4	<u>Commemoration authorities</u> - For commemoration of historical events relating to the state or any county, city or other political subdivision, the act authorizes governing bodies of counties, cities or incorporated towns to create commemoration authorities by resolution or ordinance and to appoint not less than five nor more than fifteen commissioners as the governing body thereof; provides that upon the filing of copies of such resolution or ordinance and certificate of appointment of commissioners with the secretary of state, the authority shall be deemed to be a body corporate; defines powers of authority; gives authority power to accept grants and to make contracts with state or other political subdivisions; to borrow money and to issue bonds therefor; provides that authority shall not have power to levy taxes and that neither state nor any political subdivision shall be liable for any of the obligations of the authority; authorizes state or any political subdivision to appropriate money for and to grant, donate, contribute or lend money to such authority; provides for termination of existence of authority; provides power to create such authority shall expire January 1, 1960. 5	<u>Department of employment - building authority - anticipation warrants</u> - Amends present law creating building authority by increasing amount of anticipation warrants authorized from \$1,000,000 to \$1,800,000; and by removing the limit of twenty years within which department shall acquire title to land and buildings. 20	<u>1955 Supplement to the Colorado Revised Statutes 1953</u> - Provides that the general statutes of Colorado as enacted at the second regular session in 1954, the second extra session in 1954, and the first regular session in 1955, all as compiled in the "Official Report of the Committee on Statute Revision", shall be the positive statutory law of a general and permanent nature of the state of Colorado, and shall have the same legal force and effect and be part of the Colorado Revised Statutes 1953. The compilation of such law shall be designated as the "1955 Supplement to the Colorado Revised Statutes 1953", and the act further provides for the preparation and printing of said supplement. - 26 Vocational education - Amends present law by adding new provisions concerning acceptance by state of Colorado of terms and conditions of federal acts providing grants-in-aid for vocational education, and outlining duties of state board for vocational education and state treasurer in connection therewith. These were omitted from CRS 1953, but reinstated at request of state board for vocational education.

- 27 Metal mining fund - Amends present law to provide that property tax assessment on metalliferous mining property shall be forwarded by county treasurer to state treasurer instead of to department of revenue. This is a corrective act with reference to CRS 1953.

- 28 County and precinct officers - Amends present law with reference to county commissioners and other county officers and to precinct officers. Section 49-1-6, CRS 1953, is amended in exact conformity with the constitutional provisions (Secs. 6, 8 and 11 of Art. XIV) as to the election of such officers and their terms of office.

- 30 Supplements to the Colorado Revised Statutes 1953 - Amends present law to provide for biennial supplements to the Colorado Revised Statutes 1953, and for printing bids thereon; also provides that at the end of each general or special session the revisor of statutes shall prepare a pre-supplement tabulation showing the sections and articles of the CRS 1953 changed by repeal or amendment by the enactments of each such session.

- 31 Drugs and druggists - Amends present law to correct omission in the original 1955 act as signed by the governor, by the insertion of the word "authorized" in four places. This is a corrective act.

58 Annexation of territory to school districts - Provides for the annexation of unorganized territory to a school district or the detachment of territory from one district and annexation to another, upon petition of a majority of legal voters resident within the territory to be annexed, subject to certain limitations. Upon approval or disapproval of petition by county superintendent or failure to act thereon, majority of petitioners or property owners within the district may apply to the state commissioner of education to investigate merits of case and report his findings to the state board, and if approved by a majority thereof, such annexation shall be effected.

60 Regional planning - Amends present law to provide for surveys and studies to be made by members of staffs or county or municipal administrative departments for regional planning commissions, if properly authorized. Authorizes regional planning commissions to accept grants, gifts and bequests, including state and federal funds, and match such funds within limitation of budget, and make contracts with respect thereto. Provides that any such commission shall be liable on its undertakings as a body corporate, but the individual members thereof and the cooperating governing bodies or officials shall not be liable as individuals.

62 Appropriation - division of national guard - \$20,000 to pay off indebtedness of headquarters building of division.

65 Division of rehabilitation for the blind - creation - Creates a new division of rehabilitation for the blind, to provide industrial education, vocational training rehabilitation and employment of blind persons. Specific duties and powers of the division are outlined, including the operation of shops and industries; operation by blind persons of vending stands, cooperation with the U. S. and other agencies, private and public; and the acceptance of gifts and bequests of money or property, including federal grants-in-aid. A director, appointed by the governor for a four year term at a salary not to exceed \$7,500, is to be the chief administrative officer, and his duties are outlined. Moneys realized from the industries are to be continually available for future expenses of the industries, and moneys realized from vending stands are to be continually available for additional stands. The present state board of industries for the blind and the office of the present director are abolished. The new division succeeds to all property and records of the board, and to all funds remaining to the credit of the board as of July 1, 1956, except building program funds.

