SUBJECT: 2003 School District Cost-of-Living Study

This memorandum provides background information on the school district cost-of-living study. Table 1, attached, presents the results of the study by school district.

#### Summary

Legislative Council Staff conducts a study of the cost of living in each school district every two years, as required by state law. The results of the 2003 study indicate that the cost of living increased in 177 school districts and declined in 1 district. The cost-of-living study is used to calculate cost-of-living factors, which are used in the formula for allocating money to school districts. The 2003 study continued the practice of on-site visits to retail outlets in school districts. It also included a methodological change pertaining to how income taxes are counted within total expenditures.

### The Cost-of-Living Study Is Required by Law

A cost-of-living study is required to be conducted every two years to update the cost-ofliving factors used in the state's school finance funding formula.<sup>1</sup> The first study was conducted in 1993; a study has been conducted in the interim of each odd-numbered year since. The 2003

study results are used to determine school district cost-of-living factors for FYs 2004-05 and 2005-06.

#### **Results of the Study Are Contained in Table 1**

Table 1, attached, shows the results of the 2003 study by school district and by school district labor pool area. The school district labor pool area figures are used in the calculation of district cost-of-living factors.

Results from the 2003 study indicate that the cost of living in Colorado school districts ranges from a low of \$33,301 to a high of \$56,081, after adjusting for labor pool areas. As compared to 2001, 177 school districts experienced an increase in the cost of living and one school district experienced a decline. The largest increase was 11.4 percent and the decline was 0.7 percent. The annual income used to measure the cost of living in each district increased 5.3 percent. When each district's change in cost of living is reduced by the percentage increase in the income level used in the study, 83 districts had an increase in the cost of living.

The method for calculating the cost-of-living factors, using the cost-of-living dollar amounts, is contained in state statute. Each district's factor stays the same as last year's factor unless its cost of living increased by more than 1.1 percent, the rate of inflation. In that case, the district's factor is last year's factor plus an amount equal to its percentage increase in cost of living divided by inflation and divided by 1,000. State law precludes a district's factor from decreasing.

#### The 2003 Study Contains Methodological Changes

The 2003 study includes changes in methodology designed to enhance the overall accuracy of the final cost-of-living amounts. The primary change involves income taxes. Income taxes for the 2003 study were calculated under the weights assigned taxes in the *Consumer Expenditures Survey*. In prior years, income taxes were not identified as an expenditure category within the benchmark household income. Taxes were added on top of each district's cost of living. As a result, the study was spending more money than the benchmark household income and "overweighting" taxes compared to other expenditure categories. By including income taxes as an expenditure category, the benchmark household income of \$40,000 for 2003 is considered before-tax income.

To provide an "apples-to-apples" comparison between the results of the 2003 study and the 2001 study, the 2001 cost-of-living amounts have been recalculated to include income taxes as an expenditure category. The 2001 amounts were recalculated so that the \$38,000 benchmark household income is a total or "before-tax" income rather than the previously calculated "after-tax" income.

#### School District Labor Pool Areas Were Also Updated

Along with pricing data, we updated information on school district labor pool areas. The labor pool areas are based on data provided by the districts to the Colorado Department of Education. For the 2003 study we calculated labor pool areas using the full-time employee count for each school district. Prior cost-of-living studies used the employee headcount for each district. Again, to provide an "apples-to-apples" comparison between the results of the 2003 study and the 2001 study, the 2001 labor pool areas were updated, based on the full-time employee counts.

Information on where employees live is current to the fall of 2002 for all districts for the 2003 labor pool areas and the fall of 2001 for the 2001 labor pool areas. The data is used to calculate the new labor pool cost-of-living amounts.

#### The Study Measures the Cost of the Same Items in Each District

The cost-of-living study measures the cost of a similar market basket of housing, goods and services, transportation, and taxes in each school district. The market basket was defined to include items available and affordable to a three-person household with an annual income of \$40,000.

For the 2003 study, the Legislative Council Staff contracted with two private vendors to provide data for computing the cost of a constant market basket in each school district. Goods and services, transportation, income taxes, and home mortgage information was collected by Pacey Economics Group. Pacey continued the practice of on-site visits to retail outlets in school districts to collect information. Housing value data was analyzed by ValueWest, Inc. The housing value data was forwarded by Legislative Council Staff to Pacey. Pacey then computed the total cost of the market basket in each district.

*Housing*. Housing costs include mortgage costs of principal and interest, property taxes, and homeowner's insurance (PITI), as well as the cost of utilities, maintenance, household supplies and operations, and household furnishings. PITI costs are based on the value of a 1,300 square-foot house in each school district.

ValueWest analyzed a database of nearly all single-family homes in the state to estimate the market value of a 1,300-square-foot home in each district. The approach used to estimate the value involved a number of steps. Whenever a statistically valid sample of home sales within a 1,200-to-1,400 square-foot range existed, the home value was determined by multiplying the median sales price per square foot of this group of homes by 1,300 square feet. When a school district did not have a statistically valid sample of homes within the prescribed square-footage range, the range was expanded until an adequate number of home sales was collected. In some school districts, it was necessary to use all home sales. The value in these districts was determined by multiplying the median sales price per square foot of the number of homes necessary to reach the sample size by 1,300 square feet. In the limited number of situations in which the database of homes sold within a district was not sufficient to estimate the values of a 1,300-square-foot house, assessor-determined values or sales from surrounding areas were used to supplement the sample of properties within an individual district.

*Goods and Services*. Items in the goods and services component include groceries, meals away from home, clothing, medical and dental care, recreation, and other day-to-day expenses. Data for the goods and services component come from a combination of school district visits and telephone surveys.

*Transportation*. The transportation category consists of the annual cost of owning and operating personal vehicles. These costs include maintenance and repairs, gasoline and oil, insurance, and vehicle financing.

*Taxation*. The taxation component includes federal and state income taxes and local occupation (head) taxes. Sales taxes are included under the goods and services component. Property taxes are included in the housing component.

*Miscellaneous*. A miscellaneous cost component is included for long-term saving, investments, charitable donations, and life insurance, among other things. Using data from the *Consumer Expenditures Survey* conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, a value of \$5,449 was assigned to all school districts.
