E X E C U T I V E O R D E R

GOVERNOR'S ADVISORY COUNCIL ON THE PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED

- WHEREAS, effective and efficient delivery of appropriate services to meet the needs of physically handicapped citizens of the State of Colorado is a matter of deep concern to all of our citizens; and
- WHEREAS, the needs of the physically handicapped are diverse and require the active involvement of the public and private sectors in many areas; and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary that programs involving the physically handicapped be coordinated at the state level and the Governor advised on a frequent and continuing basis concerning the special needs of the physically handicapped; and
- WHEREAS, it is important to have a cohesive group of advisors who are involved with the needs of the physically handicapped who have a high degree of self-initiative and, in many cases, who are themselves physically handicapped.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the Laws of the State of Colorado, do hereby order and direct that effective immediately:

1. There is hereby created a Governor's Advisory Council on the Physically Handicapped. This Council, attached to the Office of the Governor shall consist of sixteen members to be appointed by the Governor, as follows:
 - a. A representative from the Department of Social Services.
 - b. A representative from the Department of Labor and Employment *or Personnel*
 - c. A representative from the Department of Institutions
 - d. A representative from the Department of Health
 - e. An appointee of the State Board of Education
 - f. An appointee of the Commission on Higher Education
 - g. Ten members to be selected by the Governor from non-governmental organizations or groups concerned with programs for the physically handicapped, and private citizens (1/3 who must be consumers) who have demonstrated an interest in such concerns. In appointing such members, the Governor shall take into consideration geographical and age group representation.