66 Salaries of public utilities commission - Amends present law to increase the salaries of members of the commission from \$7,500 to \$9,000.

67 Credit unions - Amends present law to provide an increase in annual examination fees of from \$35 to \$45 per man day, or from \$1.00 to \$2.00 for each \$1,000 of assets, whichever is the lesser; also increases the minimum fee for any examination from \$15 to \$20.

70 Registration and specific ownership tax on motor vehicles - Amends present law to change the annual registration expiration date on motor vehicles from Dec. 31 to March 31, and that any renewal of such registration shall take effect on April 1 instead of Jan. 1. Provides that registration applications shall be accepted commencing not later than the 2nd Monday in February, and no extension or grace period shall be granted after March 31. Provides that for first year act is in effect, the registration and ownership fee shall be levied on a 15 months basis to cover the change in expiration dates.

- 78 Misdemeanor fines for motor vehicle violations - Amends present law to provide that if a person charged with a misdemeanor in the operation of a motor vehicle, pays his fine at the time of arrest in lieu of a court appearance, he shall be given a receipt if such fine is paid in currency or other legal tender, but a check tendered to and accepted by the department of revenue shall be deemed sufficient receipt.

- 81 Colorado soldiers' and sailors' home - Amends present law to provide that time of active service in the armed forces shall be credited on the 7 year requirement of residence in Colorado for admission to the home. Other admission qualifications are liberalized, viz: as to widows of surviving veterans of the U. S. armed forces whether members of home or not at death; age limitation as to widowed mothers of veterans whether living or dead; amount of money conveyed or transferred by any veteran before admission to home; veterans to be given preference if transfer of any patients from charitable institutions to the home is made; and the amount of payment from outside income received by veterans and required to be made for cost of maintenance is lowered. Also provides that if any veteran shall die without legal heirs and without a will, all his property shall revert to the state; present law provides if member dies without legal heirs, no will disposing of his property shall be valid, but all such property shall revert to state.

- 82 Appropriation - Colorado water conservation board - \$100,000 for investigations, surveys and studies of water resources and their use, with particular reference to the Colorado river basin; \$75,000 of said appropriation to be used for cooperative studies with U. S.; and \$25,000 thereof for study of the closed basin project in the San Luis Valley; appropriation available until December 31, 1958.

- 85 Supplemental appropriation - department of game and fish - \$200,000 from game cash fund for operating expenses and capital outlay, for current fiscal year.

- 87 Banks - examinations - Amends present law to increase fees for bank examinations. Bracket of fees for banks having resources of \$100,000 and less, to \$1,000,000, are all increased, as well as fees for banks having resources of \$1,000,000 and over, which pay a flat fee and an additional 6¢ tax for each \$1,000 in excess of \$1,000,000.

- 89 Schools - transportation of children - Provides that the state shall furnish aid to school districts qualifying under the act in the transportation of children and in allowances for board in lieu of transportation. Any district or county to qualify: (1) must have made the minimum school district and county levy under the Public School Finance act; (2) shall have spent for transportation to and from a school maintained by such district, a sum in excess of the amount produced by a $\frac{1}{2}$ mill tax levy in the district. A fund, to which is credited state appropriations for transportation of pupils, is created in the state treasurer's office. The method of payment is outlined and each board of education of a district entitled to and desiring assistance must make certain certifications to the county superintendent, who in turn makes a consolidated report to the state commissioner of education. The state commissioner certifies to the state treasurer the amount of money each district is entitled to, who in turn pays the moneys to the county treasurer. In case of a deficiency in the state fund to pay all costs, moneys are prorated. In 3rd class districts, payments for such transportation must be authorized by a majority vote of all qualified electors. All districts must comply with rules and regulations made by the state board of education. The county treasurer can charge no fee for receiving and crediting funds to the account of the various districts.

- 91 County courts - probation officers and assistants - Amends present law to provide in any county between 70,000 and 100,000 the judge of the county court may appoint not to exceed 3 probation officers to administer laws concerning protection and correction of children, and 2 others to be designated as assistant probation officers, all with approval of a majority of the county commissioners and at a salary fixed by the court and approved by a majority of the county commissioners. In any county between 25,000 and 70,000, the judge may appoint 2 probation officers at such compensation as fixed by the court with the approval of a majority of county commissioners. All such officers are allowed mileage at not to exceed 8¢ per mile.

- 96 Intoxicating liquors - licenses for sale by drink - Amends present law to provide that no license shall be issued to or held by any person who will operate any place where liquor is sold by the drink within 500 feet of any "public or parochial school or the principal campus of any college, university or seminary."
