of the sureties is optional with the commissioners; though we suggest that you advise them that good business requires that they exact in every case such an affidavit from every surety before they approve the bond.

The protection of the interests of the public demands that these bonds be executed with exceeding care and with all those requirements fulfilled which are customary in the execution of private bonds, one of the most important of which is the justification of the sureties in amounts amply sufficient to insure the obligee against loss.

Dear Sir: I have your letter of February 28, inquiring whether there are any legal grounds on which the county treasurer can refuse to hold tax sales each year.

In response thereto, I beg leave to say that, in my opinion, if there are delinquent taxes in any county in any year, il becomes the duty of the county treasurer, as provided by sections 5706 to 5725 , and other sections of our laws (Revised Statutes, 1908), to hold a tax sale in accordance with the provisions of law.

Section 5714 provides that these sales shall be held on or before the sccond Monday in November of each year. Section 5715 provides that, if the real property cannot be advertised and offered for sale on or before the second Monday in November, it shall be the duty of the treasurer to make the sale on any subsequent date on which it can be made; and, further, that any treasurer who fails or refuses to advertise and begin a sale later than the second Monday in November, as provided for in the act, shall forfeit to the county 10 per cent of his fees arising out of such sale.

From the foregoing it appears quite clear that, if there are delinquent and unpaid taxes, as aforesaid, in any year, and if the treasurer fails or refuses to advertise and
begin the sille not later than the second Monday in November, as provided, in addition to the penalty provided for, mandamus would lie to compel him to conduct the sale, as provided by law.

Dear Sir: In reply to yours of May 24, in which you say that the commissioners of certain counties have had printed on the face of juror and witness certificates the words: "Personal taxes a counter-claim against this certificate," and asking whether they can enforce the same, I will say that, in my opinion, there is no authority in law for making such certificates a counter-claim as against personal taxes.

Section 1405 of the Revised Statutes of 1908 , in regard to witness fees, is as follows:
"That if any person entitled to witness fees in any suit in the district or county courts shall, within one year from the time his right to such fees accrued, make application to the clerk of the district court or the county judge, said clerk or judge shall give him a certificate setting forth the amounc due to said witness, which amount shall be paid by the county treasurer upon the presentation of said certificate."

Section 3703, in regard to jurors' fees, is as follows:
"The clerk shall, without fee, furnish to each juror who shall attend at any term of court, a certificate showing the number of days that such juror shall have attended at such term; and upon presentation thereof to the county commissioners, they shall issue to suci juror their warrant upon the county treasury for the amount of the per diem and milcage oî such juror."

In my judgment, personal taxes must be collected in the manner provided by law. Section 5673 of the Revised Statutes, 1908, provides as follows:
"All fees and taxes together with all penalties and costs thereon shall be payable in cash only."

And sections 5677 and 567 provide the procedure for the collection of personal taxes, and it is nowhere contemplated in the statutes that they may be collected in the manner which the county commissioners are seeking.

Dear Sir: I have your favor in which you inquire whether a county commissioner is within the law "when he charges \(\$ 5\) a day and expenses, \(\$ 5\) a day and mileage, or \(\$ 5\) a day for services for acting as a road overseer, bridge overscer, road viewer, or a road and bridge superintendent, or for services performed by himself, either in a manual or supervisory capacity, on roads or bridges."

Your question is rather involved, and, if you have any given case in mind, if you can furnish the facts in that case I might be able better to understand the situation.

However, replying to the questions propounded, I would say, gencrally, that there is no question but that a county commissioner is entitled to \(\$ 5\) per day for his services; also, statutory mileage in going to the place of meeting and goiug home again. Of course, I understand this mileage to be charged ouly in such a case. Usually county commissioners living in the country come to the county seat and stay there during the session of the board, then returning home again. They would be entitled to mileage at the beginning and at the conclusion of each session. I do not understand that they would be entitled to milcage for journeys or trips in other matters.

Now, with reference to \(\$ 5\) a day and expeuses: That is a matter which it is very difficult to answer without knowing just what the circumstances are. I have in mind a case where county commissioners, when they have been in session, are called into the country to look over work done for the county, or in order to view a road, etc., etc.; and I believe in such a case that their ordinary expenses, in the way of conveyances, etc., should be provided for.

With reference to services for acting as road overseer, etc.: This presents a very grave question, and oue upon which many lawyers in this state differ. I know of no law relating to the administration of county affairs that needs to be amended, in order to clear up many ambiguities, more than the law with reference to county commissioners; and I trust your department will bear this in mind at the coming legislature. Disputes over such matters as you inquire about arise owing to the uncertainty of the law, and the same should be made clear at an early date.

As already stated, I am unable to write more definitely at this time, without having the concrete facts before me.

Our letter of July 16, 1912, referred to the decision rendered by the Court of Appeals on May 13, 1912, in the case of Glaister vs. Board of County Commissioners of Kit Carson County. That decision held that fees accruing in connection with acts done by a judge
of the County Court under the provisions of section 2294 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, as amended in 1890 ( 26 Statutes at Large, 121), relating to the making of proofs under the land laws of the United States, should be paid into the county treasury and were not the personal emoluments of the officer, but part of the fees of the office.

Under date of May 16, 1911, we advised you that with regard to naturalization fees the contrary rule prevailed, relying upon the peculiar wording of the naturalization act, and upon the cases of Eldredge vs. Salt Lake County, 106 Pac., 939 (Utah, 1910), and Inhabitants of Hampden vs. Morris, 93 N. E., 579 (Mass.), as authority for our position.

Since the decision of those cases, however, the case of San Francisco vs. Mulcrevy, 15 Cal. App., 11, has been decided to the contrary, as also the case of Barron County vs. Beckwith, 142 Wis., 519, showing that the courts differ very materially upon the construction to be given to state statutes similar to our own, when considered in connection with the federal statute providing that -
" * * * clerks of courts exercising jurisdiction in naturalization proceedings shall be permitted to retain one-half of the fees collected in any fiscal year up to the sum of three thousand dollars."

In view of these more recent decisions, therefore, and the strong ruling of the Court of Appeals in the case of Glaister vs. Board of Commissioners, 123 Pac., 955, I believe that the courts of this state would require the clerk of the District Court to account for these fees, and that they ought not to be regarded as a personal emolument in addition to the salary provided by law.

Dear Sir: In response to your letter of recent date, in which you inquired whether clerks of District Courts are entitled to fees for taking land proofs without accounting for the same to the county, I beg leave to say that, by a recent decision of the Court of Appeals of this State, this matter, as well as other like questions, is set at rest; that is to say, all questions relating to fees of county judges and clerks of the District Courts, and like officers, in taking final proofs with reference to land entries, whether those fees relate to state lands or to federal lands.

You will recollect that heretofore we advised you that clerks of courts and county judges were entitled to their fees and did not have to account for the same to their respective counties, in the matter of taking land proof with reference to federal lands; and I believe that several county officers have acted under our opinion.

At the time the opinion was rendered there was no decision of our appellate courts with reference to the matter, and we followed the decisions of other states, which we considered good law.

However, it now appears that the Court of Appeals has decided the question adversely to our views, and I deem it wise, therefore, to inform you concerning the same, and would suggest that you send copies of this letter to every county attorney, county judge, and every clerk of the District Court in this state, since I believe the course decided in the Court of Appeals case has not been heretofore generally followed, and in the future, therefore, each officer should adjust matters and arrange to follow out to the letter the decision of the Court of Appeals.

The decision I refer to is in the case of Glaister vs. Board of Commissioners of Kit Carson County, 123 Pac., 955 . This opinion is found in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter, June 24, 1912, and will not be in a permanent volume for some time.

In this case an action was brought by the Board of County Commissioners against the judge of the County Court for certain fees collected by him, over and above his salary, in taking certain land proofs with reference to federal lands, the fees being provided for by United States Statutes. The court holds that fees collected by a county judge, under United States Statutes relating to the making of proofs, etc., under the federal land laws, should be accounted for by him as for services rendered in his official capacity, and that all fees over and above his salary should be turned in to the county treasurer.
